One of the men in the barn at the time that 3 shells burst amongst them (see Stubbin entry) caused 30 casualties out of 35 in our platoon. One cross bearing 11 names was erected, of the others - Tom Lynn, Stubbin, Ruskett, Prime, Ross. He was wounded by a shell while asleep in a barn in front line at Vaire, near Corbie, near a canal bank, not far from

We were in a barn at Bouzancourt, near Hamel when a shell burst on a barn in which Stubbin and 34 of us were sleeping. He and several others were killed outright, and a few died of wounds, while 14 of us were wounded and in hospital. I saw him buried with 9 or 10 others near the barn. We erected a cross giving all the details. Pte RH Noble, # 3604.

This shell killed or wounded <mark>27 other ranks</mark>. Lt H Miller, 'A' Coy, in charge of burial party that interred this man and 9 others at the left rear corner of the Farmhouse at Bouzancourt, (map ref I.34d) A cross erected over each body, Bn padre Malcolmson buried them. Only arrived the night before, so taking shelter in best places we could find. (Red Cross file) Pte John Andersen, 718A 'A' Coy, III Platoon, wounded.



A 28cm German railway gun, captured intact with its train, by the Australian troops of the 8th Infantry Brigade in their advance, with 162A Private Benjamin McAleer, B Company, 31st Battalion, standing near the barrel.

When it was captured, someone from the 31st Battalion attached to the gun a small description label, about four inches long. (These labels were supplied by the Australian War Records Section for attachment to trophies and relics. This action was equalled only by the man who, in an excess of zeal, attached a few of the same labels to German prisoners!)

The northern-bound express train, which passed through Mooloolah at 10.40 a.m. 18<sup>th</sup> Nov 1930, near Gympie, knocked down a railway worker, Benjamin McAleer, 50, on the bridge that spans the Mooloolah River. The driver of the locomotive (W. Gillespie) said that he saw the man, but was not able to affect a stoppage. The man was pinned between the cowcatcher and the rails, and the train had to be backed in order to secure his release. He was suffering from face and scalp wounds, and contusions on the body and limbs, also probable Internal Injuries and shock. He was semi-conscious when taken by train to Nambour for admission to the General Hospital there.

"At about 6am on 26th Sep 1917 the 31st and 59th Battalions, attacked the enemy positions on Zonnebeke Ridge, near Passchendaele. The Menin Road was our right flank. To reach our objective we had to advance about 500 yards. Our losses in the advance were not great. We reached our sector of the ridge and found that we had no support on either right or left. There would be about 50 of us all told, but the majority of these were shot down by enemy snipers and machine guns, shortly after reaching the summit of the ridge. The

Trench Mortar men had one gun, but no live shells beyond smoke shells. We had been instructed to pick up live ammunition in the front line, but we found none there. We advanced about 50 yards over the ridge – what was left of us, about 23 – until the enemy machine guns properly held us up. We took cover in shell-holes and sustained rifle fire as long as we could. The enemy machine guns kept us down under cover. The enemy fire came from both flanks and from the rear. Eventually a party of enemy infantry, under cover of their machine gun barrage, advanced on our left. We were a divided party in separate shell-holes. The enemy called on us to surrender and we did so. We had no alternative. In another shell-hole on our left was Lieut Castles of the 29th Battalion.

We saw him surrender before we were called upon to surrender. Lieut Hill of the LTMB, badly wounded – one eye having been knocked out – was in a hole nearby. A party of 18 of us were marched to Courtrai via Roulers, being searched at the latter place. We got to Dulmen on 11<sup>th</sup> Nov 1917, having up till then being locked up in a disused factory at Dendermonde. After a month at Dulmen, we were sent to Dyrotz, some 30 kilometers from Berlin.

