





What happened immediately BEFORE Capture.

'We were occupying trenches some three kilometres from our village of Fleurbaix. We had come up into the trenches from our billets in the village and were to advance against the German lines immediately in front of us that evening. We actually "hopped over" at about 20 minutes to 6 o'clock. For some considerable time before we advanced, we had been subjected to a tremendous artillery bombardment by the enemy and we had quite a number of casualties before we "hopped over". Some of our own shrapnel was falling short and we suffered casualties from that cause also. The distance between our trenches and those of the enemy would be about 300 yards and we lost a number of men crossing this No Man's Land. Officers seen during Engagement.

<u>Capt Sharpe:</u> he was the OC of my Company but was wounded before we left the trenches. <u>Lieut Bernard:</u> I saw him out where I was knocked. He was badly wounded and eventually became a prisoner of war. He has been for some time past, interned in Switzerland. <u>Lieut Still:</u> I saw him just over the enemy first line of trench.

<u>It Col Toll:</u> He was CO of my Battalion. I saw him that evening away out in the open between the enemy first and second lines. Blood was then streaming from a wound in his face. He was the last Officer to give me an order before I was knocked myself.

<u>Maj Eckersley:</u> he was Second in Command of our Battalion. I saw him out in the open with Colonel Toll. I had passed to the second line of enemy trench when my left leg was badly smashed by a machine gun burst. It was in the evening that I nwas wounded. I managed to crawl into a half-formed trench or drain but got stuck in the mud. I remained in that uncomfortable position till next morning when the Germans delivered their counter attack and some passing "Fritzes" yanked me out of the mudand then went on and left me. I endeavoured to crawl back to our lines but did not manage it. I was picked up by the Germans about 7 o'clock that evening (20<sup>th</sup> July).

What happened immediately AFTER capture.

The Germans were decent enough in our treatment of me, though they neglected to have my wound attended to in any way for four days.

I was taken to Douai where I only remained for three hours and then to Lille where I stopped one night. Then I was taken to Valenciennes about 11.00pm and was operated upon at 1 o'clock the next morning. At this hospital there were German nursing sisters and German doctors. The orderlies were also German. One of these said to me "so you're an Australian? Then I've no time for you." Then he gave the bed on which I was lying, a spiteful shake. There were quite a number of Australian prisoners at Valenciennes.

Transferred from France to Gefangenenlager, Nurmenburg on 25th Jul 1916

On 1st Aug 1916, in Nurmenburg, Germany, at Lazaret, Kriegs-Vefangenenlager, Nuremburg, Bayern-Deutschland- 1st Kompanie

Letter to Red Cross: 'Dear Sirs, There are a few of us prisoners here and are practically without clothes, our clothes spoilt first by our wound and then by getting lost while in hospitals. If anything can be done for us by parcels etc it would be very welcome. Trusting you may be able to do something for us. Yours etc Sgt R Batteram'

#### A Long spell at Nuremburg.

I was transferred from Valenciennes to Nuremburg and remained there till June 18, 1917. I reached Nuremburg on July 25, 1916 and from then until March 3, 1917, I was in the lazarette. I could not walk. They afterwards transferred me from the lazarette to the lager. Only four Australians went with me from Valenciennes to Nuremburg. Of those I can recall the following:-Private MESSENGER –  $32^{nd}$  Battalion Private BARTLETT –  $32^{nd}$  Battalion Sgt GIBBONS –  $54^{th}$  Battalion

One of our chaps L/Corporal POWIS of the 30<sup>th</sup> Battalion – died there.

Transferred to Lechfeld.

From June 18, 1917 till October 1, 1917, I was at Lechfeld in South Bavaria. The treatment we were here handed out was damnable. For the first 10 or 11 weeks we were there, the Germans robbed us of our parcels. They were endeavouring to make NCOs volunteer for work. The only one who did so was QMS Sid EDWARDS of the 51<sup>st</sup> Battalion and he only did so because being put "on commando" offered him opportunities of effecting an escape, and escape he eventually did. When they did renew the distribution of Red Cross parcels to us, the parcels were mutilated and smashed.

