Re death of Cpl Archibald Gordon Kilfoyle, on 15th Mar 1917: ***"I knew casualty. He was about 5'9", well built, dark complexion, about 24 years of age, known as 'Archibald Gordon'. Casualty comes from Brunswick. Casualty was in front line trench behind Bapaume. A shell exploded near him, mortally wounding him. He died five minutes later. I was 100 yards away. His chief wounds were in the legs. He was buried just near where he fell. I was an eyewitness. He was well known and liked by all his comrades."***

After Flersbaix in July, Springfield was a Sgt and then he got his commission and was put in 'D' Coy and then he went back to the machine gunners."***

Arresting Officer Const. Pomroy to prove that :-

THOMAS JACKSON was arrested in George Street, Sydney on Feb. 14th 1916 wearing military uniform. That he was behaving in a riotous manner at about 4.00pm on that date. A stone was thrown, and then Const. saw accused throw a stone at Mounted Police who were present trying to disperse the crowd. That a large rioting crowd was there at the time, and that the accused had a bottle of sauce in his pocket. That he was sober and was taking part in the disturbance.

"On Monday the 14th February, I was out on morning parade, which was the first parade before breakfast. I went out to the second parade at about 9.15. I saw the procession come down from Casula. They broke us up and we all went with them. They all said "Join in". I did not see the colored man carrying the flag. I noticed the flag. They called out to join in and we joined in. About 15 minutes afterward we marched around the 13th Battalion and by the Light Horse and then back to the Drill Ground. I stopped there and went to my tent and remained there until 1 o'clock. I had my dinner, washed and came to Sydney on the 1.45 train. I left without leave. Our O.C. was Captain McCulloch and he told us not to be foolish and break away. I arrived in Sydney about 2.43 pm. I did not line up on the platform and did not see anyone lined up there. I walked straight down George Street with a mate of mine by the name of Arthur Ward, I mean Arthur Sanderson. He belongs to the 4th of the 30th Battalion and is in the same line but not the same tent. I have not known him very long. I came to Sydney with him from Liverpool. We went down George Street to King Street and back to George Street. I did not notice the Mounted Police until we came back. There was no Soldiers marching through the streets. I came back to Liverpool Street and saw a disturbance there at the corner of Liverpool and George Streets. We only saw the mob jostling there and the Mounted Police rode in on them. I walked along with my mate and noticed a flag, the Union Jack. I was arrested there by a Civil Policeman and taken to the Central Police Station for riotous behaviour. I was brought before the Court and I pleaded guilty as I had no witness. The Constable stated that I was throwing stones at the Mounted Police and I had to plead guilty as I could do nothing else. I was advised by a Policeman standing alongside who said it would be the best thing to do. My mate was not with me, that is he never noticed me getting arrested as I was behind him walking along when arrested. I do not drink. I had no stones on me. I had a bottle of Worcestershire Sauce which I had brought at a shop in George Street to take to the Camp. I paid 1/- or 1/3 for it, I cannot remember exactly. I saw no windows broken. I could show you the George Street Shop where I brought the shop(sic) but do not know the name. The Police have the sauce and it is a full bottle. I am 23 years of age and was born in Cessnock. I enlisted in Maitland about 9 months ago. Previous to enlisting my occupation was a miner. I am single. I have been crimed once since being in the Military and that was for being absent without leave. I never was before the Court before. I was arrested about 3.30pm. I was going out to Marrackville to the Brothers' Wife's place when I was arrested. I was not afraid on account of having the bottle of sauce in my pocket. A man sold me the sauce and it was a good sized shop. He wrapped it up for me in paper but it was not tied up." - Statement of Arrest. 15th Feb 1916

JAGGER

Thomas Ross



Thomas Ross Jagger was the grandson of Matthew and Mary Jagger who arrived in Encounter Bay, SA in 1839, with their four sons, from Yorkshire. Mathew had worked as a shepherd in Yorkshire and in this new land he applied his farming skills in amassing large tracts of land at Encounter Bay, Waitpinga, Iman and Back Valleys and Torrens Vale. His sons Matthew and Thomas Snr moved to and set up at farming at Pimpinio, near Horsham in Victoria. Mathew and Sara Ann (nee Brooks) Jagger had three sons (Robert Frederick, b1891, Thomas Ross, b about 1892, Angus Brook, b 1900 and Martha, b 1901 & b in infancy 1901).

Thomas probably obtained his early education at Horsham, though was sent to Wesley College in Melbourne, as a boarder, where he excelled academically and achieved Dux of Wesley College in 1908. An article in the 'Hamilton Times' January, 1909, reports that Thomas Jagger had success at the recent University examinations by passing the Senior Public Examinations. (In the same article Frank and Robert Menzies, of Jeparit, were also mentioned for their academic successes).

