2. The G.O.C., A.I.F. has approved of his return to Australia for termination of appointment and instructions have been issued for him to be sent to England if and when fit to travel. It is with great regret that the G.O.C., A.I.F. has been compelled to such an extreme measure in the case of a Duntroon graduate, but he considers that such repeated acts of misconduct cannot be overlooked, and has no option but to recommend that he be no longer retained as an Officer of the Permanent Forces.

After the war Halkyard moved to Western Australia and worked as a foreman for Rayners Preserves for two years and as a station hand in the north west of the state. In October 1921 he applied for a position as a patrol officer in New Guinea, which was then under Australian administration. He was initially successful but in 1922 the job offer was withdrawn because he had not disclosed material facts relating to his war service in his application. He died in Sale, Victoria on 19 February 1984.

We got heavy shelling and machine gun; A whizz bang point blank range got our lot. Hamilton was very badly hit. Saw him fall, rise again, and fall. He died where he fell instantly. Huns did not hold this ground again. I did not see him buried."

It was night time when we buried them, so I can't say I buried Gard, but he is buried there."**

Hamilton, 4072 **"Killed at Villers Carbonnel on Aug 29th. Went into action on 28th and when he fell he was on No 1 machine gun team and next to informants No 2. When advancing at 1pm and 10 yards off the final objective a shell landed killing him and two others instantaneously – the two others being Ptes McFarlane and O'Donohue. The position at Villers Carbonnel was on top of the ridge in amongst huts and apparently an old hospital or CCS. Here they were buried on the spot previously used as a cemetery – each with a small identification cross. Informant is almost sure that the Battalion later erected a substantial cross. Hamilton was 5'9" in height, had dark hair and was known as 'Felix'. Enlisted in Queensland but resided in Melbourne. Came away with the 10th Reinforcements to 31st Bn about Oct 1916. Met him when he arrived in England and in France knew him for a year being in the same Platoon and Coy – 'D'. Was a lively chap and a good soldier."** Pte Arthur Stanley Gilbert, 3814, XVI Platoon, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn

Hamilton, 4072 **"He was of 31st Battalion, D16. 5ft 10, dark, and 25. Came from Queensland. At Villers Carbonnel on August 29, 1918, we were advancing under shell fire when Hamilton was killed by a shell. He was buried in a Military Cemetery in the village and a cross was erected. Other Australians are buried there."** Pte Arthur Stanley Gilbert, 3814, XVI Platoon, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn

Evening of 26th Sep 1917, Hamilton was on top of a trench sniping the Germans when shot by a German sniper in the forehead and killed instantly at Polygon Wood. Pte 4639 William Watson, I Platoon, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

The above named was a personal friend of mine and in the same platoon, but not in the same section. I was in the battle at Polygon Wood and was reported killed but escaped with a severe wound in the head, just 1/16th of an inch below the right temple. The concussion shattered the vision of my right eye and I'm consequently blind in that one, the other is fortunately sound and am able to fill the place of another man fit to go to France. So am doing my little bit just the same. The late Hamilton kept a diary of which he was very proud and on the day we marched up to the trenches, he asked me if anything happened to him, and I escaped myself, to secure the pocket book, fountain pen, wristlet watch, wallet and some small amount of money he had, and send them to his wife. The severity of my wound precluded me from looking for him among so many dead. Shell holes were full of dead Aussies and Fritzs and was no easy task picking out one's mates unless sure of the exact spot where he might be lying. Do you think its possible to get information if the articles in question were secured before he was buried. I am sure his wife would like to have the diary. I am classed C1 and work in the IMO doing clerical work and anticipate going home one of these days, but am not in haste so long as am doing a little bit towards defeating the common enemy. I am sorry indeed to give you so much trouble in this matter and also to weary you with a long letter like this, trusting to hear from you again in due course. Thanking you again for your kind attention. Pte 4569 Ewen Mackinnon, 31st Bn
p.s. The late JHNH had a good-sized station in Queensland and had unlimited means and has given hundreds of Pounds to your Society as well as to other patriotic funds.

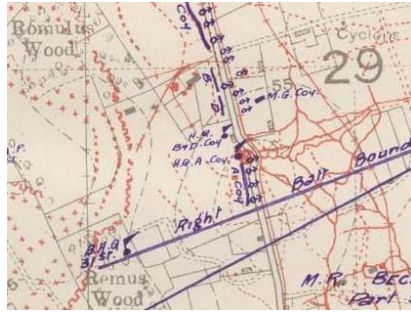

The receipt for the two Verey pistols I received from my OC, Capt W. Lennan. No 6 Platoon did not return a pistol to me, nor did Nos 7 and 8. The pistol handed over to CSM Forsyth of 'D' Coy is the one issued to Cpl N.L. Germain, so I am informed by Cpl Germain.

On 9th April 1918 the Battalion moved through Corbie and thence along the North bank of the Somme to the Pontoon Bridge, where guides led the Companies to various sectors to relieve the 58th Battalion, 15th Brigade. The relief was completed by 2.10am on 10th April, without casualties. The enemy was very quiet during the relief, but his artillery was very active during the day on Vaire to Bouzencourt. At 1.30pm the enemy shelled a farm occupied by the Battalion with 40 rounds of 5.9" and 4.2" shells.

The 34 men of III Platoon, 'A' Coy were taking shelter in the best places we could find, in a barn, trying to get some sleep after the previous night's relief. Three direct hits, by high explosive shells, on the barn, caused 27 casualties.

"At about 6am on 26th Sep 1917 the 31st and 59th Battalions, attacked the enemy positions on Zonnebeke Ridge, near Passchendaele. The Menin Road was our right flank. To reach our objective we had to advance about 500 yards. Our losses in the advance were not great. We reached our sector of the ridge and found that we had no support on either right or left. There would be about 50 of us all told, but the majority of these were shot down by enemy snipers and machine guns, shortly after reaching the summit of the ridge. The Trench Mortar men had one

gun, but no live shells beyond smoke shells. We had been instructed to pick up live ammunition in the front line, but we found none there. We advanced about 50 yards over the ridge – what was left of us, about 23 – until the enemy machine guns properly held us up. We took cover in shell-holes and sustained rifle fire as long as we could. The enemy machine guns kept us down under cover. The enemy fire came from both flanks and from the rear. Eventually a party of enemy infantry, under cover of their machine gun barrage, advanced on our left. We were a divided party in separate shell-holes. The enemy called on us to surrender and we did so. We had no alternative. In another shell-hole on our left was Lieut Castles of the 29th Battalion.

We saw him surrender before we were called upon to surrender. Lieut Hill of the LTMB, badly wounded – one eye having been knocked out – was in a hole nearby. A party of 18 of us were marched to Courtrai via Roulers, being searched at the latter place. We got to Dulmen on 11th Nov 1917, having up till then being locked up in a disused factory at Dendermonde. After a month at Dulmen, we were sent to Dyrotz, some 30 kilometers from Berlin.

Some of us were sent out 'on commando', others were put to building an aerodrome at Dyrotz. On the signing of the Armistice, all commandos were call in to Dyrotz. Thence we were sent to Stettin via Altdamm. We left Stettin for Copenhagen by the SS 'Queen Maude' on 3rd Dec 1918. After eight days in camp at Lillereg near Copenhagen, we crossed to Leith in the SS 'Ajex'. We arrived at Leith on 16th Dec 1918. It was not until the end of February 1918 – five months after our capture, that we received out Red Cross parcels. Pte E Fisher when captured, had a bullet wound in the left leg."

From a 1974 transcript by Robert Henry: *"I went into the big army camp at Seymour. They had had a lot of rain and there was mud everywhere. Men had to sleep on the ground on gum leaves. There was a lot of sickness and I became ill. I had a very bad throat and I had to come to Melbourne. We had some training at Broadmeadows. I was put into what was called the Tenth of the Sixth Reinforcements. The Sixth Battalion was in the First Division of the AIF. While I was in the Tenth of the Sixth I got the measles. It was about 3 weeks before I got back to the*

camp at Broadmeadows again. The Tenth of the Sixth had already left for overseas. I called up the Office of Reinforcements but they had no record of me at all. So I went down to the Orderly Tent where the Tenth of the Sixth Reinforcements had been. In the tent were my attestation papers. If I'd left the Army there and then there would have been no record of me at all. But I wanted to do my duty I suppose, so I took the papers to the Reinforcements Headquarters in Broadmeadows. I was put in a reserves company which was formed to accommodate those waiting to be more permanently placed. One of our duties in the reserve company was to act as markers for shooting practice at the Williamstown Rifle Range. One day while we were there Colonel Tivey interviewed us. He was looking for some more men to fill up the 31st Battalion. It appears that the two companies, A and B, came down from Queensland. The original 31st Battalion consisted of two companies from Queensland (A and B and two from Victoria (C and D). On the way down from Queensland some 50 or more went AWL. Rather than looking for them they wanted to fill up with Victorians. Colonel Tivey interviewed all the markers personally and asked them their army history. I was one selected and taken into the 31st Battalion and given an original number 344.

We did some training in that Battalion and on November 9 we sailed out of Port Phillip Bay on the "Wandilla", a boat of 9-10,000 tons that belonged to the Adelaide Steamship Company. On the boat was a full Battalion, over 1000 men. We sailed for Fremantle. I was a very poor sailor and became very sea-sick as soon as we got out of the bay and was sick more or less all the way to Fremantle.

