

Henry Walter Case was with the Battalion from December 1916 and as such served throughout the extreme winter conditions of 1916/17 at Flers. As such it appears he was a long serving loyal squad member. And with his name positioning on the **plaque**, it is possible he was an assistant to Dan Davis as a stretcher-bearer. Unfortunately, we don't have a picture of him. He rejoined the platoon after a bout of influenza just prior to the Battle of Amiens. He served with the platoon throughout all the actions of the Battalion until they were withdrawn from the firing line. After hostilities ceased, he received a social disease whilst on leave to the UK, prior to his return to Australia. Unfortunately, he was one of the many to succumb to his war service in 1928 at a young age of 37 years

"He was killed at Polygon Wood on the 26th Sep, during the advance. We had just hopped over when he got it, shot through the head. I was 10 yards away and we stayed in that position in shell holes etc for quite 5 minutes, and he never moved again. It was clean through the head, instantaneous, I am sure. We went on with the advance and I do not know what happened to his body. The burial parties would surely find it. He was a mate of mine and came from Sandford, outside Brisbane. He had a habit of quiet closing his eyes when he laughed. He was quite young, about 22, and a rare good mate. He was in 'C' Coy, 11th Platoon." Pte 3772 H L Bennett, XI Platoon, 'C' Coy, 31st Bn

"Pte FH Cash was with me in the 31st Bn. On the morning of 27th Sep 1917, my battalion attacked at Polygon Wood. When we reached our final objective I saw Pte Cash, who was standing about 30 yards away from me. At the same time a shell approx. a 5.9 HE appeared to land on the spot where he was standing. After which there was absolutely no trace of him. It appeared Pte Cash had been blown to pieces."

"I saw him shot by a sniper in the head, death instant at Polygon Wood. We had gone too far and had to go back and leave the dead. I never heard of him being buried by our men, and I don't think he was. We came over from Queensland together in the "Schunchung' a China boat and left 19th Sep 1916. I missed the boat at Durban, he went to France beginning of Jan. I did not get there till March. He was a peculiar looking fellow, funny eyes, something of a Chinaman. He came over with the 9th Rfts. He was away for a time with trench feet and only joined up a few days before the stunt." Pte 3828 H A E Hanley, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn

"On 26th Sep 1917, I was near Pte 3784 F M Cash at Polygon Wood during the advance that day. At about 3 o'clock, he was killed by a sniper. I do not know what became of his body or identifications." Pte 3828 H A E Hanley, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn

"I knew Cash very well, we were mates. He was short, nuggetty, dark, about 25 years of age, and was a professional boxer, single. He came from Sandford, Old. Pte Robinson, "Snowy" of the 31st Bn, either 'C' or 'D' Coy, can give full information."

When I left the Red Cross, I enlisted as Pte E McNamara and left a letter and my money to you through Kate, Mrs W Jordan, Charlotte St, Adelaide, and this time I have enlisted as Andrew Gay, of the Burra and Kate as my next of kin and she can get you, my money. I shall be over there soon for a day or two and then I shall be off across the blue sea again. I shall write every week to Kate and she can write to me but she must address my letters as Pte Andrew Gay, Fraser's Hill, YMCA. One can hardly explain things in this letter, but I'll tell all when I come home and then you will understand, one gets hardened to things that he cares for nothing at all, but you must excuse me for not writing before, but I was afraid of being found out and after all they would not have touched me but there was a chance as I thought of getting into trouble and I kept quiet. I promise if anything had of happened

to me you should have known about it, but it never and so I am going to France this time as a Machine Gunner, and I can tell you its no treat to be behind a gun firing 500 shots a minute, but I'd rather be there than in front of it I am was in a scrap of it in the Egyptian Desert, there are all the Light Horse there now and all the AIF are in the West, and I hope to be there soon. I am getting a few days leave before I go so I'll come see you. How I long to see you all again, but it won't be long. Remember me to the boys and all. How's Flo Reid and the Jordan family. Write soon as I am longing to hear from you all and now I draw the line and I'll write again shortly and you can drop me a line. Now good-night and God Bless you. I remain your loving son, Eddie."







The grand sacrifices, and noble heroic deeds performed by our soldiers have carved for Australia a niche in the Temple of Fame, which will endure as long as time lasts a glorious chapter in the Empire's story. We admire and honour the splendid spirit of patriotism in which you responded to your Country's call, and the high sense of duty which led you to voluntarily take up arms in the defence of Liberty, Truth, and Justice. 