Some of us were sent out 'on commando', others were put to building an aerodrome at Dyrotz. On the signing of the Armistice, all commandos were call in to Dyrotz. Thence we were sent to Stettin via Altdamm. We left Stettin for Copenhagen by the SS 'Queen Maude' on 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec 1918. After eight days in camp at Lillereg near Copenhagen, we crossed to Leith in the SS 'Ajex'. We arrived at Leith on 16<sup>th</sup> Dec 1918. It was not until the end of February 1918 – five months after our capture, that we received out Red Cross parcels. Pte E Fisher when captured, had a bullet wound in the left leg." Informant states they both belonged to 'A' Company. On 27th Sep 1917, the Battalion was in action at Polygon Wood, which they captured. About 3pm after they had passed the German front line, McCool and three others rushed a Pillbox and were not seen again. Informant saw them rush the Pillbox which they reached and entered. The Battalion went on, but informant, who was a Runner, had to go back. He left the Battalion three days later and heard no more regarding McCool.

Informant states that McCool was a great mate of his and was well liked by the other boys."

Pte W J Duggan, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"...came from Paddington or Surrey Hills. Thought to have been a cabmanor connected with horses in civil life.

Informant states that they were both belonged to 'A' Company, 4<sup>th</sup> Platoon. On 26<sup>th</sup> Sep 1917 the Battalion was in action at Polygon Wood. They hopped over early in the morning and about ½ hour later before they reached the objective, the informant saw McCool – he said he to two or three of the boys round him – including informant, "I am going in for my out". After that the party advanced and McCool soon after disappeared and nobody seems to have seen him subsequently. He was reported "Missing" for a long time. The date of death officially given as 27<sup>th</sup> Sep is wrong as on that date the Battalion was consolidating after the big fight which took place on the 26<sup>th</sup> and during which McCool was missed.

Informant states the McCool was a mate of his and was well thought of by his other mates."

This soldier should be treated as under arrest awaiting trial on a charge of breaking into a civilian house at Argoeuvres on 6/6/18

"An Enquiry found that McCormack & two other 31st men (Pte 2882A Alfred Bracken and Pte ....) had been on a drinking spree in a village called Argoeuvres, near Amiens, trashed an estaminet & forced entry to a house, where McCormack was wounded by an occupant with a shotgun, succumbing to his wounds after two days"

Died of injuries accidently received. Not on duty and was to blame.

"Billeted in abandoned St Victor Hospital near Amiens, McCormack went on leave and consumed quite a bit of drink at café Vin Beire, Argoeuvres, and started arguing with another Australian soldier (may have been

American!). They went to a farmhouse nearby and started throwing stones at it. Entered the farmhouse of Mr Domont and during altercation McCormack was shot in self defence. Died of wound to abdomen."

He died at a Field Dressing Station about two miles back from Bellicourt. I understand that he died the next day but the date in the book might be right. He is buried there near the D/S."

Peter McGuire a young returned soldier, who raided the dressing-rooms of the Theatre Royal, after the show on Saturday week, and gave as his reason that he was looking for a wife, was brought before Mr A Dean, P.M., in the City Police Court yesterday.

Sub-Inspector Brosnan said that apparently, there was no occasion for medical observation of McGuire

Mr Dean discharged accused and told him that if he went wandering about on strange premises, with such an excuse as the one he gave, he might find himself in serious trouble.

Magisterial Inquiry into the circumstances of this man's death was held at Brisbane on 11<sup>th</sup> July 1919. Many old friends and relatives from Carney's Creek and Croftby attended the funeral of the late Archibald Alfred John McKay, at Boonah, on January 15. The late Mr. McKay was a member of a pioneer family at the Upper Teviot. He had been in ill-health for years as a result of the war, in which he saw much service in France with the 31st Battalion. For some time before his death, he lived with his mother on the Upper Teviot; but had to go into Rosemount Military Hospital at the end of last year. He was brought back to Boonah only a short time before he passed away. Born in the district he was educated at the Carney's Creek School and the Southport High School. After the war he followed farming till his health broke down, Mr. McKay was one of five brothers who fought in the war. The eldest, Donald, was killed in France; Alexander George and Thomas Aubrey were two of the first men to join from Boonah, and were in the original 15th Battalion on Gallipoli. These, with a younger brother, Mr. Thomas Hardcastle McKay, who also served in France, are now living in the district. Two other brothers are Mr. Murray McKay, (Proston, Manager of the Commercial Bank of Australasia) and Mr. Malcolm J. McKay, (Proserpine). One sister, Mrs. Percy Abell lives at Dugandan.