At Fremantle we were allowed off the boat for a day. Some went up as far as Perth but I stayed about Fremantle. We were to be back by six or seven o'clock to go aboard, but only about 50 of us turned up at that hour. We were formed into an army picket, put in charge of an officer, and sent off to look for the missing soldiers in Fremantle. Some had been thirsty and had had a whale of a time. It was about midnight before we got most of them back on board. The next day we sailed for Port Suez. We didn't have cabins but were given hammocks in the cargo holds. I didn't sleep in my hammock the whole way. It was hot and I was too sick. I slept on deck when it was warm weather. Altogether I had a poor trip.

We disembarked at Port Suez and went by train to Heliopolis where we stayed a short time. Then we were sent to the Suez Canal area. Earlier in the war the Turks had attacked the Canal and some had got across. It was expected they may attack again so as part of our training we were sent on to the Canal. We were part of the 8th Brigade consisting of about 5000 men. One place we were at was a place called Ismailia.

We spent quite a time some 15 miles east of the Canal. It was very trying at times amongst the hills of sand. I remember once we had a sand storm for three days. The wind blew tents down and the cooks couldn't light a fire. We were in Egypt about six months. During this time troops had been evacuated from Gallipoli to a camp in Egypt called El Kebir. We were in that camp for a while. Then they set about forming a new division, the 5th division, made up of the 8th Brigade and 14th and 15th Brigades. We went to France with the 5th Division. We sailed from Port Alexandria on the transport the "Horoato", a New Zealand ship, on my birthday, June 16 in 1916. We disembarked at Marseilles and travelled by train to the north of France near Armentieres."

From a 1974 transcript by Robert Henry: "After a little more training we went to the front line in what was called the Big Raid. The attacking force consisted of one division of Australian troops and one division of English troops. We went into action on July 19 and I was taken prisoner on July 20, so we weren't long in France - only a matter of days, before I was in action and wounded. In the attack we were told the idea of the engagement was to go over to hold what we could take. This proved to be incorrect. The real reason had been to create a diversion for a much bigger offensive planned on the Somme. I was in the first wave that went over the top and got so far over we were caught in our own artillery fire. In fact the shrapnel now in my shoulder and hip came from our own guns. We had got about half a mile when I was hit. Men were affected differently by being in action. I didn't seem to have any feelings.

I was hit first in the shoulder by shrapnel which rendered my right arm incapable of doing anything. I discarded my rifle and hand grenades and started to crawl back through the long grass in the darkness which was lit up intermittently by German Very lights. I got between two machine guns, one German and one of ours. As a result I had to keep low down on the ground. One burst of fire caught me on the right side and I have a scar about 8-9 inches long where one bullet went in. The rest of the bullets cut my trousers right down to the knee. That was a pretty close call. We had gone over the top a little bit before sun down. I laid there all night with wounds to the shoulder, back and leg.

During the night, the Germans came in our flanks and recaptured their trenches. Our fellows retired and left us to ourselves but I was unaware of it. During the night I must have passed out. When I woke it was broad daylight. Our side was directing their shellfire close by. A lump of dirt, thrown out by an exploding shell, hit me in the groin. I thought it was safe to move after the bombardment so I got up and made for the breastwork of a trench and climbed over it and found one of our machine gunners there. He was unwounded and unarmed. I got him to put my field dressing on my machine gun wound on my right side. There wasn't enough dressing to cover the wound completely.

Four o'clock that afternoon we were taken prisoner by a German NCO armed with a revolver. I had lost a lot of blood and was pretty thirsty. I was able to walk with the German NCO who delivered us to some officers who could speak English. We were given the task of carrying out a Lewis machine gun and I had to carry three or four magazines of ammunition. They hadn't seen a Lewis gun before. It hadn't been in use for long and was new to them. We walked what seemed to be a mile in a communication trench. By the time I had got out I was very thirsty. A German soldier gave me a drink and I showed him my wounds. He took me to an underground dressing station.

The German soldiers asked me to leave my tunic and steel helmet at the mouth of the entrance to the dressing station. When I came back all the badges had disappeared. The German soldiers apparently wanted to souvenir. In the dressing station it was warm and it was the only time I had felt like fainting. They put a field dressing on the wounds. From there I was taken to a clearing hospital after which we were taken to a place in Lille and the wounds were dressed a number of times during our stay of a week or so. I remember the civilians taking up a collection and gave us a few francs each. We had no other money. We were put on a train and taken to Westphalia to a prisoner of war camp where we stayed about two months until our wounds were healed." Courtesy of Robert Ellett, grandson of Robert Henry.

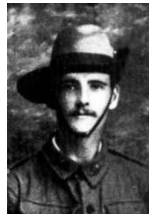

HETHERINGTON Albert



Albert HETHERINGTON, although born in the Snowy Mountains area he enlisted in Brisbane in July 1915 and was assigned to the 31st Battalion. Photo of him (AWM P00816.001 and 2nd from left) shows him with mates at Enoggera, where he was posted as an original 'B' Coy member. He embarked with the 31st Bn for Egypt and subsequently France. Wounded in action at Fromelles he rejoined his unit very briefly before suffering a severe bout of appendicitis which necessitated his evacuation to England. Upon recovery and transferred to Perham Downs he apparently met up with his brother Reg. They both trained together, embarked for France together and were taken on strength together with the 31st Bn. Though Albert was returned to his original 'B' Coy and Reg was posted to 'A' Coy, III Platoon. During the big advance on 8th August 1918, whilst in a shell hole at Warfusse with a mate, he was hit in the back and side. Albert was left for the stretcher-bearers to take back to the dressing station, as the advance continued. Here he spoke to Pte Jim Moore saying "I think I'm done for". Pte Moore replying "No, you are all right, you'll be in Blighty in a couple of days time." Albert then said "Can you get me something to drink?" A 5th Bde Padre gave him some coffee, which was as much as he could do to drink. He was removed to the 6th Australian Field Ambulance where he succumbed to his wounds. After his mother, Mrs Jane Hetherington, of Tumberumba received word of his death, the sympathy of the community was conveyed to relatives and a memorial service was held for he and his brother Reg at St Jude's Church on Sunday 15th September 1918.

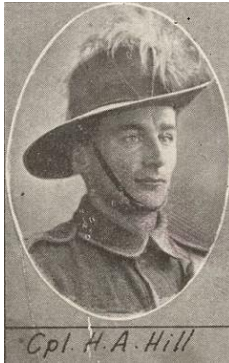

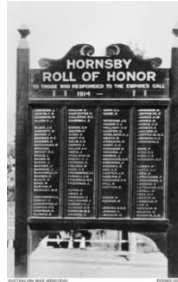

Prior to enlistment, Bert was employed as a shearer with a shearing team working the Barcaldine district of Queensland. He attested before Lieut R.L. Higgins (who attested a great many recruits at Enoggera) on 20th Jun 1915, and signed his name as '**B. Hill**'. Then on 12th July 1915, he married May Beatrice Robins in Brisbane, Queensland. On 23rd Sep 1915, Bert was with 11th Rfts, 2nd Light Horse at Chermside. Meanwhile, he'd arranged for his new bride, May, to be with Mrs McPherson, of Heatherdean, Hornsby, NSW. Bert rejoined the 31st Bn, now in the Wyttschaete Front line sector, from the Patrol and Scouting School and was immediately to put this schooling into practice. On 21st March, at 3.40 a.m., Lieut Albert Harold Hill and Lieut George William Jennings went out on patrol with 8 men. After patrolling bosche wire the officers sent the patrol back and took up a position, in company with Lance Corporal Augustus Ferdinand Chapman, within 160 yards of the enemy wire, intending to remain there during the day to observe the enemy post. At 6.40 a.m. the enemy put down a lighting barrage with artillery and minenwerfer on our picquet line. From the cover of an iron cupola, they saw party of enemy suddenly appear within twenty yards of their position. The morning was very misty and exact numbers of the enemy were unknown. The numbers were soon about 60. One party of the enemy was advancing in file along the road leading through three craters in front of them, the remainder were advancing across country, towards No 2 Picquet. Lieut Hill fired his revolver at the leading man hitting him in the right shoulder. The man who had been hit fell and the remainder halted. The enemy were armed with rifles (with fixed bayonets) and stick bombs. Hill, Jennings and Chapman, then emptied their revolvers and threw grenades into the crowd with unknown results. The enemy thereupon withdrew about 30 yards and threw a shower of stick bombs wounding all three of the party. The Officers and NCO then made for our own line and after a struggle in our wire eventually regained the picquet line. Rifle and Lewis Gun fire was brought to bear along the road, but owing to the fog the garrison of the picquet line were unable to observe the results of the fire. On receiving a report by phone from the front-line Company Commander, artillery was asked to put a slow rate of fire. Lieut Hill on reaching the picquet line, he advised them of the situation, and rested for about 20 minutes – he then went back to his original position to search for enemy identification. The C.O. interviewed both officers and was satisfied that a raid on a large scale was contemplated on our line. The energetic action of the party of three disorganised the attack. When Lieut Hill went back to the craters, no enemy could be seen, but many stick bombs were seen about the road. No identification was secured. Both officers were only slightly wounded and remained on duty. L/Cpl Chapman was evacuated wounded.