#### Internment in Switzerland

I was transferred from Lechfeld to Constance. As far back as October 1916, I had been passed by the Commissioner for internment in Switzerland, but I was unable to travel. I eventually entered Switzerland on November 28, 1917, and was sent to the Chateau de Oex Region. I remained in that region until June 11, 1918, when I left Switzerland for England.

While in the Chateau de Oex Region I lodged at different times at the Hotel Berthod and Hotel Verger. At the later I received fine treatment but at the other, at times the food was very rough. Taking them all through, the Swiss people treated us very decently, at any rate, I was.

We entered France at the frontier post of Pont Arlier and crossed the country in a hospital train to Le Havre. The steamer "Panama" carried us to Southampton and we arrived in London on June 14, 1918. There were 30 Australians in the party – 3 Officers and 27 ORs. The latter were quartered in King George Hospital, Waterloo.

On 28<sup>th</sup> Nov 1917 transferred to Switzerland, Chateau Oex, Switzerland, Mr H.H.Cohen met at Railway Station Then 14<sup>th</sup> Jun 1918 arrived from Switzerland to King George Hospital, London, England (GSW L leg – fractured tibia, sev)

Transferred to 1<sup>st</sup> Aust Aux Hospital, Harefield on 2<sup>nd</sup> Jul 1918 Granted furlough on 4<sup>th</sup> Jul and to report to 1<sup>st</sup> AAH, Harefield on 9<sup>th</sup> Jul 1918 Granted furlough on 12<sup>th</sup> Jul and to report to No 2 Comm Depot, Weymouth, on 4<sup>th</sup> Aug 1918 Marched in from AIF HQ London, ex furlough, to No 2 CD, Weymouth (Class C2) on 5<sup>th</sup> Aug 1918 RTA per D22, HT 'Arawa' (due GSW L leg) on 15th Sep 1918 Disembarked at Melbourne on 17th Nov 1918 and returned to Queensland by overland. Discharged at Melbourne on 20th Feb 1919 Upon his return to his wife Elsie, he would have held his son Robert Geoffrey who had been born on 6th July 1916, at Ringwood, Vic, some two weeks before Bob's capture at Fromelles. Another son, Frank Hope was born in Melbourne, Vic on 13th Jan 1920. The family moved to Queensland and were in the Kelvin Grove, Brisbane, area. Elsie Batterham died in 1933, aged 41 years Issac Robert Batterham married Alice May Hollerhead in 1938. Both sons enlisted and served in WWII; Robert Geoffrey Batterham QX7405, with 1 Coy AASC, deployed to Malaya and captured by the Japanese at the Fall of Singapore. 



> At the Army Headquarters level, a decision had been made that the Australians would be returning to the Somme, this time including the 5<sup>th</sup> Division. The 8<sup>th</sup> Brigade would be pulling out of the Houplines Sector the following day to be replaced by the New Zealand Division. To keep the illusion that the Armentieres front line was still fully committed, the 5<sup>th</sup> Division Commander ordered a total of 12 raids to be carried out on the evening of 12th Oct, along its entire front. The artillery pummelled the German trenches from dawn. When the guns fell silent the mortars continued. The action was repeated in the afternoon as 5 officers 100 men of a raiding party from the 31st battalion moved into the front line trenches. Frank Smith had increased the size and scope of the raiding party and intended to remain in the German trenches for 40 minutes instead of the usual 10 minutes. At 7:30 pm the 31st Battalion raiding party climbed over the parapet in the darkness and moved forward to attack the Chicken Run again. With careful planning and good leadership, the raiders were able to cross No Man's Land quickly under cover of the brigade's mortars. After thirteen minutes they dropped down into the Chicken Run, and stayed in the German line for forty minutes, entirely clearing the sector. Dugouts were bombed, first with smoke-bombs and then with mortars. A large number of Germans were killed and 4 prisoners of the 9th Bavarian Infantry Regiment were brought back as well as 2 machine guns, rifles and a quantity of German equipment. The raiding party of the 31<sup>st</sup> Bn was under the auspices of Capt R.C. Aland, with 2/Lt F.R. Smith leading and assisted by 2/Lieut J G Brodie, 2/Lieut R. Thomson and 2/Lieut P. C. Eckersley and 100 other ranks of 'A' Coy.)