The Chronicle of 24 Sep 1915: Obi Obi - Wed 8 September a number of Obi Obi and Mapleton and other folk assembled at the Obi Obi Hall for the purpose of farewelling Mr Jack McKinnon, eldest son of Mrs and Mrs A McKinnon. The young man is now in camp getting fit to pot Turks. Having a good door, good music, good singing and willing dancers everyone appeared to have a good time. Mr McKinnon was presented with a wristlet watch, and expressed the hope that on his return from Europe he would not only be wearing a watch but also the V.C.

John McKinnon never fulfilled that wish for he was killed in action July 20 1916 and was buried at Eaton Hall Cemetery, 2 ¼ miles East of Laventie, 4 miles south south west of Armentieres, the Rev. F.C. Ward officiating. For the next two years John's mother wrote to the army requesting the return of his possessions which would have included the watch presented by the local community. Finally in September 1918 Mrs McKinnon was informed that it was unlikely any effects would now be found due to the length of time since John's death.

The Chronicle 16 August 1918 p4, MAPLETON. Presentations and Returned Soldiers. The Mapleton Hall on last Wednesday, the 7th instant, was the scene of a very pleasant function, when a Welcome Home was tendered and presentations made to the Mapleton returned soldiers. The recipients were Lieut. G. A. Still M.C., (31st Bn) Lieut.J.R. Allbrey, Messrs. Harry Chinn, F.D. Lound, C.H. Williams, E.K. Harvey, Don Cogill, (2890A, 31st Bn), W. Jorgensen, A.D.C. Hetherington. Framed certificates were also handed to the relatives of the late J. McKinnon, J.J. Logan, and R. Logan, who have made the supreme sacrifice, and (to use Lieut. Still's words) 'have gone West'. The presentations were made by the Association's president, Mr. W.J. Smith, whose remarks were supplemented by Mr. J.R. Morris. Both speakers referred to the gallantry of the Australian troops, and incidentally stated how distinction had been brought to Mapleton by the award of the Military Cross to Lieut. Still and military medals to Frank Pope and Robert Swinton...more... The address presented to the soldiers reads: -Mapleton Progress Association, The

Great War, 1914 - 19 To...... Dear Sir, On behalf of the Mapleton Progress Association we desire to express to you our high appreciation of the services you have rendered to your King and Country, in this, the greatest War in history. The grand sacrifices, and noble heroic deeds performed by our soldiers have carved for Australia a niche in the Temple of Fame, which will endure as long as time lasts a glorious chapter in the Empire's story. We admire and honour the splendid spirit of patriotism in which you responded to your Country's call, and the high sense of duty which led you to voluntarily take up arms in the defence of Liberty, Truth, and Justice. With best wishes for your future, and in deep sense of gratitude for your services. We have the honour to be, dear Sir, your obedient servants, for the Mapleton Progress Association, W.J. Absenting himself without leave in that he at Longbridge Deverill at about 1.15 pm on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1918, absented himself without leave from the Overseas Training Brigade until apprehended at Warwick Square, London at 6.00 pm on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April 1918 by Lieutenant C.M. Williams, APC Pleading: Not Guilty

The court found the accused <u>Guilty</u> of the 1<sup>st</sup> Charge with the exception that his failure to return to duty was on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1918, and <u>Guilty</u> of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Charge with the exception that at the termination of his absence without leave, he surrendered himself and was not apprehended, And by a sentence signed on the 3<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1918, sentenced him to be dismissed from His Majesty's Service.