Thomas then studied medicine and surgery at Ormond House and was awarded Degrees in Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery by the Melbourne University on 13th December 1915. The Chancellor, Sir John Madden, congratulated those graduates who intended going to the front Thomas Ross Jagger enlisted in the Australian Army Medical Corps on 16th December 1915, though was not granted his commission until 14th March 1916 when he commenced service as Captain in Camp, AMC, at Maribyrnong Camp.

Extract from Capt Keith McKeddie DOIG, MC, Dairy,
(who served the same time period as Thomas Jagger, until 7th Apr 1917, as RMO 60th Bn, 5th Div)

17/10/16 Got orders from Southall to leave in the morning.

18/10/16 Left Victoria Station and arrived at Folkestone about 9.30am. Went around the town a little. Boat left 3.00pm accompanied by Destroyers to Boulogne – arrived 4.30pm. Reported to DDMS. Left there by train to Abbeville which was reached by 1.00am. Rain, mud, slush and for a time, lost. Slept in YMCA room.

19/10/16 Left Abbeville at 8.30pm and reached Romescamps at 6.00am this morning. Distance about 60 miles but trains were in endless procession and we had numerous stops. The night was bitterly cold but we managed to sleep fairly well. This morning wandered about a mile for café au lait and bread. Very pretty about here but not hilly. Adencourt was the name of the village and when we got breakfast, told that we'll get a train tomorrow.

20/10/16 Spent the whole day in Romescamps living in the carriages, only going out to buy something to eat. Very cold. Nothing but endless procession of trains going up to the Somme. Our destination is Albert. Hughes, Jagger and myself in compartment. Picture the three of us sitting each in a corner of the carriage, 3 candles on the window ledge beside us, eating sardines out of a tin with a match. Clothes not off for 50 hours. Feeling very dirty and what is more, I am dirty.

21/10/16 Spent the day in Romescamps. Managed to get a bucket of water from a passing engine, enjoyed a wash and shave. Slept well last night on valise. Lived most of the day on ten tinned sardines and

gingernuts. Very cold. Pools frozen. Left Romescamps at 5.30pm – destination unknown. **Hughes, Jagger** and myself still together in the same compartment.

22/10/16 Arrived Albert 9am this morning. Heard guns firing when a long way off. Reported to Bellevue Farm but Aust Headquarters had moved out. Met **Colonel Hardy** and reported to 15th F.A. near Fricourt. Sent on to report to 8th F.A. Right round quarrel, batteries of heavy guns. Got clothes off but could not sleep owing to the row of guns. No water to wash in. No shaving. A conception of the traffic is impossible. Saw Mametz Wood and passed through Bazentin-le-Grand. The Madonna and Child on top of the Church at Albert is leaning right over and about to fall but has been secured. The French say that when it does, peace will be declared. I hope it falls soon. Albert is in ruins.

23/10/16 Can't get any letter away yet. Saw **Eric Woods**, and **George Elliott** and **Bill Nance**. Bombardment intense. Going after Bapaume when we must be prepared for casualties. To be on duty from 2am this morning. Poor wounded are freezing with cold and take several hours to come from the lines. This war is awful and how I would love to see my own people just for a few minutes. May this bloody business soon cease.

24/10/16 Just the same bombardment. Few cases came into Thistle Dump (ADS) today. Got orders to go to Green Dump and to go out with bearers up the lines tomorrow.

25/10/16 Went up to the trenches by way of "crest trench" and Turtle Lane to Flers support. In between batteries of 16 pounders which kicked up an awful din all night. Fritz put shell all around the dug-outs, but beyond mud on my dug-out roof, nothing happened. Mud indescribable.

26/10/16 Put in the most miserable night I've ever had. **Bill Nance** and I shared a dug-out. Could not stand up, mud on the floor, no blankets, wet thro' and thro' and tried to sleep sitting up. Impossible! Infantry men passing had lost their way. **Capt Cosgrove** of 31st (M.O.) [actually 53rd Bn RMO] dropped in – he had lost his way. Got back to Green Dump at 11am taking 3 hours to do 1½ miles. It was a terrible walk. Got into bed and slept. Thank God! **Ike Maudsley** **Eric Woods** and **Bill Nance** in this dug-out with me at Green Dump which is comfortable. Go up to the front tomorrow at 4pm for 48 hours.