Awarded **MC** for this action: *'East of WYTTSCHAETE on 21st March 1918 Lieut. HILL displayed conspicuous gallantry and initiative. After patrolling No Man's Land during the previous night, this officer with two comrades took up a position at 5.10 a.m. near the enemy's wire, intending to remain there during the day to observe. At 6.40 a.m. about 60 enemy were seen advancing in two parties towards our line, armed with rifles – bayonets fixed – and stick bombs. Realising that an attack was intended on our picquet line Lieut. HILL and his companions gallantly decided to resist the attack. Lieut. HILL opened fire on the leading man of the enemy with*

his revolver from a distance of five yards hitting him in the shoulder: his companions followed suit with the result that the enemy were thrown into confusion. The enemy hurled a shower of stick bombs at our party, wounding all three of them. Notwithstanding this they continued to fight until their revolvers were empty and their supply of bombs were finished, and succeeded routing the enemy and inflicting casualties. Lieut. HILL then decided to withdraw. During the homeward journey he, at great personal risk, helped to extricate Lieut. JENNINGS from the barbed wire, and on reaching our trench finding that the remaining member of the party had not arrived he returned and accompanied his comrade back.

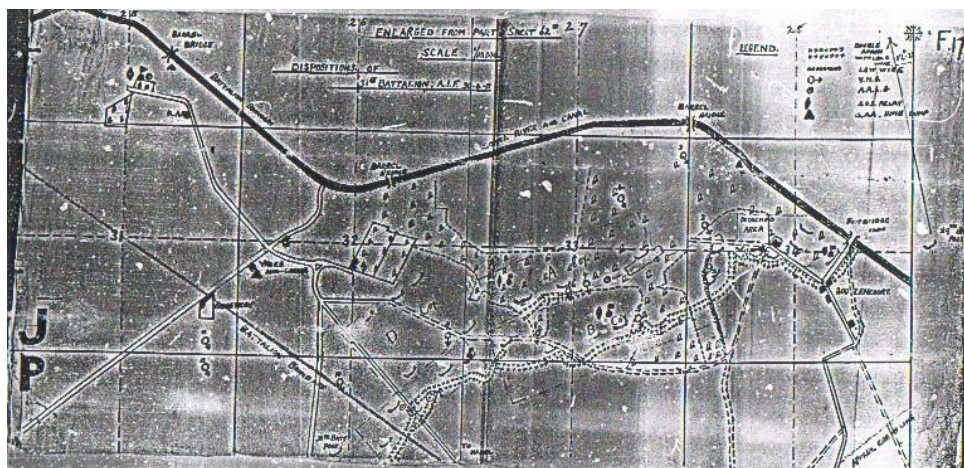
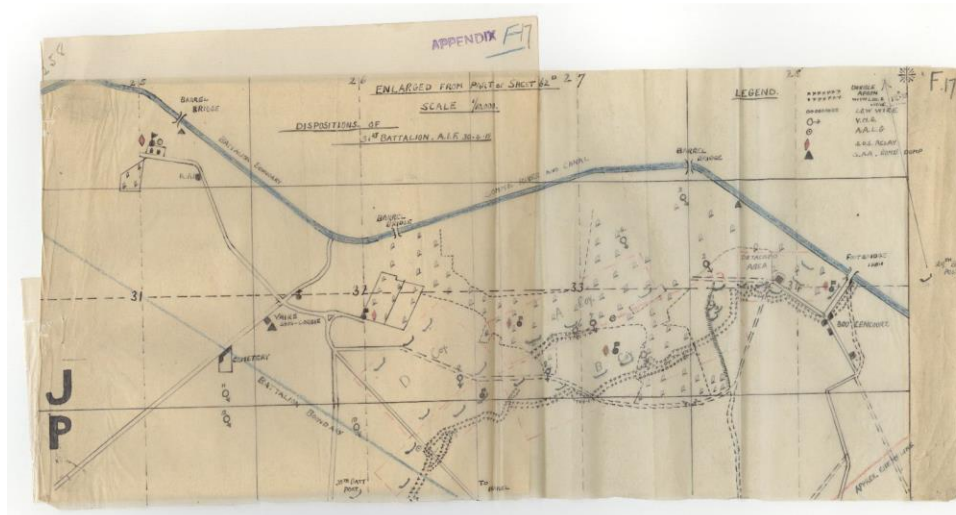
Wishing to obtain identification, Lieut. HILL with a Corporal from the nearest post, returned to the scene of the fight. None of the enemy were found, but the ground was covered in stick bombs and blood.

The courage and determination of this Officer undoubtedly broke up the enemy's attack, and averted many casualties.

His gallantry is deserving of special recognition.'

War Diary, April/May 1918

On Wednesday 10th April the Battalion moved into the front lines in the CORBIE Sector. The Battalion now holds the left sector of the Brigade with the SOMME as left boundary, and VAIRE-HAMEL road at P.3.c.3.7. with the 30th Battalion on our right and 41st Battalion on our left. "C" Company in the front line on the Right and "B" Company on the Left. "D" Company in support of "C" Company and "A" Company in support of "B" Company. BOUZENCOURT is held by two platoons - one platoon of "A" Company and one platoon of "C" Company.



The operations conducted by the Battalion whilst in the line throughout April/May were 'Fighting Patrols' / Active Patrolling, to harass the enemy. Most Platoon officers and senior Platoon NCOs would take out patrols each day/night. Lieut Bert Hill, MC has been identified as leading patrols on the following dates and positions:-

Friday, 19th April, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill MC, and 25 Other Ranks left J.34.d.2.9 at 11.35 pm and moved through BOUZENCOURT to P.4.b.9.4 where sound of working was heard. Patrol worked round to P.4.b.4.6. It appeared to be either a MG post or a post for 10 rifles. Patrol could not get closer on account of bright moonlight, and it accordingly returned at 3.40 am.

Sunday, 21st April 1918, just before 11 am, a large German triplane was observed chasing a British Sopwith Camel, both flying at about 200 feet and following the course of the **SOMME**. Enemy plane was firing all the way, thus preventing LG and MGs from ground coming to bear. Eventually two AALGs of 53rd Battalion, 14th F.A. Brigade opened fire and the plane staggered and crashed. The airman has been identified as **Captain Baron Mannheim von Richthofen**, the crack Germany airman.

Saturday, 27th April 1918, A patrol of 1 Officer (Lt Bert Hill) and 7 Other Ranks left J.34.d.3.8 at 3 am and proceeded to J.34.d.5.3, round North side of **BOUZENCOURT**, where the patrol observed a party of the enemy at P.4.b.25.90 under cover of the sunken road. It was thought that the party had a MG and were waiting for our patrol. Lieut Albert Harold Hill found it impossible to use his LG from his position, and accordingly moved his patrol to J.34.d.30.35 and waited to catch enemy party in the daylight but was unsuccessful as they withdrew early. Patrol returned at 5 am.

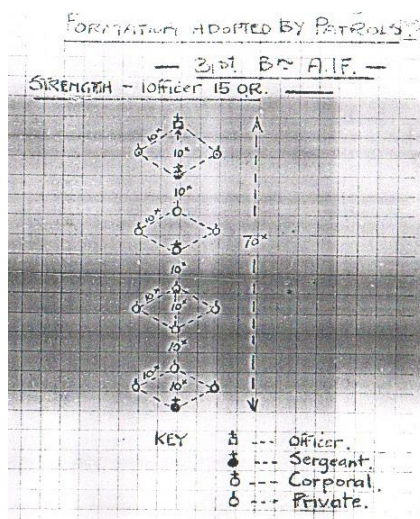
Tuesday, 30th April 1918, a patrol of 1 Officer (Lt Bert Hill) and 11 Other Ranks with LG, left J.34.d.3.8 at 8.30 pm and divided into two parties, one with Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, working along the **CANAL** bank through J.34.d. and the other working along hedges on the **BOUZENCOURT-HAMEL** road. The latter party had reached approx. J.34.d.5.5 when four of the enemy were seen coming along the road towards them. NCO in command immediately gave orders to take cover and allow enemy party to come closer. Enemy came to within 35 yards when one of our patrol fired, and enemy turned and ran. A search was immediately made of a hedge through which the enemy scrambled, but only two rifles were found. Patrol returned at 10.15 pm.

Wednesday, 1st May, 1918, patrol of Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, and 12 Other Ranks with Lewis Gun, went out from post at J.34.d.3.8 at 2.30 am and proceeded to J.34.d.9.0, to P.4.b.5.8, to J.34.d.2.0 and returned to post J.34.d.3.8. Patrol reported no sign of the enemy where they had been encountered earlier in the evening.

Thursday, 2nd May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill MC took out a patrol of 14 Other Ranks with Lewis Gun from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.30 pm and proceeded to J.34.d.5.2 where he posted 7 men, and 4 men at J.34.d.3.0, the latter party to watch the enemy front. Lieutenant (Lt) Albert Harold Hill MC with 2 NCOs and 1 man went up sunken road to P.4.b.20.95 where he took up a position, and at 8.55 pm enemy were seen approaching from point at P.4.b.6.2. Two of the enemy party, who were in advance of the remainder, came down on to the road at P.4.b.3.7 and moved towards our party. When within 30 yards the patrol leader opened fire, as it is doubtful if a capture could be made without doing so. When fired on the enemy scrambled up the bank and retired. Patrol leader gave chase and when within 50 yards of one man he was seen to drop. He was called upon to surrender which he immediately did, saying "Very good, Sir". It was seen that he was wounded in the face and thigh, and he was immediately hurried back to the patrol.