William Bennett was born at Coimadai, VIC in 1895 to Joseph Bennett and Mary Ann Gulliver.

William Bennett was a baker when he enlisted in the AIF at Melbourne on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of July 1915 at the age of 21. Allotted to the 1<sup>st</sup> Divisional Bakery, 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion, he embarked at Melbourne for service overseas aboard the *HMAT A62 Wandilla* in November. After a brief stop in Eygpt where he transferred to the 1<sup>st</sup> Field Bakery, 13<sup>th</sup> Australian Army Service Corps, he arrived in France in March 1917.

During his service he was hospitalised a number of times with mumps, a skin infection and finally in February 1919 contracted Influenza and was transferred to England. He embarked for Australia aboard the *Shropshire* in April, returning to Australia in June 1919.

William was discharged from the AIF on the 8<sup>th</sup> of July 1919 and in 1920 married Eva Mary Robertson. They later lived at Brighton Beach and Sunshine, VIC. William Bennett died in 1978 aged 88.

He is listed on the Roll of Honour for Bacchus Marsh, held by the RSL at Bacchus Marsh.

"I saw him last about 7 pm on the 19<sup>th</sup> ultimo. He was with me beyond the German trenches in the No Man's Land at that time and was slightly wounded but able to move about. After that he became mixed up with a number of men who were moving back towards the German trenches, and I did not see him again." Major Percy Eckersley

"We were just digging ourselves in before retiring at Fleurbaix on the 19<sup>th</sup> July, when I saw him fall, shot through the leg. Some one went over to help him but Mr Bernard told them to leave him, and it was no use trying to get him back. This was at the most advance position that we got to, and well beyond the line of German trenches, and we were driven back to the German trench about half an hour afterwards and we passed him as we were coming back..." Pte FW Matchett, 2149

"In an attack on 20<sup>th</sup> July 1916, Lieut V.D. Bernard was wounded, he had his leg broken, and fell into a gully and while there was taken prisoner, Major Eckersley was wounded at the same time, but, as it was a face wound, he escaped." Pte Edward Michael Wall, 336, 'A' Coy, 31<sup>st</sup> Bn

"...he was in A Coy and I saw him in a ditch of water between 8 and 9 pm on the 19<sup>th</sup> July. This was the further most position that we got to and was supposed to be a trench. He was standing up in the water and said that he was wounded in the leg and told a man named Crawford and myself, who were both wounded and trying to get back, that he could not crawl back with us......"Pte A McFarlane, 2060, 'B' Coy

He was Adjutant and seen as we were digging in before retiring on 19th July, when he fell shot, through tried to get him back. This was at the most advanced position that we got to, and well beyond the line of German trenches and we were driven back to the German trench about half an hour afterwards and we passed him as we were coming back. The Germans advanced next morning right over the place he was left, and if alive, he must be a prisoner. Seen in a ditch of water between 8 and 9pm on 19th July. This was the further most position that we got to and was supposed to be a trench. He was standing up in the water and said that he was wounded in the leg and told Crawford and McFarlane, both wounded, that he could not crawl back with them. We left Mr Bernard with a young fellow, who I think was his batman (probably Kerle), and said he would not leave Mr Bernard.

...moved on until we came to a water hole where we saw Lieut Bernard, 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion, badly wounded, Pte Kerle (31<sup>st</sup>) and Pte Grant and three or four others. Pte Grant was suffering badly from shock and two of the others were pretty badly wounded. Kerle and another were not wounded and were trying to get Lieut Bernard back to our lines. I had a rest and was going to try and get back to our lines when Kerle asked me to wait and give them a hand with Lieut Bernard. They dragged Lieut Bernard on their hands and knees while I kept a lookout for Germans. Lieut Bernard could not suffer the pain while he was being moved and asked if one of would volunteer to go ahead and locate our position. I moved forward a short distance when I heard voices and called out, and was answered by a rattle of machine gun fire which must have come from some Germans. I ducked back and suggested we taking cover until daylight and we got down into a couple of shell holes.' Pte John Bolton, # 590, 31st Battalion, POW