27/10/16 Left tonight for McCormack post. The walk was terrible and I was absolutely dead to the world when I arrived there. Dug-out draughty, blanket wet and I was like ice the whole night. Proposed stunt occurs on 29th but the weather is terrible and the roads wet and slippy and muddy. The bearers are quite done up and it takes them 7-8 hours to carry patient 2 miles. How I do pray that this war is soon over. Germans sending over the shells. Scottish and 29th (English) divisions are here with 5th Aust Division. Many aeroplane fights.

"**For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He carried on his work under heavy fire during two attacks and attended to the wounded of his own and other units with utter disregard of danger. He set a splendid example of courage and self-sacrifice.**"

Born in 1897 at Healesville, Victoria, to parents Hubert and Alice Johnson, Ralph Johnson was educated at Camberwell Grammar School before leaving and gaining employment as a clerk. During this period he served four years with the Senior Cadets, attaining the rank of sergeant.

Ralph enlisted in July 1915 at the age of 18, joining 'C' Company, 31st Battalion, with whom he embarked for Egypt in November 1915.

After further training in Egypt, Ralph set sail with the battalion from Alexandria, bound for Marseilles and the Western Front. Like many of the men from the 5th Division, Fromelles was to be their first and, sadly in many cases, their only action on the Western Front.

Similarly to Scott, Johnson's individual role in the actual battle has not been documented and the circumstances of his death are unknown. However his files tell the story of the subsequent confusion and misinterpretation surrounding the investigation into his burial.



Never listed as being 'missing', even though his remains hadn't been located, Johnson was recorded at the outset as having been killed in action on 21st July 1916. Oddly, this date falls on the day after the battle and yet is still his official date of death according to both the Australian Roll of Honour and CWGC.

On a German death list received by the Allies and dated 4th November 1916, Johnson is noted to have died on 19th July 1916, which differs completely from the official date recorded. The fact of the matter is that Johnson was one of a large number of 31st Battalion men who were incorrectly listed as having been killed on 21st July and whose names do not appear on the VC Corner Memorial but elsewhere instead. There has not been any verified reason discovered for this oversight but we can guess that it represents the soonest date after the battle that the battalion was able to check the roll and all those unaccounted for were nominally appointed that date.

To support this further, the Germans sent Johnson's identity disk back to his relatives in 1917, and at the conclusion of the war, death vouchers were located in the Imperial Prussian War Office also indicating he had fallen in the neighbourhood of Fromelles on 19th July 1916.

But what happened next is inexplicable.

A letter written from Base Records to the Prime Minister's Department in 1922 clearly indicates that there had been some prior discussions dating back to 1920 regarding the final resting place of Ralph Johnson. The content of these initial discussions are unknown but it can be gleaned that a belief had been formed that Johnson had died as a prisoner of war on 21st July and subsequently buried at Beaucamps Communal Cemetery German Extension [above]. This is at odds with all recorded German documentation and does not gel with other cases of this nature. We are able to refer to a number of confirmed cases of Australians who *did* die as prisoners of war shortly after the battle, and in all their files the specific date and location of their burial in a German cemetery was accurately recorded. Then why not Johnson's?

But further to this, the letter claims that the IWGC were able to locate the German soldier, Johann Fischer, who apparently buried Johnson and indicated the exact place of his burial at Beaucamps. Even if we were to ignore the implausibility of a young German soldier on a burial detail in the middle of the Great War recalling accurately the name of Lance Corporal Ralph Johnson six years later, when a search of the plot indicated was conducted, no remains were found at all. In fact, a later memorandum to the Prime Minister's Department dated in 1924 further clarifies this:

I have now to inform you that a further communication has been received from the Imperial War Graves Commission stating that all British bodies have now been exhumed from Beaucamps Communal Cemetery German Extension and reburied at Pont du Hem Military Cemetery, La Gorgue, and that during the work of exhumation nothing was found which could be connected to the burial of Pte. Johnson.

As a result of this, it was decided that a 'special memorial' be erected at Pont du Hem Military Cemetery to indicate the suspected circumstances of his burial. The text of this memorial was decided upon and his parents notified of the outcome:

To the memory of this Australian soldier who died as a Prisoner of War and is believed to have been buried at the time in Beaucamps Communal Cemetery German Extension, but whose grave is now lost. Their glory shall not be blotted out.

What is interesting to note is that although still being recorded as a special memorial, Johnson's headstone no longer bears this inscription – if it ever did.

It is our contention, supported by German documentation of the time, that 1046 Lance Corporal Ralph Johnson did not die as a prisoner of war on 21st July 1916 and was never buried at Beaucamps Communal Cemetery German Extension to begin with. All the available evidence points to the fact that he is very likely to have been one of the 250 Australian and British soldiers buried in the mass graves at Pheasant Wood, Fromelles.
