During the whole time the enemy fire continued but he never hesitated and cheerfully and efficiently made the repairs. It was undoubtedly due to his untiring energy and devotion to duty that ammunition was sustained throughout a very trying and critical period.

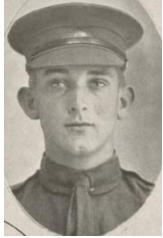

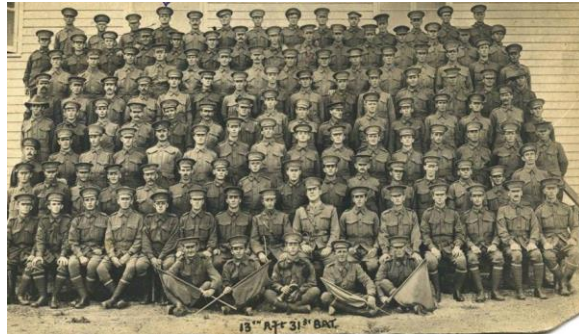

MM - "During the attack of the 31st Battalion from WARFUSEE-ABANCOURT, east of VILLERS-BRETONNEUX on 8th August 1918, this man did splendid work as a stretcher bearer. He showed an utter disregard for his personal safety and carried a great number of wounded. On 9th August 1918 he volunteered for stretcher bearing with units of the 2nd Australian Division and continued his splendid work. Throughout the operations he set a wonderful example of self-sacrifice and devotion to duty to his comrades."

Bar to MM - "During the operations at VAUVILLERS, east of VILLERS-BRETONNEUX on 9th Aug 1918, this man was acting as Stretcher-Bearer with 31st Battalion. During the advance, the 29th Battalion on the right, came under a heavy artillery and Machine Gun Barrage, and suffered very heavy casualties. The position was open without cover of any kind, and the wounded were in dander of being hit by fire. The bearers on the spot had more work than they could cope with and Private AYRE realizing the danger of the already wounded men and in spite of heavy enemy Machine Gun and artillery fire went to their assistance. He organized carrying parties time after time and with great courage assisted them until the field had been cleared of wounded. After returning from his tenth trip it became known that Lieut FARMER was lying seriously wounded some distance in front. Two men had already been wounded in trying to bring him in, but in spite of this Private AYRE went through the barrage and succeeded in getting the wounded officer back to the Aid Post. This soldier undoubtedly saved the lives of many of our men and his untiring devotion to duty is worthy of recognition."

Second Bar to MM - "For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty near VILLERS-CARBONNEL on 29th August 1918. Private AYRE went forward into the open under intense machine gun and artillery fire to assist a wounded comrade. Several others had previously made the attempt but failed. He reached the wounded man, dressed his wounds and brought him back to a place of safety. Enemy fire was very heavy the whole time and the artillery were firing over open sights. The following day he again went out to assist wounded comrades and made two trips across the SOMME bringing back wounded in the face of concentrated artillery and machine gun fire. He exhibited great courage and coolness throughout the whole of the operations, and showed an utter disregard for his personal safety."

Sunday Mail (Brisbane) Sunday 29 December 1929 When a car crashed into an awning post while rounding a curve on the Lytton road early on Saturday morning two persons were injured. **Alfred Henry Ayre** (33), of Bardsley Avenue, Greenslopes, and Miss Jean Beale, of George-street, city, were the injured persons. Miss Beale sustained cuts over the eyebrow and on the lip, and was rendered unconscious. Ayre received a large wound on the forehead and bruises on the head. Dr. J. J. Delaney, who lives nearby, attended the sufferers, and they were removed to the Mater Misericordiae Hospital. Their injuries are not considered to be serious. The car was driven by Vincent Thomas Johnson, of Gregory Terrace, Brisbane. At the time of the accident he was going toward Woolloongabba, along Lytton Road, and when rounding the curve the car did not respond to the steering wheel, and crashed into the awning of a shop occupied by Nellie Joshepine Collins. The car was considerably damaged.

The Brisbane Courier Monday 30 December 1929 CAR WRECKED AT EAST BRISBANE. A sensational smash occurred on the Lytton Road early Saturday morning, when a motor car got out of control, and smashed into a shop front near Mowbray Park. The motor car was wrecked almost beyond repair, and three of the posts supporting the awning of the shop were knocked from their positions, leaving the roofing hanging over the footpath. **Alfred Henry Ayre**, of Bardsley Avenue, Greenslopes, and Miss Jean Beale, The Mansions, Brisbane, who were travelling in the motor car, sustained concussion. Miss Beale also suffered from a cut on the eye, and the lower lip, caused by flying glass from the windscreen. The injured persons were attended by a doctor residing in the vicinity, and later were conveyed to the Mater Misericordiae Public Hospital. It is stated that the cause of the accident was that the gears went amiss as the car was turning the corner, causing the driver to lose control temporarily.

The Courier-Mail Saturday 12 May 1945 POLICE GIFTS TO 2 TRAMWAYMEN Two tramwaymen who helped a constable who was being attacked were presented with engraved table lamps by Woolloongabba police yesterday. They were motorman Charles James Arthur Martin and conductor **Alfred Henry Ayre**, who assisted Constable V. Heffernan when he was being knocked about by three men and a woman at the Fiveways, Woolloongabba on March 12. Mr. Ayre won the Military Medal with two bars in the first World War. He also has been three times thanked by Police Commissioners for aiding police in difficulties. At yesterday's function at the Woolloongabba police station were three holders of the King's Medal (the Police V.C.): Senior Sergeant P. Fahy, Sergeant W. Duckworth, and Plainclothes Constable F. White. Inspector F. M. O'Driscoll, who made the presentations, said that Constable Heffernan had been struck over the head with a piece of timber and was struggling to arrest three men and a woman of 14 stone who intervened. Martin was struck across the mouth with the timber and had to receive medical attention. Police, said Inspector O'Driscoll, appreciated the action of Messrs. Martin and Ayre. It showed that they had moral courage and an appreciation of civic responsibility. Mr. H. P. Talty (secretary of the Queensland Police Union) suggested that the authorities should consider making available to Messrs. Martin and Ayre the bail (£83) which had been forfeited by those arrested for the incident.