Patrol returned with their prisoner at 9.30 pm. Prisoner's name was Schierer, and he was a Lance Corporal belonging to 1st Company 133 RIR, 24th RES Division, and states that he and the others were going to take up their position as Listening Post, and had lost their way. (Under interrogation it was revealed he was intelligent, spoke English well, and had been a waiter in England.)

Friday, 3rd May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, took out a patrol of 14 Other Ranks with a Lewis Gun, from J.34.c.3.8 at 8.30 pm and proceeded to J.34.d.6.0, where patrol and LG were posted in good positions along the road as far as J.34.d.3.0. Nothing however could be seen of the enemy, and patrol returned at 10.20 pm.



Sunday, 5th May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold HILL, MC, took out a patrol of 10 Other Ranks from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.40 pm and proceeded to J.34.d.6.2, thence to J.34.d.5.2 and returned to J.34.d.3.8 at 10 pm. Owing to heavy rain patrolling was very difficult. Patrol reported sound of transport coming from direction of **FLAT IRON WOOD**.

WIA (2nd occ) and remaining at duty, on 5th May 1917

Tuesday, 7th May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, took out a patrol of 11 Other Ranks from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.20 pm and proceeded to J.34.d.7.5 thence to P.4.b.8.9, to P.4.b.1.9 and returned to J.34.d.3.8 at 10.05 pm. Patrol did not see or hear any sign of the enemy, but two limbers were heard on road to north of **FLAT IRON WOOD**.

Wednesday, 8th May 8, 1918, hostile aerial activity was negligible until evening when large formations were over No Man's Land, and also the remainder of **RICHTHOFEN's** circus of triplanes were over. At 7 pm a flight of our Sopwith Camels attacked the triplanes, but fared very badly. Two of our planes came down in flames and one landed out of control 40 yards from the enemy wire in P.4.b and capsized. It was not known how the pilot fared, but after a few minutes he was observed to wriggle himself out from under the debris and immediately got up and make for our lines. The enemy seeing this immediately fired at him and he dropped.

(Apparently an eight plane 80 Sqn formation of Sopwith Camels led by Capt O.C. Bridgman was engaged by a large enemy formation, including Triplanes, of Jasta 6 & 11. As witnessed by 31st men they fared poorly. Lt A W Rowdon was killed in action in Camel B2463, Lt T S Nash in B9243 returned damaged by gunfire, 2Lt A V Jones in D6457 was wounded and made PoW, 2Lt G A Whately in D6419 was killed in action, Lt C G S Shields in D6619 was killed in action, Capt O C Bridgman in D6481 claimed a Pfalz D.III and a Fokker Dr.I and returned, and Lt H V Barker in D6591 was shot down and crashed only to be rescued by Lieut Hill and Pte Boughton)

Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, and No.2277 Pte Harry Boughton then went out a distance of 500 yards from one of our posts at **BOUZENCOURT** bridge in good light with a stretcher, and picked the pilot up and put him on the stretcher, bringing him back to our lines. He had not been hit, nor was he wounded in the crash. He was Lieut H.V. Barker and belonged to the 80th Squadron RAF. He was then brought back to Battalion Headquarters in the boat, and there given some whisky and rested for a while. He was badly shaken and the only injury was a very bad head, for when he crashed, he was pitched forward on to his guns. He certainly had a lucky escape. It appears that three of the enemy triplanes attacked him and absolutely smashed his engine, and he was compelled to land without flying speed.

On 10 May, Hill observed a British plane brought down close to the German lines and called for a volunteer to help carry a stretcher to retrieve the pilot. Hill and Private Harry Boughton then walked 500 yards across open ground under fire in broad daylight and succeeded in rescuing the pilot and bringing him back to safety. For their actions, Hill received a bar to his Military Cross and Boughton was awarded the Military Medal.

They rescued Lieut H. Barker, R.A.F. from No Mans Land on evening of the 10th May.

Awarded **Bar to MC** for actions: *'For conspicuous gallantry and bravery in the field. Near BOUZENCOURT on the 10th May 1918, a single seater aeroplane (British) crashed out of control at about 7.10 p.m. in full daylight inside the German night outpost line. Believing the pilot might still be alive, though wounded and although the Germans were heavily machine-gunning the plane and out trenches at the time, he called for a volunteer to assist him to carry a stretcher; selecting one of the volunteers, he left our trenches and with the greatest coolness walked across the 600 yards of "No Man's Land" to the aeroplane, in the face of the enemy's fire. Finding the pilot dazed, though unwounded, they assisted him from his plane, which had overturned, placed him on a stretcher and carried him back to our lines. By his gallant disregard of his own life he saved the pilot from almost certain capture, and set a splendid example to his men.'*

(Capt Aland, 'A' Company, reported on 31st May, that he has salvaged the Vickers Guns from Lieut Barker's 'plane and that the engine is in a fairly good condition, and with the necessary tools and appliances could be brought back.)

Friday, 10th May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, and Lieut George William Jennings, MC, took out a patrol of 14 Other Ranks with a LG, at 8.30 pm and took up positions along north side of road from J.34.d.5.2 to J.34.d.2.0 with the object of watching for enemy approaching British plane which had fallen in P.4.b. Patrol was relieved at intervals during the night, and fire was kept up from LG on the plane. Patrol returned at dawn.

Saturday, 11th May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold HILL, MC, and Lieut George William JENNINGS, MC, took out a patrol of 10 Other Ranks from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.10 pm and proceeded to J.34.d.7.5, thence to J.34.d.3.2 and returned to J.34.d.3.8 at 11 pm. During this period patrol kept watch in fallen British plane in P.4.b. This patrol also went out again and acted as covering party to LTM who were firing at plane.

Monday, 13th May, 1918, Lieut Albert Harold Hill, MC, took out a patrol of 10 Other Ranks from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.30 pm and proceeded to P.4.b.9.9, thence to J.34.d.7.3, to J.34.d.2.0 and returned to J.34.d.3.8 at 10.05 pm. Transport was heard in rear of enemy line and flares were fired from P.4.b in direction of plane.

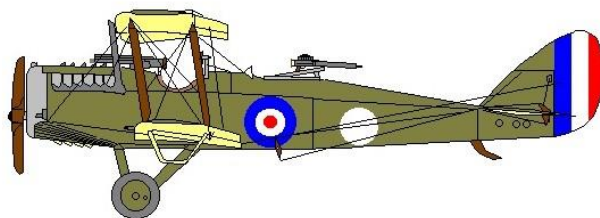
Wednesday, 15th May, 1918, at 11.55 a.m. one of our 'planes was attacked by two hostile 'planes and was shot down. 'Plane crashed down at J.34.d.3.1 minus one wing and with its engine going. Both pilot and observer (Lieuts Mond and Martyn) were killed. At 12.30 p.m. two enemy 'planes were engaged by five British 'planes – one hostile 'plane escaped and the other was driven down in flames and crashed in P.11. Lieut HILL, MC, took out a patrol of 11 OR from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.15 p.m. and proceeded to J.34.d.0.0, to J.34.d.3.3, to J.34.d.0.6 and returned at 10.10 p.m. reporting no sign of the enemy patrols or activity. 'Plane which crashed was found to be smashed to pieces.

On 15th May 1918, a DH4, Serial No A7645, of 57 Sqn, RAF Bomber, flown by Capt Francis Mond & Lt Edgar Martyn, had bombed German Ammunition Dumps at Bapaume and was subsequently shot down by a German plane.

It crashed in No Mans Land just south of the Somme River in front of the 31st Battalion lines. The RAF DH4 had been downed by Leutnant Johann Janzen of Jasta 6. The aerial fight and crash, was witnessed by Lt Bert Hill and he ventured out under enemy fire and extricated and identified the bodies and arranged for them to be transported back to Battalion HQ and also arranged for their personal effects to be returned to the next of kin. (Mr Emile & Mrs Angela Mond)



Friday, 17th May 1918, Lieut Hill, MC, took out a patrol of 6 OR from J.34.d.3.8 at 8.30 p.m. and searched J.34.d. Patrol report that enemy M.Gs were firing from P.4.central. Patrol returned at 10.15 p.m.

Sunday, 19th May 1918, Lt Hill, MC, took out a patrol of 9 OR from J.34.b.1.0 at 8.40 p.m. and searched J.34.d and in vicinity of P.4.b.5.5. Patrol returned at 10.30 p.m. having seen two of the enemy moving about at P.4.b.6.2.

The Battalion was relieved in the front line, Corbie Sector, on 2nd Jun 1918, having done a tour of 53 days continuously without relief. A tour of this length is believed to be a record for the British troops in France. Bert was looking forward to leave.

To UK on leave on 24th Jun 1918

Lt Col Neil Freeman, DSO, had written to Capt Mond's parents explaining how Bert Hill had risked his life in recovering the two bodies of the downed airmen from No Man's Land. He wrote: *"Death had been, of course, instantaneous. I think that your son was probably killed in the air. Both bodies have been sent to the rear, where they will be buried in a military cemetery."*

Emile Mond responded with a letter of appreciation to Bert stating *"If anything can alleviate our grief it is to know that our dear boy lies now buried within our lines – and this we owe to you,"*

Now on leave, Bert visited the Mond family. It was only a short visit as he became ill.

