This N.C.O. also did excellent work at HAMEL on July 4th and again in the August 1918 operations. On August 30th near BARLEUX when his Battery was supporting the attack on PERONNE and was itself subjected to fire from an enemy 5.9" Battery this N.C.O. assisted in carrying up ammunition from a dump 100 yards in rear for over an hour, so that his Battery could carry out its programme without interruption, though enemy shells fell in and near the Battery at the rate of about one per minute. He is deserving of special recognition.</i>'</p> <p>"Congratulated for gallant services rendered during recent operations", on 31<sup>st</sup> Aug 1918</p> <p>Awarded <b>Bar to MM</b> for actions: "<i>On the morning of 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1918, during the advance of his Battery to a position near BAZUEL, this N.C.O. showed great courage and devotion to duty when in charge of ammunition wagons conveying ammunition to the forward position. Coming under heavy shell fire one of the teams was knocked out and two drivers wounded. This N.C.O. superintended the evacuation of the wounded men and also personally occupied a driver's position in the the team and delivered the ammunition to the Battery.  Died from Natural Causes on 20<sup>th</sup> Aug 1918  
 Died suddenly on 20<sup>th</sup> Aug 1918 whilst attached to Australian Infantry Concert Party. Death was due to the late effects of a penetrating wound to the chest, actual cause of the death being haemorrhage into the preicardium from the breaking down of a wound of the heart wall, failure of the right ventricle and acute pulmonary congestion and oedema. Post mortem examination revealed the fact that “it is clear that the man had at some time ago received a penetrating wound of the chest \_ the bullet having entered the left side of the chest (at the site of the scar).” And in view of the fact that you advise that the Attestation Paper records that on enlistment this man had, as one of distinctive marks, a scar on his left side, it would appear that he has died of injuries received prior to enlistment. Buried at Daours Communal Cemetery Extension, France on 22<sup>nd</sup> Aug 1918 by Chaplain Rev L.R. Thurlow.

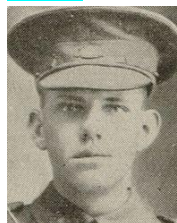

Major Alcorn of the 14<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance knows most about it, he handled him to begin with when I was present. He said afterwards to me "Fancy Lieut C dying". Major Alcorn was a particular friend of Lieut Corcoran and would be able to give details of death and burial. RE. HAROLD ESAM.

Pte. J. V. Collings, 6th Company, 31st Battalion, Australian prisoner of war, Kriegsgefangenenlager, Hammelburg, Baviere, Germany, writes as under, to Mrs. S. S. Esam, Banyan St., Warrnambool:

*"Perhaps you will be surprised to get a letter from me. As this address of your son was given to me by a German the time I was taken prisoner on the 19<sup>th</sup> July, 1916, I was often going to write, but thinking, perhaps, he had no mother, and that was just the address he was working at, I never gave it much thought. But I often thought since that perhaps he had a mother at home, like myself, worrying herself to death. I knew Harold Esam; he was in my Company, and in the charge on the evening of the 19<sup>th</sup> July, 1916, he was hit beside me and, I think, killed, as he never uttered a word. Just after, I, myself, was wounded in the leg, as we were under very heavy artillery and machine-gun fire. I crawled into a shell hole and did not see Harold again, but the following morning, when I was taken prisoner, a German gave me a piece of paper, with his address on. So, if you have not heard from him, he has gone to that great place where there are no wars. Of course, I do not know if there is a Mrs. Esam, but perhaps this letter will get to some of his brothers or sisters. If this letter gives you any relief, please drop me a line, as this is written from one who has a mother at home, and who has a brother also, who has gone to that great Beyond."*

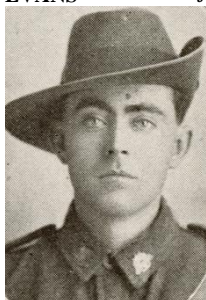

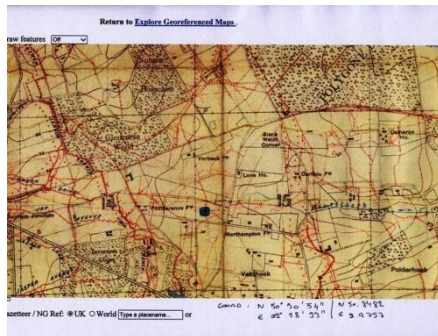

***Being relieved in Support Line after Polygon Wood stunt, Black Watch Corner, a 9.2 shell landed on a dud 5.2 exploding both, killing 9 men outright at the relieving point in the support line. All blown to pieces and not buried for obvious reasons. Among them Sgt R Fleming, W.A. Ellis, A.E. Eyckens, R. Anderson, G.M. Grant. Wells, Ekin, Emery, Meeham, Cpl Shaw Cpl Johnson (see Fleming Red Cross file)***



An old school mate of Arthur's, L/Cpl 5914 Alfred John Saph, also of Beaufort, ('C' Coy) wrote to Mrs Ellen Nora Eyckens, on 5<sup>th</sup> Oct 1917; "... it is with feelings of regret that I have to write to you of the loss of your son, Arthur, who was killed in action on 29<sup>th</sup> September 1917.

*We had been together for some weeks, and were the best of mates, and I can assure you I feel the loss very much. Most likely he had written home and told you that I had got him a good job with Major Tracy as batman. The Major thought a lot of him and told me on more than one occasion that I had sent him a good man.*

*On the morning of the 26<sup>th</sup> September our battalion went over the top and took and held their objectives. About 7am, Arthur was with the Major when this officer was wounded through the wrist. Arthur put him in a shell hole, bandaged his wound, and started to bring him out to the Dressing Station. On the way out a sniper picked them up, and the officer got another one through his other wrist. Arthur bandaged up this wound, got him back to the Dressing Station and headquarters, and saw him off to the ambulance.*

*The Major thanked ever so much, he told me, and promised to write to him as soon as he could, and sent him back from the line. He had to return to the firing line again on the 28<sup>th</sup> with others, as everyone was called up. On the 29<sup>th</sup>, a few minutes before his party (the last of the company) was relieved, a shell lodged right in the corner of the trench killing a sergeant, two corporals and seven others instantaneously and burying two others.*

*On 1<sup>st</sup> October poor old Will (Arthur's brother) came along to where we were, and I had to break the sad news to him. We went and picked out Arthur's pack, and Will got his belongings. Arthur had all his photos with him and had shown them to me only a few hours before he was killed.*

*He is buried along with the others, near where he fell, and the QM Sgt is having a cross made and erected, as we are in the same parts again..."*
