He was a brick of a man and I was quite sorry not to be able to pull him through. — Sister Murray"

Both went out and found Keen 20 yds from his post, badly wounded having been hit all over body, but mostly on left side. He was unconscious and carried to Bethlehem Farm, where he died, having lived only an hour after being found. Buried at Bethlehem Farm West Military Cemetery, ½ east of Messines, and a small cross erected.

Mr James Nicholls in his narrative concerning the murder of his companion Mt Renault Keith states that the two men were prospecting for tin. Their boat was leaking, so they beached it at Point Blaze, mid way between Darwin and Daly River, and formed camp.

While Mr Nicholls was absent a native called at the camp. Mr Keith asked what he wanted, and the native replied "Nothing" but refused to go away when told to do so.

Mr Keith then struck the aboriginal across the face, and the native retaliated by hitting Mr Keith with a stick on the left shoulder. Mr Keith obtained a gun, and the native ran. A shot was fired.

The aboriginal evidently returned with other natives while Mr Nicholls was getting oysters and shot Mr Keith. They then looted the camp.

Mr Keith was formerly a member of the 31st Battalion. He was a native of Jersey, in the Channel Islands, but had been in Australia since childhood.

Patrick was another long serving 'A' Coy member and being one of the originals would have been well known to other III Platoon members of John Newman and James Edward O'Connor and his namesake John Patrick Kelly. Patrick was first wounded at Fromelles with a GSW to his leg. His evacuation to England and recovery would mean it was not until late October 1917 that he rejoined his Battalion and Company. Unfortunately, it was only about six weeks before he was Wounded again whilst in the front line in the Warneton Sector. With a bullet wound fracturing his radius of left forearm, he was evacuated to England again, and did not rejoin III Platoon until June 1918. Although he survived the Battalion's actions from the 8th August, he was killed by a shell on the 29th Aug 1918. He lies alongside fellow platoon member Pte Dan Davis (already mentioned) at Assevillers New British Cemetery.

On the 29<sup>th</sup> August, the 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion was in the advance to the Somme Canal to the south of Peronne. The enemy had retired to the eastern side of the Somme River. 'A' Coy established posts on the western bank and came under direct fire from 77mm guns on the high ground on the other side of the river and continual MG fire and sniping from the eastern bank of the river. One of these shells killed both Pte Dan Davis,MM and Pte # 240 Patrick Kelly. Paddy Kelly was an original 'A' Coy member.

KIA on 29th Aug 1918 at St Quentin, France

"It is advised that a shell fell close to Pte Kelly on 29.8.18 wounding him in the head and body. He was bandaged by a comrade, but died about three minutes afterwards, before he could be removed.

He was buried by a stretcher-bearer belonging to the same company, No 662 Pte Gartner W.J. – near Bareux, Sht 62D. SW. O.20.c.7.2

Subsequently the Battalion Pioneers erected a cross over his grave."

Wild Colonial Boys 240 Pvt Patrick Kelly

1069A Pvt James McCormack

Labourers James "Sandy" McCormack (b. Co. Sligo 1883) & Patrick "Paddy" Kelly (b. Ipswich Q 1886) enlisted in Brisbane on 20.7.1915. Both were single men. They were allocated to 31st Bn, & served together in 3 Platoon A Coy until 1918. They would fight at Fromelles one year to the day they said goodbye to their mothers, at Given Terrace and Great George Street.

Before Fromelles, though, the mates saw plenty of other action, both going AWL almost on arrival in Egypt in February 1916, & being charged for drunkenness on post in April. There were other infractions Sandy's part, insubordination being but one.

The 31st went into the AIF's first major action in France suffering 567 casualties (over half its strength) in 12 hours. Paddy suffered GSW to the chest & legs and was evacuated to the UK. Sandy followed in December 1916, contracting severe bronchitis at the Front during the notorious Somme Winter, but only after going AWL again in November.

The mates clocked up 21 days AWL in England between them before reuniting in a training battalion (the 69th) & going AWL together again for four days in July 1917.

Both returned to the 31st in October were wounded (GSW arms) during a night patrol on 11.12.17 in No Man's Land near Warneton, Belgium, again returning to England for treatment.

Sandy went AWL in April 1918 before returning to his unit at the end of May, as the 31st was coming out of the line after a record 53 days near Villers-Bretonneux. While in camp at Rivery, Sandy broke bounds for the last time on 5 June 1918.

Paddy, who at the time was AWL himself in England, later wrote to Mrs McCormack to say her son had been shot dead by a French soldier, while Sandy was sticking up for an American in a fight. Other versions of the story abounded. An Enquiry found that McCormack & two other 31st men had been on a drinking spree in a village called Argoeuves, near Amiens, trashed an estaminet & forced entry to a house, where McCormack was wounded by an occupant with a shotgun, succumbing to his wounds after two days. 1069A Pvt James McCormack, late of Given Tce, Paddington Q is buried at Vignacourt British Cemetery III.D.15. His epitaph reads: "Have Mercy upon him Lord May Perpetual Light Shine Upon Him".

Paddy Kelly returned to the unit a month after his mate's demise & was killed on 29.8.1918 by shellfire on the approach to Peronne & Mont St Quentin. 240 Pvt Patrick Kelly, late of Great George St, Paddington Q is buried in Assevillers New British Cemetery II.E.2. His grave bears no epitaph.

He returned to the 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion in July 1918, just prior to major offensive on August. Although susceptible to his nervous condition, the men of his platoon must have had some high regard of their Officer to make a presentation plaque.



His medical records also state; "On 8th August, 1918, he was with the 31st Battalion and slightly wounded – he managed to keep going during the first operations but was very exhausted afterwards.

His brother was killed at this time and this played on his mind considerably." His brother was Gnr Austin George Kimpton #1204, 6th AFA, who died of wounds at 2nd Fld Amb (SW Head) on 9th Aug 1918 and buried Heath Cemetery, Harbonnieres

No III Platoon, 'A' Coy, 31st Battalion were engaged in the advance on the River Somme at Villers Carbonnel (29th – 30th August), and the major operations of the advance on the Hindenburg Line at Joncourt and Bellicourt (29th September to 1st October).

L/Sgt William McGhie was awarded a MM "After his Platoon commander had become a casualty, he assumed command and throughout led them with great skill and determination though working under heavy shell and machine gun fire..." . Although not mentioned in service records, it is possible Kimpton may have succumbed to his nervous condition.



I do not know if buried. His brother is in England waiting to get artificial leg. Did not know his number. – Pte 5103A E J Pryke, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn"

"...known as 'Tom'. Casualty was sitting in an outpost station on Sunken Road, Beaumetz. A shell exploded near casualty mortally wounding him. He died on reaching Advanced Dressing Station. Pte Bolitho was killed by the same shell. I had charge of the outpost station. I was 2 yds from him at the time of his death. His chief wounds were about his body. I do not know where he is buried. – Sgt 858 E J Gothard" – probably someone else as Pte Bolitho was killed 24th Apr 1917