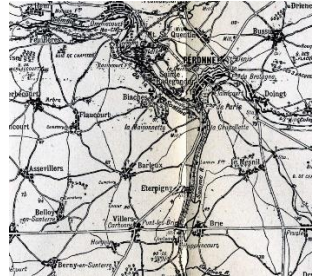
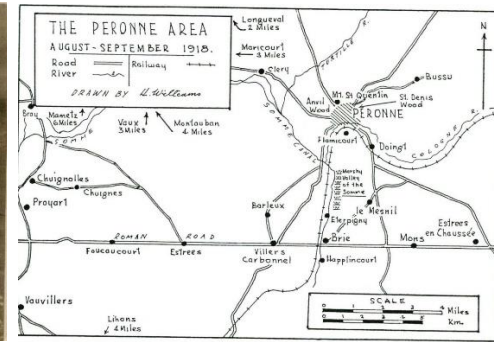

Bert was still on his way back to France as the Battalion prepared for the oncoming operations. On 7th Aug 1918, in Villers Bretonneux, one of 19 tanks, tasked in support of the Battalion, caught fire and subsequently 16 of the 19 tanks were lost along with considerable loss of S.A.A. and TM ammunition.

The operation commenced on schedule on the 8th Aug 1918, the Battle of Amiens, with the 31st Battalion one of the assaulting battalions starting from the 'Albury Line'. At the outset, 'A' Coy suffered casualties with Lieuts P. Strachan, J.H Shaw, J.M. Nelson being wounded, along with the problems of operating in a thick fog. Needless they achieved their objective of the 'Red Line' and pushed on to the final day's objective of the 'Blue Line' where a train gun, 'The Amiens Gun' was secured by 'A' Coy, and then with Capt G.H. Wilson, MC, ('C' Coy), at the Harbonnieres Station. This important war trophy was awarded to the 31st Battalion, and the barrel remains on display at the AWM.



Bert rejoined the Battalion on 9th August and rejoined 'A' Coy as it rested at Aubigny after three days of strenuous operations. Then on 23rd August, Lt Col N.M. Freeman, DSO, left to go on English leave, with Major R.A/Geddes, MC assuming command, and Lieut A.H. Hill, MC gathered all sports men of the battalion to a camp near the Somme River.



A Brigade conference on 25th August advised of an upcoming attack with an unlimited objective, but the accepted objective was the river Somme in the vicinity of Villers Carbonnel and Brie. The battalion and 8th Brigade were in the advance eastward along the old Roman road, with the Canadians on the right flank and the 15th Australian Brigade on the left flank routing the retiring Germans. At dawn on 29th August, 'A' Company crossed the ridge, to the west, outside Villers Carbonnel and proceeded down the slope towards the Somme. At this time there was continual MG fire and sniping from the eastern bank of the river and moving targets were engaged by two enemy 77mm guns. Believe Bert was leading I Platoon, 'A' Coy, when wounded to the chest, in this area. Other casualties occurred "we were advancing on to the river Somme, about fifty yds from the bank under one of the heaviest barrages we've had to face. Pte Dan Davis, MM, stretcher-bearer and Pte 240 Patrick Kelly were killed by a shell and five wounded. Dan was buried on the banks of the Somme between Villers Carbonnel and Brie." **Pte 2896A Joe Devonshire, MM.** (was Dan's SB mate). Pte William John Gartner, another stretcher-bearer with 'A' Coy possibly tended Bert, and was awarded MM **"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Near VILLERS CARBONNEL on 29/8/18 during the advance to the SOMME, Pte Gartner displayed exceptional courage in attending the wounded in the open under heavy artillery and machine gun fire. Throughout the operations he passed over open country swept by heavy machine gun fire searching for wounded. He set a splendid example to his comrades of high courage and devotion to duty."**

Another possibility of attending Bert was Pte 802 Alfred Henry Ayre, MM & Bar who was awarded a Second Bar for **"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty near VILLERS CARBONNEL on 29th August 1918. Pte AYRE went forward into the open under intense MG and artillery fire to assist a wounded comrade. Several others had previously made the attempt but failed. He reached the wounded man, dressed his wounds and brought him back. Enemy fire was intense the whole time and artillery were firing over open sights. Next day he again went out to assist wounded comrades and made two trips across the SOMME and brought back wounded in the face of concentrated artillery and MG fire. He exhibited coolness and courage seldom seen and showed an utter disregard for his own personal safety."**

Other received awards for other actions in this operation including Lieut John Michael Nelson who was awarded a MC for **"For gallantry and devotion to duty near Villers Carbonnel on 28th and 29th August 1918, this officer displayed wonderful coolness, initiative and daring in leading his men, inspiring them with confidence and cheerfulness. In the later stages of the advance when open country had to be crossed, he led his platoon with dash in the face of intense field and machine gun fire. In addition, he supervised two other platoons who were without officers."**

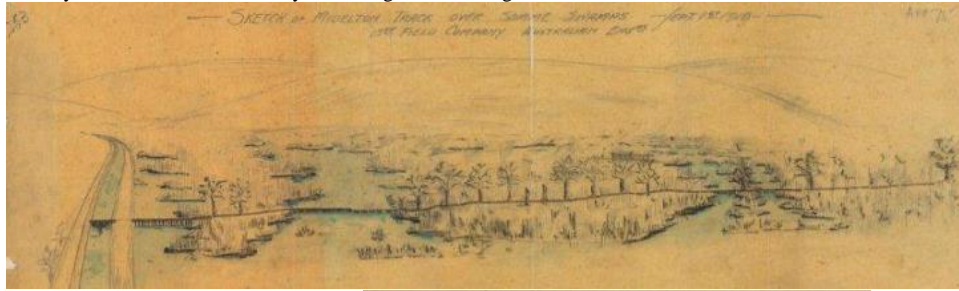
Lieut JM Nelson took over control of his Platoon and his own (II Platoon) in the operation, and 'A' Company then occupied the 'Eglantine Trench' of the old British Lines on the eastern bank of the Somme. At 1130 am, orders were received to establish posts on or near the river, so three platoons of 'A' Coy moved out, and came under direct fire of 77mm enemy guns on the high ground on other side of river, and established the required posts. That evening the Brigadier reconnoitered the situation and it was decided the battalion would hold its position.

On the following day, it was apparent the enemy was not retiring, and was holding the eastern bank of the Somme, and shelling Villers Carbonnel. Lieut Hynes led a Platoon of 'D' Coy across the river and they were under fire continuously from machine guns and snipers since leaving the bridge and as they moved about the outskirts of Brie. Orders were given to withdraw, which they did with difficulty due to the damaged condition of the bridge. 'A' Coy

had also established a post on the eastern side of the river, and was also ordered to withdraw. The battalion was relieved by 2nd Dorset British Infantry on the night of 30th August.

Cobham Hall was the residence of Ivo Bligh 8th Earl of Darnley who had led the English Test Cricket Team in 1882-83 when they played a match at Rupertswood, Victoria. His future wife, Florence Morphy and Lady Janet Clarke were to 'burn the bails' and place in a small urn after this match and present it to Ivo Bligh who had vowed to "regain those ashes" – the ashes of English cricket.

The Ashes

Lord and Lady Florence Darnley maintained the Australian connection, when they offered a wing of their residence as a convalescent home (for 50 Australian Officers at a time) recovering from wounds. The connection with the 31st Bn is as reported below in response to the 1916 Christmas Dinner held here.

“The Argus” Thursday 1 March 1917 *The Countess of Darnley, who was formerly Miss Florence Morphy, of Melbourne, was the recipient of a handsome New Year's gift from a number of Australian officers, whom she and Lord Darnley entertained at Christmas dinner. The present consisted of a silver rose-bowl, engraved with the rising sun, the badge of the Australian Imperial Forces, and inside was an inscription expressing the hope that the perfume of flowers which might grace the bowl in future years would be as fragrant to Lady Darnley as the memory of the sojourn of the donors at Cobham Hall would be to them. Lord and Lady Darnley have given over the state apartments of their residence, Cobham Hall, Gravesend, Kent, to the authorities for a residence for 50 Australian officers, and it was a contingent of these, headed by Lieut-Colonel S. W. G. Annand, 2nd Pioneer Battalion, and Lieutenant Col F. W. Toll, 31st Battalion, who made the presentation.*

Bert was not the only 31st Bn Officer to have stayed here, as he was preceded by Capt Cecil Blomfield, amongst others. Lord and Lady Darnley were also influential in proposing to Prime Minister Billy Hughes to back a England to Australia Air Race, with prizemoney of £10,000, for Australian airmen returning home in 1919.

Bert moved on from Cobham Hall and stayed as a guest of Emile and Angela Mond at Greyfriars, Sussex Downs. Angela and Emile could not obtain any information as to the burial location of their son, and the last definite sighting of their son's body was at "Smith's Farm". Bert, on leave of absence, returned to the Somme and spent a week making enquiries of the missing airmen. Angela was to write, "He searched a large number of cemeteries. He has seen people who remember the occurrence, but no one seems agreed as to who had responsibility for the burial, and no records can be found of any graves under those names,"

It would take much perseverance and determination (another story) before Emile and Angela Mond would finally discover their son's resting place in 1923.