Two of the children tried to pull him out but were unsuccessful, and then they ran up to the Station and told the other men, and they ran down to the waterhole and found M Comollatt lying in the water, they could see life had left the body, as it would be any time up to ½ half an hour from the time he fell into the waterhole until they got him out as the waterhole is a ½ mile from the Station. And the man had never seemed the same since he came back from the front as he often complained to me about his heart and chest, as he used to say he believed the cold weather on the other side played up with him." "Pte Conyers belonged to 'C' Coy, 12th Platoon, and was of my Lewis Gun team. We were attacking and he was crawling over open ground, when he was hit through the back by a bullet from a machine gun and died straight away. This happened in front of Harbonnieres. His body was taken back to Battn HQ for burial, but I cannot say anything (from personal knowledge) of the actual burying.

I cannot understand why this enquiry is being made now, because I wrote to his people directly, we came out of the line and told them all about their son's death. Conyers lived in Sydney. I knew Conyers well, and there can be no doubt about his identity. We belonged to the same reinforcements and left Australia together." Cpl Edmund Francis Mortenson (a very intelligent fellow), 3062, 12th Platoon, 'C' Coy, 31st Bn, AIF

"He was in my Company, 'C' Coy, and as far as I can remember came over with the 3^{rd} or 4^{th} reinforcements. He was one of my best mates. He was killed in August at the beginning of our offensive. We started from in front of Villers Bretonneux and we got 9 or 10 miles, as far as the old 1916 line when he was hit, somewhere in the thigh as well as I remember. He died a few minutes after the bullet hit him and went black in the face. I helped carry him out and placed him beside several others who had been killed but I can't tell you exactly where he is buried, though no doubt it will have been with the others somewhere near the 1916 line." Pte Frank Couacaud, 1128, 'C' Coy, 31^{st} Bn, AIF

"He was killed by a shell at Framerville, and I buried him near there, along with some others."

Pte James Ronald Blackburn, 819, HQ 31st Bn AIF "Conyers was hit by a bullet wound over the heart. I saw him immediately after he was killed and was one of

the stretcher-bearers who carried him to Battalion headquarters. I don't know where he was knied and was one of happened at Morecourt in the afternoon on 9th Aug 1918. His nick name was "Dug Haig". Pte Frank Conacand, 1128, 'C' Coy, 31st Bn AIF

"Conyers was killed at Harbonnieres, 9th August by a sniper. I saw him killed. He was about 4 yards away. Shot through the chest. The ground was held. Nicknamed 'Sir Duglas Haig' Pte Thomas Burkett, 2877, 31st Bn AIF



Trained as a MG Artificer in Sept 1916 and was probably a qualified Lewis Gunner. Would have been on the 'Franks Force' raid on the "Chicken Run" German trenches, Houplines in Oct 1916. He suffered the winter of 1916 and was with the Battalion at Polygon Wood. Again after hospitalization he rejoined III Platoon 'A' Coy in time for the Battle of Amiens and served with them at Villers Carbonnel and throughout until the Battalion was withdrawn after Bellicourt/Nauroy. In March 1919, he was with the 5th Division Boxing Troupe prior to his return to Australia.

The 8th Field Ambulance Stretcher Bearers then took him from us and he is said to have died between Gueudecourt and Flers. Major Alcorn of the 14th Field Ambulance knows most about it, he handled him to begin with when I was present. He said afterwards to me "Fancy Lieut C dying". Major Alcorn was a particular friend of Lieut Corcoran and would be able to give details of death and burial. Capt Wood of 8th Field Ambulance would attend to him at the next post from Factory Corner and might also give details." Sgt 1690 W H Eggington, with 8th Fld Amb attached to 31st Bn

"He, with Lt Springfield, senior MG Officer, were returning from HQ, and went to the assistance of a machine gun that was bogged in the mud. While assisting, a shell burst over them and seriously wounded

them both. They were taken to Field Ambulance nearby, and it came through to battalion orders, that Lt Corcoran died of wounds since." Cpl 2314 FR Fleming, IX Platoon, 'C' Coy, 31st Bn

"He was badly wounded and was bleeding from the back when I saw him carried out of the trenches at Flers, the latter end of October. We were in that place from 22nd Oct to 4th Nov 1916. A shell had blown him up. He was taken away to the dressing station. We heard later he had died in hospital – I do not know which one." Pte 2991 F T Moon, 'A' Coy, 31st Bn