On submission dated 16<sup>th</sup> May 1918, His Majesty the King has now been pleased to confirm the finding and sentence of the Court and to command that the sentence be carried into effect and I am to request that the necessary action may be taken accordingly and that it be reported to this Department as early as possible on what date the sentence is communicated to the accused.

Date of arrest 4<sup>th</sup> Apr 1918. Period under charge 51 days. Total Forfeiture 53 days pay. Signed - B.B. Cubitt, The General Officer, Commanding in Chief, Southern Command, Salisbury.

Letter from Mrs Betty McLennan: -

Gold Creek Road, North Arm N.C. Line, Queensland August 26<sup>th</sup>, 1919

#### Dear Sir,

Several matters have transpired since my husband Captain H E McLennan, late of 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion and myself have returned to Australia from overseas which have left us in a quandary: wherefore I have decided to write to you for elucidation.

My husband was dismissed from the service in England under somewhat peculiar circumstances with which I will not bother you and when we arrived in Brisbane after taking the longer route through Canada, the Military authorities had no idea that anything had happened and so far as they knew Captain McLennan should have been in France.

Ever since we have been here the Military Authorities have given my husband his full title and rank, excepting on one occasion when in answer to his giving a detailed description of everything and asking for his Returned Soldiers Badge, a Major Murray addressed him as Mr. (I have had some idea that that badge is given for "Service Rendered" and that therefore he is fully entitled to same).

On July 26<sup>th</sup> this year (1919) i.e. over twelve months after his dismissal, his Military Cross was presented to him at a Parade of Troops, by His Excellency the Governor-General and this is in itself most peculiar you will admit

I have since seen Major Eckersley, one of the officers of the 31st Battalion, who was a member of the Court at the Court Marshall and who says that though he kept on the 'qui vive' for the promulgation of the sentence, he never saw it gazetted. I myself have carefully studied the Australian Gazette, but can find no trace of any such promulgation.

The men of my husband's late Company (B Company) have so I have lately learned from one of them presented a petition for my husband's pardon. Of course, I do not know whether anything has happened re this matter but as it seems that there are a number of pardons and quasi-pardons being granted, methought that it might have been so.

You will be able to see from all this fore-going matter that I am somewhat worried about it all and as you are in a position to know, I am writing to you for help. Perhaps you will be kind enough to give me the references to: The promulgation of his dismissal.

Anything re the matter that may have come out since.

The reference of the section and the title of the Act under which Returned Soldiers badges are awarded. If you will do this for me I shall ever be deeply indebted to you and can only hope to tender my sincere thanks.

I have to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 26<sup>th</sup> August, relative to your husband, Ex-Captain H.E. McLennan, MC, 31<sup>st</sup> Battalion, and to inform you notification of his dismissal from Australian Imperial Force, appeared in Commonwealth of Australia Gazette145 of 1918.

Reference to the issue of returned soldier's badges will be found in Standing Orders (AIF) para 24 on page 10. Presentations of Military Decorations to troops are usually made some time after their return to Australia, for the reason that the Medals are not available for them. The fact that your husband was dismissed from the

Australian Imperial Force would not affect his award unless it was specified at the time of his trial that the decoration was to be forfeited.

Sadly, he died on 29<sup>th</sup> August 1919 of war related effects and was buried with military honours at the Nanango Cemetery.