# WIA (bullet and shrapnel in arm) and taken POW at Polygon Wood on 26<sup>th</sup> Sep 1917.

"At about 6am on 26<sup>th</sup> Sep 1917 the 31<sup>st</sup> and 59<sup>th</sup> Battalions, attacked the enemy positions on Zonnebeke Ridge, near Passchendaele. The Menin Road was our right flank. To reach our objective we had to advance about 500 yards. Our losses in the advance were not great. We reached our sector of the ridge and found that we had no support on either right or left. There would be about 50 of us all told, but the majority of these were shot down by enemy snipers and machine guns, shortly after reaching the summit of the ridge. The Trench Mortar men had one gun, but no live shells beyond smoke shells. We had been instructed to pick up live ammunition in the front line, but we found none there. We advanced about 50 yards over the ridge – what was left of us, about 23 – until the enemy machine guns properly held us up. We took cover in shellholes and sustained rifle fire as long as we could. The enemy machine guns kept us down under cover. The enemy fire came from both flanks and from the rear. Eventually a party of enemy infantry, under cover of their machine gun barrage, advanced on our left. We were a divided party in separate shell-holes. The enemy called on us to surrender and we did so. We had no alternative. In another shell-hole on our left was Lieut Castles of the 29<sup>th</sup> Battalion.

We saw him surrender before we were called upon to surrender. Lieut Hill of the LTMB, badly wounded – one eye having been knocked out – was in a hole nearby. A party of 18 of us were marched to Courtrai via Roulers, being searched at the latter place. We got to Dulmen on 11<sup>th</sup> Nov 1917, having up till then being locked up in a disused factory at Dendermonde. After a month at Dulmen, we were sent to Dyrotz, some 30 kilometers from Berlin.

Some of us were sent out 'on commando', others were put to building an aerodrome at Dyrotz. On the signing of the Armistice, all commandos were call in to Dyrotz. Thence we were sent to Stettin via Altdamm. We left Stettin for Copenhagen by the SS 'Queen Maude' on 3'<sup>d</sup> Dec 1918. After eight days in camp at Lillereg near Copenhagen, we crossed to Leith in the SS 'Ajex'. We arrived at Leith on 16<sup>th</sup> Dec 1918. It was not until the end of February 1918 – five months after our capture, that we received out Red Cross parcels. Pte E Fisher when captured, had a bullet wound in the left leg." 

Chapman said he was lying there the next day, he knew Lt Blackley and where he was killed. Previously reported missing then reported KIA due inquiry of 6th Mar 1918 and struck off strength. 

L/Cpl 3126 A.G. Caesar, attached to Guard Coy, was Corporal of Guard of No 9 Detention, No 1 Command depot, when about 1500, 27<sup>th</sup> Dec 1918, was examining passes of men returning from leave, and then proceeded to patrol passage and noticed a hole in floor of one of the cells. He turned out the guard immediately and, accused, Sgt Charles Blake, gave orders to see if any prisoners had escaped, examined the hole, called the roll and found four prisoners had escaped. Lieut J McQuie, OC of Guard Company, stated that about 1600, 27<sup>th</sup> Dec 1916 a report was forwarded from Sgt Blake that four prisoners had effected an escape. Sgt Blake was placed under open arrest. Upon inspection of the detention hut, no indication of laxity of the part of the accused, and he continued as Sgt of Guard until relieved next morning. Counsel for accused asked for acquittal as prosecution had <u>not proved</u> that the Sgt of the Guard had in any way been responsible for escape, or had in any way been lacking in reasonable care or had without reasonable excuse allowed the prisoners to escape. Capt A. Jacka, VC, MC appeared as Counsel for the accused. Court found the accused NOT GUILTY.