"Pte G H Randall and Pte Hanlon and many others told me that he was at the mouth of a sap outside Flers village. He came in contact with a ration party and a shell came and shattered both his legs. He was taken to 8^{th} Field Ambulance and he died before he got there and was buried at the 8^{th} Field Ambulance dressing station. He had a decent burial and was put alongside several others." Pte 5097 G Wilson, 31^{st} Bn

"Informant knew Lieut Corcoran with whom he came from Australia. He was in charge of a ration party when the Battalion was at Flers and a shell struck and wounded him, killing another of the party (Pte Steele). He was carried down to the dressing station by Cpl F R Fleming and Pte R A Murray, both of 'C' Coy, and they would be able to give further details. Informant heard he died there, a few days later." "I saw him killed. He was shot through the head by a bullet, early in the morning, just as we hopped over at Polygon Wood. I could not say if he was buried. By a curious coincidence Lieut. Dellit has just come back to the base after being away five weeks. He tells me that he was with your brother, in fact standing "right alongside ' of him, up in the front line, when he was hit by a machine gun bullet. He dropped at once, saying, "Oh dear!" This was about 2 o'clock in the afternoon." "Lieut. Dellit arranged to have him taken to the dressing station, which was about 300 yards away. The bombardment, Lieut. Dellit says, was the worst he had ever been in. He says that Cpl Wilkinson was a splendid fellow in the line and always full of courage and grit and ready to help all and sundry. He repeated some of the above remarks and added, "By Jove", Corrie, "Wilkinson was a good chap and no mistake." My own batman, a very fine fellow by the name of Hardaker, helped to carry him along the trench. No stretcher was available, so they had to use one of the rubber ground sheets. Hardaker says it took them three hours to carry him 300 yards. You see, he was a big heavy man, and the unfortunate stretcher bearers at each step sank knee deep in the awful mud. All the time Fritz landed shells first on one parapet and then on the other, and yet not one of them was hit though all were splashed with mud from them. Poor old Hardaker told me the cold was intense. (When volunteers were called to help your brother, he, Hardaker, was one of a party of four in a

(When volunteers were called to help your brother, he, Hardaker, was one of a party of four in a trench who volunteered; When only a few yards on the way, a shell came over and killed the three chaps he had just left. Was it not strange that he should have just got clear?)"

Pte Will Taylor said "Corporal Wilkinson volunteered to lead a fighting patrol beyond Till trench. While on the way he was wounded in the head by a bullet which went through his steel helmet and made a nasty skull wound. It took some time to get him down to the dressing station. He was then carried on by Ptes. Hardaker, Hanlan, Sandilands and Patterson, under very heavy shell fire." Hearing that he was wounded Will Taylor went down to see him, but was too late as he had moved on. I let the men of his section and platoon know of his death on the 10th April: From their quiet set faces and from what some of them said to me afterwards I had dismissed them on parade, you may feel the very greatest pride for him, as he was greatly admired and respected by all. Besides the good opinion that the N.C.O.'s and men have of him, he is likewise held in high esteem by the officers. Yesterday Major Eckersley came in to see me (Taylor) and sat and yarned for nearly an hour. During the course of conversation your brother's name (Cpl Sydney Wilkinson) came up. The Major wished me to convoy his very sincere sympathy to you and yours in your great loss and to say that he knew Corporal Wilkinson from the time he first joined. During the whole of that time, he had never been the slightest trouble and was always an exemplary soldier. In short, the Major said, 'He was all that a soldier should be.'"

On 19 August 1918, at Rosieres in France, Coughlan, with 5881 Sergeant John Leslie Harrison, placed themselves at great risk over a period of 90 minutes during an extensive enemy bombardment to successfully repair severed communication lines, an action for which both men were recommended for the Military Medal.

Awarded MM for actions: "On the 19th August the Headquarters of this Bde (6th Army Bde. A.F.A.) was situated at ROSIERES. At about 4pm there was considerable shell fire on the front areas and it was thought that a hostile attack was impending. A considerable concentration of fire from 4.2 guns with instantaneous fuzes was placed in front of the Headquarters and on the route through which all communication from the Headquarters and on the infantry all lines being out. Sgt HARRISON called for a volunteer to assist him in repairing the lines and Sapper COUGHLAN immediately joined him and these 2 men proceeded at the immediate risk of their lives and with great bravery and determination into the shelled area where they continue to work for a considerable period exposed to the hostile fire endeavouring to keep the communication intact and repairing breaks in the various lines as they occurred in so doing, they exposed themselves regardless of risks and with the greatest courage enabling communication to be obtained from time to time with the infantry and with various Units of the artillery and finally succeeded after 1 ½ hours work in restoring the whole of the communications.