Having suffered a shell wound at Polygon Wood he spent time recovering in England before rejoining III Platoon, 'A' Coy in May 1918 and was with them through 8th August, Vauvillers, Villers Carbonnel actions until absenting himself on 27th Sep 1918. Following FGCM for this absence he was back with the 31st Bn in December 1918 before transferring to the 3rd Aust Motor Transport Coy and returning to Australia in July 1919. Enlisted at Brisbane, 10th November, 1916 (age 18 years), and entered Enoggera training camp for six weeks, attached to the 9th Reinforcements of the 4th Pioneers, and left for Sydney by train early in January, 1917. Went straight through from train to the transport S.S. "Argyllshire," and left next day for England. Arrived there early in April, and went to Salisbury Plain. Was later drafted into 31st Batt. with orders for France. Was sent up the line to Messines, and later invalided from there to Etaples, and Caynex for convalescence. He went to the Base at Le Havre and up the line again to Rouen, and on to Corbie (Villiers Brettoneaux), and on to West of Hamel, taking part in various raids. Returned from this sector for spell in June, 1918. Again went into the lines at Albert, and West of Morlancourt.



After training in Australia, Moran embarked for overseas service on 14 March 1916 as a member of the 31st Battalion 5th reinforcements. Travelling via Egypt he arrived in France on 30 June 1916 in time to take part in the Battle of Fromelles on 19 July, in which more than half the battalion's members became casualties. Moran transferred to 8th Machine Gun Company (8 MG Coy) on 22 August 1916. He saw little active service with this unit until June 1917 as he was hospitalised a number of times with a septic hand, trench feet so bad he had to be evacuated to hospital in England, and then bronchitis. In March 1918 8 MG Coy was renamed 5 Machine Gun Battalion when it became organised on a Divisional (5 Division) rather than a Brigade level. A detachment from the battalion, including Moran, was sent to counter attack in front of the village of Villers Bretonneux in France in April 1918 and were subject to German poison gas attack on 17 April. Moran was immediately evacuated to 41(British) Casualty Clearing Station, where he remained for 10 days in an effort to stabilise his condition so that he could be evacuated to England. He arrived at 1st South

General Hospital in Birmingham on 28 April but died less than 48 hours later, from pneumonia caused by the gas attack. He is buried at the Lodge Hill Cemetery, Birmingham.

I have been informed of a discussion involving Cecil Morgan (#2055) killed at Fromelles 19th July 1916.

I am the uncle of Cecil Morgan. His real name was Colin Meyers. Born on 3rd August, 1899 at Goulbourn. We

have his birth certificate. He first attempted to join the army on 14th October 1915 but, according to army documents, was found to be medically unfit though his family always said he was found and brought back. In the army documents he stated his age as 19 and had parental consent, both untrue. He then rejoined on 23rd November 1915 but this time changing his name to Cecil Morgan and age 21. He sailed from Australia on 1st April 1916 and landed at Marseilles on 23rd June 1916.

He was killed on 19th or 20th July 1916 at age 16, just two weeks short of his 17th birthday.

Three generations of my family attended the dedication of the Fromelles cemetery this year on 19th July. (2010)

No sooner had he left the dugout, when a shell burst about a yard away from him, so he came over and said "Is that you Mortenson" - I said "Yes Sir" and he said "They nearly got me that time, and we will soon have you out of this", so with that, another Officer (Lt Corcoran), late Lieut Springfield and three Privates got hold of me, and just as they were going to pull, a German shell came through the other Officer's legs and burst right in the centre of the six of us. The next thing I could find, all of them were about five yards from me in all directions, and Lieut Springfield was saying "put it out". He was on fire, and he then rolled over and put it out. I am still in the mud so cannot do anything, so I said "Is that you Mr Springfield". He said "Yes" cry out for 'Jack', that's our Sgt. He came over and he told the Sgt to go for 'Mick', that was our other officer, he came and went for the Doctor. The Doctor was in attendance very quickly, and said he was badly wounded, and I have never seen anybody so happy as Lieut Springfield, who was so near death, he was carried away straight away, and died on the way out, and was buried, and his grave is still kept in good order. The last words I heard him speak were of his mother, he said he was in no pain. He was loved and respected by his men, and was known to one and all to be brave and fearless, as a lion, and none were more sorry to hear of the death of Lieut Springfield than the LG Section. 