"At POLYGON WOOD on 26<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> September 191, this Officer seeing men of R.W. Fusiliers being driven back, rushed across ground being shelled and stopped about 20 of them and led them back and with some of his own men and details from other units, he reorganized the rear defences of our exposed flank. Later under heavy machine gun fire, he went back to get a Lewis Gun which he placed in position to cover posts.

When the enemy attacked our right flank it was owing to his supreme coolness and promptitude that the men of all units in the immediate vicinity were enabled to make a determined stand.

This Officer's action undoubtedly staved off a serious attack by the enemy on the Battalion on our right and prevented the enemy putting in a wedge behind our own troops.

Men testify that it was owing to this officer's example that they felt confidence in meeting the enemy counterattack made.

Lieut Blomfield after the action commanded a party of volunteers to find and bury the bodies of our officers who fell when clearing the Pill Boxes on our flank and he carried out this work under constant shell fire."



Marian was living with her eldest daughter, Ellen until she passed in 1939, then was living with her second eldest daughter, Jane, at 24 Davis St, South Yarra until Marian died on 23rd Oct 1945. Both parents are buried Elmore Cemetery. Apparently working as a farm labourer at Finley, NSW prior to enlistment and gave his mother's address at Fitzrov when enlisting. Edward's sister, Jessie was a Red Cross nurse when she married Horace Clement Hugh Robertson on 7th Nov 1914 prior to his deployment as a Lieut with 10th LH. On 19th Oct 1916 a second ceremony was performed at the Kasr-el-Nil Chapel in Cairo. Red Robbie as he was affectionately known had a distinguished military career in First, Second and Korean Wars - Lieut General Sir Horace Clement Hugh Robertson, KBE, DSO. Another sister, Agnes trained as a nurse after leaving school and enlisted in the AANS on 3rd Apr 1915 and was immediately sent overseas. She returned to Australia on 14th Mar 1916. On 16th Aug 1916, she commenced her second tour of duty when she embarked on RMS Orontes for Egypt. Assigned to 14th AGH, Abbassia, Egypt and was promoted to Sister on 3rd April 1917. Agnes was wounded on 23rd Apr 1919 by a sentry whilst driving in Egypt (received a bullet graze to her hip). She returned to Australia per 'Lucie Woerman' on 5th Dec 1919 and discharged on 9th Jul 1920. She received the Royal Red Cross (2nd Class) award as a Staff Sister. Near BOUZENCOURT on 10<sup>th</sup> May 1918 a British single seater aeroplane (Lieut Barker, 80<sup>th</sup> Sqn RAF) crashed out of control at about 7.10pm in full daylight inside the German outpost night line. On his Platoon Commander calling for a volunteer to assist him to carry the pilot in, Private BOUGHTON volunteered, though the enemy were heavily machine-gunning the 'plane and our trenches. He cooly walked across No Man's Land with Lieut Hill and assisted him to extricate and carry back to our trenches, the pilot, who was badly dazed but unwounded.

This act, coolly carried out in the face of enemy fire, required the greatest pluck, and the magnificent courage displayed served as an excellent example for Private Boughton's comrades."





We were in a barn at Bouzancourt, near Hamel when a shell burst on a barn in which Stubbin and 34 of us were sleeping. He and several others were killed outright, and a few died of wounds, while 14 of us were wounded and in hospital. I saw him buried with 9 or 10 others near the barn. We erected a cross giving all the details. Pte RH Noble, # 3604. This shell killed or wounded 27 other ranks. Lt H Miller, 'A' Coy, in charge of burial party that interred this man and 9 others at the left rear corner of the Farmhouse at Bouzancourt, (map ref I.34d) A cross erected over each body, Bn padre Malcolmson buried them. Only arrived the night before, so taking shelter in best places we could find. (Red Cross file) Pte John Andersen, 718A 'A' Coy, III Platoon, wounded.



