Buried near where he was killed. We dug 5 graves and buried them there – O'Donohue, Ben McFarlane, Felix Hamilton all 16 Pltn and Gard is 14 or 15 Pltn. I knew him very well. It was night time when we buried them, so I can't say I buried Gard, but he is buried there."*

Hamilton, 4072 *"Killed at Villers Carbonnel on Aug 29th. Went into action on 28th and when he fell he was on No 1 machine gun team and next to informants No 2. When advancing at 1pm and 10 yards off the final objective a shell landed killing him and two others instantaneously – the two others being Ptes McFarlane and O'Donohue. The position at Villers Carbonnel was on top of the ridge in amongst huts and apparently an old hospital or CCS. Here they were buried on the spot previously used as a cemetery – each with a small identification cross. Informant is almost sure that the Battalion later erected a substantial cross. Hamilton was 5'9" in height, had dark hair and was known as 'Felix'. Enlisted in Queensland but resided in Melbourne. Came away with the 10th Reinforcements to 31st Bn about Oct 1916. Met him when he arrived in England and in France knew him for a year being in the same Platoon and Coy – 'D'. One of the men in the barn at the time that 3 shells burst amongst them (see Stubbin entry) caused 30 casualties out of 35 in our platoon. One cross bearing 11 names was erected, of the others – Tom Lynn, Stubbin, Ruskett, Prime, Ross. He was wounded by a shell while asleep in a barn in front line at Vaire, near Corbie, near a canal bank, not far from Villers Bretonneux.

We were in a barn at Bouzancourt, near Hamel when a shell burst on a barn in which Stubbin and 34 of us were sleeping. He and several others were killed outright, and a few died of wounds, while 14 of us were wounded and in hospital. I saw him buried with 9 or 10 others near the barn. We erected a cross giving all the details. Pte RH Noble, # 3604. This shell killed or wounded 27 other ranks. Lt H Miller, 'A' Coy, in charge of burial party that interred this man and 9 others at the left rear corner of the Farmhouse at Bouzancourt, (map ref I.34d) A cross erected over each body, Bn padre Malcolmson buried them. Only arrived the night before, so taking shelter in best places we could find. (Red Cross file) Pte John Andersen, 718A 'A' Coy, III Platoon, wounded.

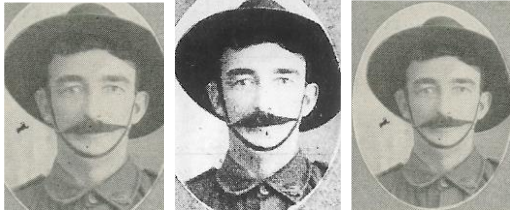

In a letter from Sgt McLelland, 29th Bn, to Reg’s father: **“You were asking about a Sgt O’Sullivan in our Company. Well, he was here up till a few days ago. He is attached to another Battalion now, but in the same Brigade. He has got his Commission, and my word, he deserves it. He has also received a DCM for bravery. A short time ago we made a charge, and held the trenches for about nine hours when the Germans counter attacked, and we had to retire. An officer and Sergt O’Sullivan were there till the last, and then brought a machine-gun back to our front line, and turned it on the Germans. The Sergeant wasn’t satisfied with that, but he goes out and brings in three wounded men. He is indeed a brave man, and well deserves his DCM.”**