After the Armistice, the Mond's fearing the crash site would be returned to farming use, decided to purchase the 1,900sq m field where 'Caesar', Francis's DH4, remained entangled in weeds. They also erected a memorial overlooking the crash site.

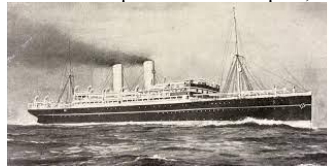


Capt Francis Mon and the Field Memorial

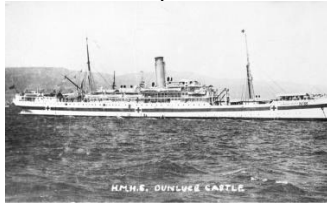

Did invaluable work in reconnaissance and supervision during these operations. On the 15th November, 1916, he assumed the command of the battalion as temporary Lieut.-Colonel for three months. He was next employed near Lesars, and in driving the Germans back through Bapaume to the vaunted Hindenberg Line, and took part in the attack on the Hindenberg Line between Bullecourt and Queant. Into the line on 9th September, 1917, for the offensive on the Menin Road, where he did very strenuous gallant work. Was severely wounded on the 19th September, and died at a casualty clearing station next day. He was buried in a military cemetery between Poperinghe and Abeel. He was awarded the D.S.O. and mentioned in the Commander-in-Chief's despatches.

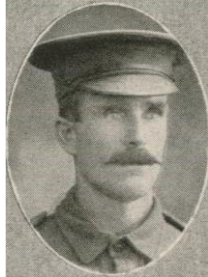
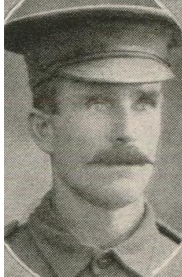

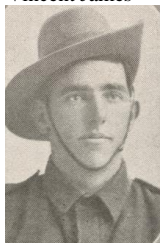

Another of the originals of 'A' Coy is Vincent James Hogan. Both he and Jack Hullah had successive regimental numbers and they would have shared experiences from initial enlistment through to both of them being wounded at Fromelles. But again on 10th April 1918 they were together again in III Platoon 'A' Coy when both wounded by HE shells. This was a dark day for III Platoon; the Battalion had just moved into the Bouzencourt area in the Corbie sector on the night of 9th Apr and the Platoon was looking take shelter in the best places available. 35 men of III Platoon were in a barn/farmhouse when three HE shells landed on the barn and killed outright some 10 men and wounded 20 others, several dying of wounds in following days. The Platoon was all but obliterated and was reinforced over following days and months to the status of the men shown on the plaque. Both Hogan and Hullah recovered from their wounds and rejoined Alexander Gordon and other mates of III Platoon prior to the Battle of Amiens. The service record of Hogan follows:

On 9th April 1918 the Battalion moved through Corbie and thence along the North bank of the Somme to the Pontoon Bridge, where guides led the Companies to various sectors to relieve the 58th Battalion, 15th Brigade. The relief was completed by 2.10am on 10th April, without casualties. The enemy was very quiet during the relief, but his artillery was very active during the day on Vaire to Bouzencourt. At 1.30pm the enemy shelled a farm occupied by the Battalion with 40 rounds of 5.9" and 4.2" shells.

The 34 men of III Platoon, 'A' Coy were taking shelter in the best places we could find, in a barn, trying to get some sleep after the previous night's relief. Three direct hits, by high explosive shells, on the barn, caused 27 casualties.

"The term Western Front is said to have been first used by the Germans to describe the battle being fought against Britain and France. It was a term that would become familiar to my grandfather, Ernest Alfred Holdstock, born 22 May 1897, and just one of 295,000 Australians who served there during World War I.2 The repercussions of his experience would change his life forever.

Ernie was known as Meggsie to his family due to his bright red hair, a nod to the popular comic character of the time, Ginger Meggs. A railway labourer, he enlisted at Casula in New South Wales on 23 November 1915.3 He was assigned to 'B' Company of the 31st Battalion, which consisted primarily of recruits from Queensland. His cousin Adrian Holdstock had enlisted at Raymond Terrace, New South Wales, just three days earlier and was also assigned the 31st Battalion. They left Australia together on the HMAT Anchises which arrived in Suez on 15 April 1916.

The next few months were spent training in the dry desert around the Moascar Camp in Egypt. It has been described as 'miles and umpteen miles, a white city of tents.' The 31st Battalion remained there until June 1916. Adrian Holdstock wrote home to his mother saying that 'we are away from Egypt at last, and I tell you I am not sorry. We had a rough time there with the sand and heat.'8 He continued, 'I left Horace and my cousin Ernie in Egypt, they were to be sent on to France.'9 Ernie spent a further two months at the Tel el Kebir training camp, a 'God-forsaken hell hole of a camp' with 'big windstorms.'

Photographs taken at the time show a vast flat plain with row upon row of tents. Ernie did not leave with his mates as he had developed tonsillitis and diphtheria and was admitted the No 2 Australian Stationary Hospital (ASH).12 He finally left Egypt on 2 August 1916 on the Franconia and spent four months with the 8th Training Battalion in the Codford area near Salisbury Plains, England. This large staging area was used by the Australians for training as they prepared to be sent to France. Arriving in the cooler autumn would have been a welcome respite from the punishing heat and dust of Egypt.

In December 1916, Ernie was one of the ninety-six reinforcements from the SS Golden Eagle who arrived at Trones Wood, France, to rejoin the 31st Battalion. The situation here was vastly different from anything previously experienced and he encountered 'a quivering mass of slime, slush and mud.' As winter descended, the temperature dropped dramatically and snow began to fall.16 The trenches were full of water and it was almost impossible to sleep or get warm. A dull, quiet and freezing Christmas Day was spent in Dernancourt with a 'seven-pound tinned pudding divided between thirty-two men.' Some respite was to be found as warmer weather appeared and some morale boosting events were arranged such as horse shows and sporting contests. But as winter once again arrived, things became grim. The troops of the 31st Battalion spent months inching forward towards the German lines and suffered many casualties and considerable sickness in appalling conditions.

Training intensified in preparation for the anticipated capture of Polygon Wood. On 26 September 1917, the 31st Battalion, including Ernie, began the advance, sinking up to their ankles in the soft slush and mud 'cautiously picking their way around shell holes.' The noise was endless and deafening, with shells exploding all around them, and a very heavy fog shrouded the entire area making it very difficult to see. Patrick Bugden, V. C., said in a letter home to his mother, 'it is virtually impossible to articulate the brutality of a battle such as the battle of Polygon Wood.' As the 31st Battalion withdrew the next morning, the casualty count was devastatingly high with 418 men killed, wounded or missing. Overall, the battle of Polygon Wood was deemed a 'sweeping success' by some as it was felt that almost all objectives had been met. This was despite the fact that over 15,000 casualties were suffered by all the British divisions and just 3.5 square miles were captured.

Ernie was one of the casualties. It is likely he would not have experienced that same feeling of success after receiving a gunshot wound to his left arm. His evacuation was delayed due to the incessant fog and chaos, and it wasn't until the next day that he was transferred to the Princess Christian Hospital in Weymouth, England.

Ernie spent one month in hospital and another month was spent recuperating in Sutton Veny. It is impossible to know if he hoped his war days were over but after the horrendous experiences, he had endured in France it could be imagined that he longed for a sunny Sydney day. A serious wound or a 'blighty' could be claimed as an honourable way to go home. Nevertheless, he arrived in a snow covered Desvres in France on Christmas Day, 1917. This Christmas was a little cheerier than the last with a much more substantial meal provided as well as gifts for the men of a writing tablet each from the YMCA. The new year in Desvres began with a battalion photograph and the remaining time was spent in training and playing sports when the weather was not too extreme.

As their time in Desvres came to an end, the 31st Battalion and Ernie began to move forward, and their next major offensive was in September 1918 on the Hindenburg Line. Throughout September the Australian troops assisted the British in preparation of an attack on Germany's last and strongest defence. At 3 a.m. on 30 September, Ernie's 'B' Company was ordered to move forward to Nauroy. They suffered relentless fire all day, and incredibly, Ernie received a second gunshot wound to his left arm. He was among the numerous casualties evacuated in the drizzling rain and was admitted a week later to the 3rd Southern General Hospital in Oxford, England.

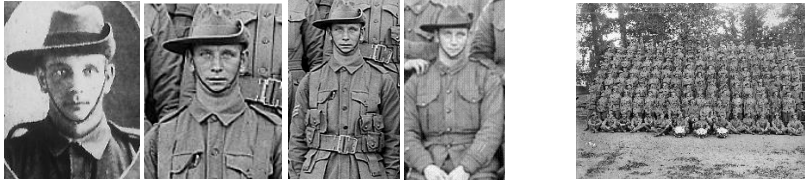
After a period of convalescence Ernie received the almost certainly welcome news that he was to return home. After six weeks of furlough in London, he finally arrived in Sydney on 19 May 1919 and was discharged from service on 19 December 1919. Shrapnel remained in Ernie's arm for the rest of his life, and he suffered greatly from the pain and a lack of movement. He fathered ten children, and they have varying memories of their childhoods with him. Sadly, they all remember that he used alcohol to perhaps dull both the physical and psychological pain that he lived with. He was unsuccessful in gaining a disability pension as his local doctor refused to consider his war experiences as a mitigating factor in his alcoholism.36 After his death, his wife, my grandmother, was also unsuccessful in receiving any benefits and spent many exhausting years working in a laundry to support her family.