Their efforts were of vital importance to the Group and productive of the best results and the bravery and determination displayed was of the highest character. Both men have both been previously brought to notice during the last week for their excellent work under most trying conditions."



Sgt Osborne Allan Fergus, #126, 'A' Coy, reported he saw the burial of Lt Cox. "A chum of mine, A.E. Adams, who was in my company, was in charge of the burial party."

Pte Smith, J D, #2170, 'D' Coy, same Platoon (XVI Platoon) as Lieut Cox, states "that on 19th July 1916 in the trenches in front of Fleury Baix, called the Fromelles trenches, Lt Cox was wounded in a bombardment, a shell nearly blowing his shoulder away. Smith said he was dead when he saw him, but his wound was dressed with a big pad of wool. Smith helped bury him the next day between the trenches and Fleury Baix. A cross was put up over the grave with name, Regt etc on it. The identity disc, whistle and wrist watch with a few other things(pay book, wallet, 18 photos, diary, etc), were given to the Chaplain, Captain George Cranston."



Awarded Albert Medal in Gold for actions: "On night of 15th May 1918, in order to test some Mills grenades, Sgt Coyne threw one of them, but it failed to clear the parapet and fell into the trench in which there were a number of other men. Sgt Coyne shouted to them to run for their live, endeavoured to find the bomb in order to throw it away, but owing to the darkness he was unable to lay his hand on it in time and, the men not being clear of the trench, he deliberately threw himself on the top of it and let it explode under him, receiving fatal injuries, but saving the lives of his comrades."

The Albert Medal in Gold, is the Belgian equivalent to the Victoria Cross, and as prestigious. Later nominations are now awarded the George Medal (non-combat actions).

Letter to Mr David Coyne, Capt R C Aland, OC 'D' Coy, 31st Bn, written on 15th May 1918: "Dear Sir, you will probably have received word by the time this reaches you that your son Dave was severely wounded on the 14^{th} of this month. He himself will probably have cabled you saying he's getting on all right. As his Company Commander, I am writing to tell you that he gained his wounds by one of the biggest acts of self-sacrifice I've ever heard of, and that I'm proud to be able to say he belonged to my company. By a miracle he lives, but when he performed this act, it was with the full intention of giving his life to save his comrades. He will probably have told you some time ago that he was a qualified bombing instructor. Last night as he had doubts as to whether a certain box of Mills grenades were in working order, owing to water having got into the box. He decided to throw one to test them. In the fire bay at the same time were seven other men. As he threw the bomb it hit the top of the parapet and rolled back in to the trench. It is possible to follow the working of his mind at the same time and the rest he told me. A Mills grenade explodes five seconds after it is ignited. By the time the bomb reached the bottom of the trench one second had gone. The night was pitch black and your son spent another two and a half seconds in a vain attempt to find the bomb and throw it out again. With one and a half seconds to go, he decided that it had been his mistake so he would take the full consequences, instead of allowing others to be wounded or killed. With a 'here goes' he flung himself flat in the bottom of the trench over the approximate position of the bomb, so that when it exploded his body should act as a damper to stop fragments from flying and injuring the others. He was quite prepared to give his life for them. The bomb exploded and not one of the other men received even the slightest injury. Dave, however, was badly wounded in the face, neck, chest, right arm and right leg. He must have had at least 20 wounds and I should judge that the pieces all remained in him. He brightened up wonderfully when they brought him to my headquarters to dress him. He had a rum, smoked a cigarette, and joked about the event all through the proceedings, although he must have been enduring perfect agony. A man who can do this is lion-hearted. The medical officer stated that he would live all right, so that set our minds at ease. We got a report this morning from the casualty clearing station to the effect that he had died; but happily, this was contradicted by a later one, which stated he was progressing favourably. So probably you will be getting letters from him telling you of the good times he is having in 'Blighty'. I have sent in a strong recommendation to the CO for his brave action, so don't be surprised if you hear he has gained the Victoria Cross. He certainly deserves it. You have every reason to be proud of him. He is one of the best liked NCOs in the company, always cheerful, always willing, no matter how trying the state of affairs. If there is any mor information I can give you at any time, I will be only too glad to give it."

Letter to Mr David Coyne, 28th May 1918 from **Sister Band**: "Dear Sir, I am sorry to tell you of the bad news of the death of Sgt 3347 D Coyne, 31st Bn, AIF. He was admitted here on 15th May and died the same day. Everything possible was done for him, but recovery was impossible. He was not to speak or leave any message. With deep sympathy. Sister Band."