He had been dead for at least six hours. Rigor Mortis was well marked. I sent the body to No 3 General Hospital, Le Treport for postmortem examination and convened a Court of Inquiry herewith." R W Ironside, Capt RMAC, OC 4<sup>th</sup> Army Convalescent Depot

"This is to certify that on the night of 4<sup>th</sup> September 1918, I looked in to Lieut Buchanan's room in the Officer's Quarters of the above depot and saw him sleeping at about 10.30pm." W.E.S. Barclay, Capt, 85<sup>th</sup> Squadron, BEF

Capt Barclay had to return to duty before the Court of Inquiry could be held.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Witness, Capt Ironside

"About 7.15am on 5<sup>th</sup> Sep 1918, I was sent for, to see an Officer, who had apparently fallen from a window on the second floor. I found him lying on his face, death had apparently taken place about 6 hours previously. I ordered the body to be taken to No 3 General Hospital for a post mortem examination. The body was that of Lieut Leslie Buchanan, 31<sup>st</sup> Bn, AIF. He was admitted on 30<sup>th</sup> Aug 1918"

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Witness, Pte S H Edwards, 165070, 18<sup>th</sup> Royal Hussars

"I was coming down the road leading to the Villa des Roses, at 8.30pm on the night of 4th Sep and there saw two Australians helping an Officer, and I helped them take this officer up to the mess. When I arrived at the messI left this officer and the two Australians and proceeded to the mess where I explained to the L/Cpl in charge that we had picked up an Australian Officer who I believed was staying in the mess. The L/Cpl accompanied me to where the Australian Officer was resting and we then proceeded to take him upstairs to his room. We removed his tunic, collar and boots and placed him on the bed and covered him over.' Q. "in your opinion was this officer drunk?"

A. "I am of the opinion he was in a collapsed state."

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Witness, L/Cpl Dover, 307224, 776 Area Employment Coy

"After my attention was called to Lieut Buchanan between 8.30pm and 8.45pm on the bank just below the villa where he slept, there were two Australians with him who got him up to his room. We put him on the bed, took his boots off, collar, and opened his shirt, covered him over and left him sleeping.

Q. "Was there any foaming at the mouth?"

Ā. "No"

Q. "Was this officer in to tea or dinner on 4<sup>th</sup> Sep 1918?"

Ã. " No"

Q. "Did this officer drink much while staying here?"

A. "He was a very moderate drinker, taking only one drink with each meal."

4th Witness, Pte Simon Saltzman, 55569, 1001 Labour Coy

"I was acting house orderly on the morning of the  $5^{th}$  Sep and at 7 in the morning I looked through the kitchen window and saw the body and I called another servant who went for Captain Ironside."

#### L/Cpl Dover re-examined

Q. "Did you think it necessary when you left Lt Buchanan to call for a Medical Officer?"

A. No. He was breathing quite freely and did not appear sufficiently ill enough,"

Capt Ironside re-examined

- Q. "Did you examine this officer's room on the morning of the  $5^{th}$ ?"
- Ã. "Yes'

*Q.* "In what state did you find it?" *A.* "The bed had been slept in, the window was open and one pane of glass broken. There was nothing to

indicate why this officer climbed through the window."

- Q. "Was there any blood in the room or on the window sill at all?"
- A. "No"

Q. "In view of the evidence of the Pathologist, how do you consider this officer came by the penetrating wound on the left side?"

A. "In my opinion the wound was caused by the body falling on several sharp branches, which were attacking vertically upwards from a tree beneath the window through which he crashed before reaching the ground.

In the opinion of the Court, how did this officer meet with his death? His death was caused through accidently falling out of the window.

#### The late Lieut L. Buchanan, 31st Battalion

"Court of Inquiry Proceedings are now to hand which show that the above-named late Officer was assisted to his room at about 8.45pm on 4/9/18 and was, in the opinion of two witnesses, in a collapsed condition. He was placed on his bed and left sleeping. He was breathing quite freely and did not appear ill enough to require medical attention. At 10.30pm an Officer of the Royal Air Force, looked into his room and saw him sleeping. An Officer of the Royal Army Medical Corps gave evidence that he had been called in about 7.30am the following day to see the late Lieut Buchanan, who apparently, had fallen from a window on the second floor. Death had taken place about six hours previously. The finding of the Court, was the unfortunate occurrence was accidental."