War and the Western Front changed life for Ernest Holdstock in ways he could not have foreseen. While we will never know the reasons he enlisted, the price he personally paid was greater than he could ever have predicted."

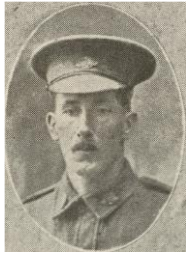

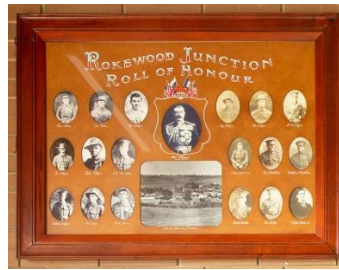

"The deceased soldier was buried with Military Honours. Gun Carriage provided by London Command, Firing Party, comprising members attached to the Administrative Headquarters Staff, AIF, London were in attendance. The "Last Post" was sounded at the graveside. The coffin was draped with the Australian Flag and covered with many floral tributes. Prior to the internment a Service was held in the Chapel at the Cemetery by Chaplain Richard of the AIF. Relatives present at the funeral were Mr & Mrs Hook(father & mother) and several sisters and one brother of 150 Kensal Rd, Paddington, and many friends were present. Temporary Oak Memorial is to be erected by the Commonwealth Military Authorities. The Father of the deceased soldier selected the grave. It was explained to the father that Australian soldiers were buried in a single graves and that the deceased could be exhumed from the common grave by arrangement with the Superintendent and be buried in a single grave. The father decided to leave the deceased in a common grave."

Note: Each soldier must be interred in a single grave and on no account is body to be buried in a common grave, i.e. with other bodies in same grave, unless at express wish of relatives.

Mr Eric Claude Hooker, a member of the Tick Board staff, stationed at Whiporie, a World War I. veteran, collapsed and died in Sydney on Saturday. He left Grafton on the previous Thursday morning by car, accompanied by his wife, and proceeded as far as Wingham, where two of their sons reside. Leaving Mrs Hooker at Wingham, Mr Hooker completed the journey to Sydney by train, with the intention of witnessing the Australia v. England football match on Monday. He booked in at a residential in Pitt Street on Saturday morning, and late on Saturday afternoon he was walking upstairs at the residential, when he collapsed and died. He was a son of the late Mr and Mrs George Hooker, of Brushgrove, where his father conducted a bootmaking business. At the age of 15 he enlisted and fought in France and Palestine in World War I. On his return to Australia, he was employed for some years on Pullen's passenger ferries plying between Grafton and Yamba. He relinquished that calling to undertake his own motor transport service between Grafton and Maclean. Later he was employed as a linesman with the P.M.G. Department, before he went farming in the Mountain View area. He joined the Tick Board staff between eight and nine years ago, and was in charge of the tick gate at Whiporie at the time of his death. Mr. Hooker is survived by his widow, two daughters Mesdames K. Mechan and J. Austen of Banyabba, and two sons Messrs George and Rex Hooker, of Wingham.

A letter to his parents: (6 March 1917) *"Just a few lines to let you know that I am, well. I received a letter from you both, and was very pleased to learn that everything is going well at home, I was lucky enough to meet Davie on the road the other day, and had a couple of hours' chat with him; he was well, hut is beginning to. look old on it. Tho strain, I suppose, is telling. He said Joe is well. I thought I may have been able to see him, but we move out of here in a few days for at least two weeks. but may see him when we go in next time. Ben is in the line somewhere just now. I have written to Joe, telling him to claim him, and I think he will. I may be able to get with him also, it will be nice if we four lads can get together. I do not think Ben will have any trouble to get with Joe and Dave, but I don't think it will be too easy for mc. Matt Draydon and Douglas Lang have joined up with our battalion. Dug Lang is in the same platoon a I am, Matt is in C Company, and they are both well. Jim Lang has joined up with his battalion again; he is all right now. We had a very fair Christmas and New Year. I was out of the line for Christmas, so that was something. Davie, Joe, and Ben put their Christmas in in the line, so I think I fared better than they. (I expect by this time you are not having any sugar, or very little. I have seen the wages the sugar workers are to be paid. It is past a joke! A good many of the lads here are disgusted with the Labor crowd. They have turned us down. We are not getting too many reinforcements, and the way they are going on we are likely to be short, I reckon Billy Hughes was a hero to fight the conscription campaign on his own. He has some backbone, anyhow; if they turn him down, they deserve their fate'.*

FRANCE
25TH NOVEMBER, 1917

I am going to make time to write you a few lines, I think I owe you a letter and after thinking bout if for a considerable time, have decided to put my present situation down on paper at last. Well we are in the line again and it is very quiet compared to the last joint we were in.

Ben and myself are keeping in good health baring a cold which is the fashion in this country, so we can't growl, we are getting very well fed so far. This time last year we were on the Somme and existing on bully beef and biscuits and more cold water than hot tea, and up to our knees in mud and slush. But so far the weather for this time of the year has been very milk and not much rain, which can keep off as long as it likes for my part.

After leaving the Somme area we had a couple of months solid training, dummy stunts, dummy attacks, dummy barrages and a lot more dummy affairs. When we were fit they moves us up to the warm shop, we were told what we were going into, they said our other scraps and bombardments were only a fool to it. We then got the oil that our division were to make an attack on the Polygon Wood, all the officers and Non-Commissioned Officers were shown a model of the ground on which we were to attack; then our Brigade was to be in reserve. Well we fell in at 10 p.m. 25th September, 1917 on the right of all thinking we were going into reserves and were just ready to move off, when the order came for all officers to attend Battalion Head Quarters at once; so we all sat down to wait and wonder what was

doing. In about a half an hours time our Company Officer came back and called all Non-Commissioned Officers this way; we were taken into a hut and the Officer Commanding sat down and said "the 31st attacks at six in the morning" I nearly dropped through the floor. Well we got about two yards of instructions in about five minutes. We had to get extra bombs, ammunitions and a dozen other things and only a few minutes to do it in. I collected my section and gave them the oil, as we all call it, and as much of the instruction as I could remember that we had received. We were loaded up like a Camel Corps and had seven miles to walk to the front line; about three miles further than reserves. Just as we were moving off our old Padre came and said good-bye and the tears were running down his face as he said "God bless and keep you all "A" Company". He was fair broke up; he is a fine old chap, one of the whitest of men. We got a bit further on the road and we were dished out with picks and shovels as every man carries either a pick or shovel when he hops the top and we needed them if ever they were needed. Old Fritz patted us with his heavy stuff when going in, but our luck was in and we had very few casualties. After a weary march we got on the jumping off tapes about half past five and all got into their place. We had a few minutes to wait and then it was ten minutes to go, not a gun of ours was firing but I expect a few thousand gunners were standing by waiting for the word go. Then five minutes to go, three minutes and then one big gun boomed out. It must have been the signal for the Artillery to go, and the whole sky was lit up by a flash right along the line, and then came a roar such as I have never heard before. Then a roar through the air, like the Schotch express with all brakes on and then a crash just in front. It was our signal to go and up we got and followed our barrage; I can tell you it was some barrage, it fairly pulverised everything in front of it. We also had an overhead barrage of machine gun fire by hundreds of machine guns. You wouldn't think a fly could live through it, yet a good many Germans managed to dodge it, but they soon got short shrift. The did not put up much of a fight and our lads were that anxious to push on that it took me all my time to hold my section back from getting mixed up in our own barrage. We were on the extreme right of the Australians, I noticed that there was nobody on our right and I couldn't make it out as there was an English Division to go over with us on our right; I will explain later on what happened. By this time we had almost gained our objective, I sent a man to my platoon officer to report our situation, but I learnt later that he had been killed before he had gone a few yards. Just at this time we were up against one of his series of pill boxes and he wiped a good many of our lads out before we got this place. He fired his machine guns until we were a few yards off and then came at their usual caper. We took a few prisoners here, gained our objective and tried to form a bit of a line. I had lost my section and everybody was mixed up. Unfortunately we had lost all of our officers excepting one and he proved a Briton to the backbone. We were gradually getting settled down but could get no word from the right. We could see him preparing for a counter attack on our right, we were in a bad way for our flank was exposed to a frontal and rear attack. I could have cried when the order came "retire to next ridge". We started to move back and it was his turn to get some of his own back, he laid an enfilading fire on to us and we lost heavily. We got back, formed a line on the ridge and started to dig in and extend our line to the right. Well we stopped his counter stroke and went forward again for there hundred yards and dug in. it was nearly 10 a.m. by this time and I was that done in I could hardly stand. But still we had to dig to save ourselves and nobody knows what they can do until put to it. He came at us again but we knocked him back and then word came through that the Tommies were attacking on our right and were coming up in great style and by twelve o'clock they had connected up with us. We all felt as happy as school kids and it was as good as a feed although I never had one. Up to this time I hadn't tasted a bit since four o'clock on the previous day and I had lost my rations in the fighting, so I had to look on while the others ate their bit of biscuit and bully. I was offered half they had by more than one, but I couldn't take their scran as they needed it as badly as myself. I was that done in that I found a hole and had about two hours sleep, but he came at us again and that was the finish of my sleep. Our Artillery caught him properly this time so we can't have much to do. We stopped seven counter attacks while we were in. We were expecting a big attack next morning and just at daylight I sent back the fourteen men to bring up ammunition and just as we left he opened his barrage and how we got through it is more than I can tell. We found the dump after some trouble and took as much precious stuff as we could carry, at least we thought it precious at the time as the lads were getting short. His barrage was more savage than ever and I can tell you it took all the nerve I could muster to lead those fourteen chaps back through it. We found some tins of water on the way back and picked them up as we were all famishing for water in the front line. Our luck was in, we got through with only one getting hit and worst luck, he was carrying the water, and of course it was finished water as he made a mess of that.