EVIDENCE into wounding of Sgt 3347 David Emmet COYNE, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn Lieut Henry Estwick Ford, 31st Bn, states:

"I am the Platoon Commander of No 14 Platoon, Sgt Coyne being my platoon sergeant. He holds certificates as a fully qualified bombing instructor, he has been ordered by me to periodically inspect the bomb supplies to ensure they are in good order. At the time the accident occurred, I was at Company Headquarters, so am unable to state how it happened."

L/Cpl 801a William Edward Martin, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon. About 11.30pm on the night of 14th May 1918, I heard Sgt Coyne say he was going to test one of the bombs that were in the trench. I also heard him say to some of the men **"make sure there's nobody out in front."** From my dugout, I saw him put one foot on the firestep and swing his arm back to throw the bomb. I cannot say whether he struck his hand on the parados of the trench or whether his foot slipped. I next heard him cry out **"Get out of the trench. There's a live bomb in it."** I heard the explosion and immediately afterwards I heard Pte O'Sullivan ask **"Is anyone hurt?"** Sgt Coyne replied, **"Yes Sully, I got the whole issue. I lay on it thinking you chaps couldn't get out in time."**

Pte 2496 R J Sullivan, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon. About 11.45pm on the night of 14th May 1918, I saw Sgt Coyne come into our trench and heard him say he was going to test one of the bombs. There were six of us beside Sgt Coyne in the trench at the time, some being in their dugouts/shelters. As it was dark at the time, I couldn't say how the accident happened. I next heard Sgt Coyne say "Get out of the trench. I've dropped the bomb in it." I next heard the explosion and immediately asked "Is anyone hurt?" Sgt Coyne replied, "Yes Sully, I've got the full issue. I laid on the bomb. I didn't think you had time to get out." He then asked me "Is anyone else hit?" I told him" No". He answered "I'm glad of that." I've seen Sgt Coyne in the trench several times inspecting the supply of bombs."

Pte 2126 R H Dann, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon. Before midnight on 14th May 1918, Sgt Coyne came into our trench. About 10 minutes after he came into the trench, I heard him say he was going to test a bomb. I saw him get on the firestep and prepare to throw by bringing his right arm back. He must have either hit his hand on the back of the trench or else slipped, as I saw him fall. I couldn't see him after he fell, as it was dark in the trench itself. I next heard him say "Go for your life boys, I've let the bomb drop." After the

explosion I heard Sullivan sing out "Is anyone hurt?" I heard Sgt Coyne answer "I've got the full share of it." I didn't hear anything else."

Pte 508a S Armstrong, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon. I don't know the exact time, but between 11pm and midnight on the 14th May 1918, I saw Sgt Coyne come into the trench. About five minutes after, I heard him say he was going to throw one of the bombs to see if they were any good. I heard him tell some of the men to see if anybody out in front. I saw him fall of the firestep and the next thing said "Look out, the bomb's in the trench." I was close to him at the time and saw him feeling in the bottom of the trench. I started to get away and then heard the explosion. I heard Sullivan say "Is anyone hit?" Sgt Coyne said "Yes, I've got the lot of it." I didn't hear anything else."

Pte 4535 G L Gollagher, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon, while I was in the trench about midnight on the 14th May 1918. I saw Sgt Coyne come into the trench. Afterwards I heard him say he was going to test the box of bombs to see if they were good. I saw him get on the firestep and after that I can't say what happened. He either slipped or else knocked his hand. I next heard him sing out "Look out she's in the trench." An explosion followed and I then heard Sullivan ask "Is anyone hurt?" Sgt Coyne said "I've got the full issue of it, boys."

Pte 3928 C R Rodgers, 31st Bn states:

"I am a member of the Lewis Gun section of No 14 Platoon, while I was in the trench at about 11.30pm on the 14th May 1918. I saw Sgt Coyne come into the trench. About ten minutes afterwards I heard him say he was going to test the case of bombs, to see if they were good. He got up on the firestep, and went to throw it. As he started to throw it, he fell back and said "Get for your lives, there's a live bomb in the trench." After the explosion, Sullivan, who was on post at the time, asked "Is anyone hit?" Sgt Coyne said "Yes Sully, I've got the full issue. I laid on it."

A couple of items amongst the usual personal items returned, of wrist disc and chain, disc, tooth comb, pocket toilet case, unit colours, pocket book, film, photos, card wallet, and letter, were <u>5 pieces of balloon silk</u>. German Badge, Grenade Badge, **2 silk handkerchiefs**.