"For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty when on two occasions our advance was temporarily held up by strongly defended 'pill-boxes'. Private Bugden, in the face of devastating fire from machine guns, gallantly led small parties to attack these strong points and, successfully silencing the machine guns with bombs, captured the garrison at the point of the bayonet.

On another occasion, when a Corporal, who had become detached from his company, had been captured and was being taken to the rear by the enemy, Pte. Bugden, single-handed, rushed to the rescue of his comrade, shot one enemy and bayoneted the remaining two, thus releases the Corporal. On five occasions he rescued wounded men under intense shell and machine gun fire, showing an utter contempt and disregard for danger.

Always foremost in volunteering for any dangerous missions, it was during the execution of one of these missions that this gallant soldier was killed."

# Diary of a Digger written by Stan in the mid-1970s

Posted by Margaret Busst, Tuesday, 5th August 2014

First born to William Augustus and Christina Busst on 25 September 1899 at Subiaco, Perth WA.

Father being a railwayman moved to Wagga Wagga, Sydney then Brisbane we lived at 72 Gotha Street, Valley. Siblings being Madge, Walter, Minnie, Dawn and Leonard. I went to night school till Feb 1912, then joined the Brisbane tramways as a point boy. The Manager was a Yank J.S. Badger who promised the employees they would be reemployed if they enlisted. I enlisted with other tramway men in the A.I.F. on the 21st September 1916, 4 days before my 17th birthday and declared my age 18 which was accepted. After 3 months training at Enoggera camp we were drafted 14 Dec 1916 as the 12th Reinforcement of the 31st Infantry Battalion 8th Brigade, 5th Division A.I.F. and arrived in Southampton March 1917. We went to Hurdcott camp, Salisbury Plain where I attended the Signal School for training as a Signaller until Sept 1917. I was drafted from Hurdcott to France in Sept 1917 and joined the 31st Battalion at Polygon Wood when the Battalion was relieved (C Company Headquarters). From there we the 31st went to Messines Ridge and held the line until December. From Messines the 8th Brigade went to a place called DESVRES to rest and reform the 8th Brigade 29th, 30th, 31st, 32nd Infantry Battalions, 5th Division, by that time it was March 1918. Early in March "Fritz (the enemy was known as FRITZ on the western front) one morning advanced on the whole western front. The main attack was to get to Paris via Villers-Bretonneux. The raid on our sector Whyschaete on the left of Messines Ridge was very weak. When the main attack was known the 8th Brigade was moved from Messines Ridge down to the Somme by bus and route march to Hamelet, Corbie sector, on the left of VILLERS-BRETTONEUX.

Being on the left of VB our sector was quiet and I was there until 26th May 1918. It was a Sunday afternoon about 3pm and I was with Sgt Major Fargie, C Company HQ when a range finder shell wizz bang ground shrapnel landed about 10 yards away. I was hit in the calf of the right leg with a piece of shrapnel about the size of a shilling. I was evacuated to a hospital AFH somewhere near LE TREPORT. Gangrene set in even though they tried very hard to stop it (there being no penicillin) the foot went black and an amputation was necessary above the knee on 1st June 1918. From LE TREPORT, I went by hospital ship to Southampton then to Birmingham Hospital then to Southall Hospital, London and a limb factory until fitted with a peg leg. Travelled on the hospital ship KANOWNA to Sydney and after a weeks quarantine in Sydney harbour arrived home in Brisbane on the 17th March 1919 aged 19 1/2 years. From March 1919 to March 1920 attended the limb factory at Rosemount hospital for measurements and fittings of above the knee artificial right leg. Discharged from the Army March 1920. Started work back at Brisbane Tramways, March 1920 and retired on my 65th birthday 25 September 1964. On 24th February 1922 bought a house from Alfred and Martha Short at 25 Markwell Street, Auchenflower, Brisbane on time payment. On 7th November 1936 married IVY MABEL WEBBER at Wynnum Methodist Church. We had 4 children, DAVID ANTHONY (19.10.37.) CHRISTINE JENNIFER (28.2.40.) MARY ELIZABETH (2.10.43) MARGARET RUTH (18.3.47.)