We got back at last and dished out the ammunition, but he didn't come at us, made an attack on both sides. Just about daylight the order came to advance and over we went again and got our original objective at last. We dug in here and had no more attacks on that day, but he shelled us heavily and I thought our number was up more than once. Up to this time I'd had nothing to eat other than a couple of biscuits and a tin of bully beef that I had taken out of a dead man's haver sack. After we had dug in I collected a few remaining men of my section and discovered they were also a few men from other battalions and a tommy who had lost the run of their units. I went back then to look for tucker and was lucky enough to run into a ration party from another battalion and they were putting it into the trench where we had been. I walked up to them and picked up a bag and the sergeant said "who told you could take that!" I said "It's all right cobber your Captain sent me over for it" so he said "right oh", and away I went; could not get back quick enough. I jumped into our bit of dug out trench. The lads were starving, they ripped the bag open, there were four loaves of bread, six tins of bully, two tins of condensed milk and two of jam. Talk about a feed, there were seven of us and we polished the lot off in one go; we then took it in turns and had a bit of sleep through the day. We were relieved that night but not before he tried to push us out again; it happened just about dark but he failed. Owing to some misunderstanding half of our battalion went out to reserve and we were thinking about the lovely hot feed we were going to have, that our cooks had promised us. But also we were greatly disappointed to learn that all the food had been sent up to support and that we had walked right passed it. There was no tucker in reserves and I can tell you we were hungry and tired. We just laid in the trenches anyway and

went to sleep as best we could and had to make the best of a bad job. Next morning some dry bread came to light and as they couldn't find me I missed. Pulled the belt up another five holes, then word came "proceed to supports immediately" and off we went again very much down in the lip, of course it was broad daylight and there was no trenches in that part of the line so we had to run the gauntlet across the open ground; we got there after a hot time and a good many casualties but the main thing was that there was plenty of tucker there. The Quarter Master Sergeant was there and he handed us out a roast rabbit each, a loaf of bread and I soon put the bunny out of sight. The quarter master told us that had we stopped there we would have had it hot. I assured him that I hadn't walked out there to come back and run the Gauntlet in daylight for a joke. I learnt that the shortage of rations was caused through Fritz blowing them up twice and that a third lot was dumped in the wrong place. Oh well we have got over it and still the war goes on, so this is only a small item on the programme. The reason why we had to attack at such short notice was on account of the Tommies on our right having had such a rough time that day. They had all their leaders killed or put out of action and were too weak to go over, so one of our battalions had to go and support them and we had to take that battalions place in the front line. The division that carried out the attack wasn't able to get on the tapes in time. But all's well that ends well and our boys are a long way past Polygon now. I could give you another seventeen pages on this, but the Censor would simply cut it out, so it would only be waste of time. I hope he doesn't go mad and make a mess of this.

P.S. Our old Padre met us as we came out and gave us all cigarettes and chocolates and had cheery word for us all. I notice that Bean, War Correspondent, gave the Victorians all the praise; he never thinks that Queenslanders deserve any praise for their work. I have seen too much of his one sided reports.

(The Padre was Chaplain Captain Malcolmson, Lieut Rose was the Platoon Officer who was KIA, sniped in the early stages.)

The remaining officer was Lieut R Thompson who was awarded MC.

As General Tivey stated: *'Met the men of the Brigade, who were on their way to rest at Malakoff Farm. I have never seen troops so worn and weary as these gallant men, who were the survivors of the 8th Brigade. Some of them could hardly walk and their pale drawn faces showed the strain of three days and nights of incessant fighting.'*

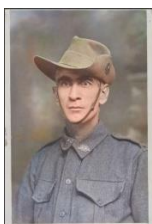

On 25th May 1918 (from **War Diary**) *"At 3.15 a.m. a raiding party consisting of Lieut Thompson, MC, and Lieut Jennings, MC, and 42 OR attempted to raid enemy trench in P.5.a.3.3. Party was divided into two parties of 1 NCO and 10 men with Lewis Gun as covering parties, and Assault party consisted of Lieut Jennings, MC, and 20 OR. Covering parties were posted in J.34.d.4.0 and J.34.d.9.0. Lieut Thompson, MC, O/C Raid, was established at latter point with telephones and Pte Mildare, the latter to act as interrupter. The Assault party moved out and started wire cutting about 1.30 a.m. the two Bangalore Torpedoes being taken out by two sappers A.E. for use if necessary. Three belts of wire had been cut and party were on fourth when they were heard and M.G. fire and bombs were directed at them. The party sustained casualties – 3 killed and 7 wounded – and as the element of surprise had gone, it was impossible to carry on with the raid. Party withdrew to our lines with all the wounded and bodies of two men. The body of the third man had to be left in enemy wire. An attempt was made to recover it, but it was impossible as it was within bombing range."*

Killed in raiding party at Bouzencourt with Sgt A T Baker, # 4976 informing

KIA on 25th May 1918,

Buried at Hamelet, Sht 62D, O.6.D.4.5 by Bn Padre, Capt Malcolmson

"I remember that Howard was killed in an early morning raid on 25th May, on the left of Hamel (4 kilos from Corbie). He was struck in the chest by a 'stick bomb'. He lived only a short time, dying on the stretcher."

Cpl 3643A Alexander Thompson, IV Platoon, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"I was out on the raiding party with Pte J T Howard at Bouzencourt on the 25th May 1918 when he was killed by machine gun bullet, and we brought his body back to the line."

Pte 1061 George Serong, IV Platoon,

'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"I knew casualty.... He was in front line on the banks of the Somme at Vaire. He went out on a raid on the enemy's strong post and was wounded by a machine gun bullet while out there. He was carried out by the Battalion stretcher bearers and I believe he died on the way out. I was in the same raid as him and saw him soon after he was hit. I do not know where he is buried."

Pte E Draisey

"I knew him well. He lived at Bundaberg, Queensland, and used to work in a hardware store. He was about 27, tall. He came with the 12th Reinforcements to the 31st Battn. On the 25th May we were at Bouzencourt holding the line. In the early morning, Howard was one of a raiding party. He was killed, I think by a bomb. I saw his body brought in....."

Pte 4610 George Totten, I Platoon, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"I knew casualty He was in front line at Vaire. He was known as 'Jack' aged 28 years. He went out on the road on the enemy lines and he was killed whilst taking machine gun post. Casualty was hit by machine gun bullets which entered his body and legs. He was carried out and buried at Hamelet. I was present at his burial and he was buried by Padre Malcolmson from Cootamundra. A cross was erected with his name number and unit on it."

Pte 776 Charles Edward Young

"Howard was in a raid at Bouzencourt near Hamel on the Somme front, and was killed in the enemy's front line, bombed through the neck, on the night 25th May. Death was instantaneous. I saw the corpse on the following night when it was brought in. We buried him in a churchyard cemetery at Hamelet near Corbie."

Lieut A H Hill

"He was of 'A' Coy, 1st Platoon. At Bouzencourt on 25th May, he was in a night raid, and was killed outright by a shell. Hit all over, was hardly recognisable. I know nothing of the burial. His body was taken by boat down the Somme Canal. Christian name 'Jack' and he came from Queensland."

Pte 1966 B J Alfred, I Platoon, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"He was in 'A' Coy. Refer to Pte McGuire, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn, who is now in France, for he was in the same raid at Bouzencourt and there saw him killed....."

"I knew him, he was in 'A' Coy, and was formerly the Battn Canteen Cpl. His first name was Jack"

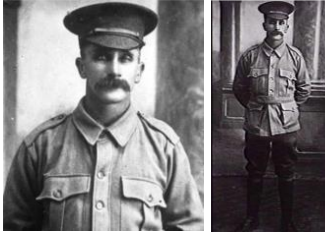
John Hullah is the first of the Platoon Privates listed on the plaque. He was an original 'A' Company member and was probably regarded as one of the more experienced men. He was WIA at Fromelles and then again in April 1918, and recently returned from hospital just prior to the Battle of Amiens. He showed his experience on the 8th Aug 1918 (awarded MM) and served with the Platoon throughout the Battalions actions up to the cessation of hostilities. At this stage he was hospitalised with influenza which developed into broncho-pneumonia. Fortunately, he recovered and was returned to Australia, though his death in 1942, aged 47 years, was most likely premature due to his war service. His service record follows:
