

"22nd Jul 1916, Boulogne. As you have probably heard by now, I have been wounded. It is only a slight one though. A piece of shrapnel hit me on the right thigh, but beyond a bit of soreness and bruise, it did no damage. I am now in a Convalescent Campat Boulogne and having a good spell. Two Corporals of my Company are here too as well as a lot of men. You will have seen the Casualty List by this. We are not allowed to write letters from here, only cards.

Since last writing our crowd have had a rather exciting and strenuous time. As I said in my letter we were going to take part in a big attack. Well, we did – I didn't because I was hit while we were waiting in the trenches for the word to go over the parapet. Our artillery were giving the enemy a bad time, but about half an hour before the attack was to come off, the enemy began to bombard us with shrapnel and high explosive shells. We did get a bad time, I tell you. If we went into dugouts, we ran the risk of being buried by a high explosive shell, or if we did not, shrapnel had a go at us! I was hit about a quarter of an hour afterwards, the same shell got about a dozen other chaps near me. There was one continual hail of dirt and metal and I don't know how any one escaped being hit. Anyhow when the time came, 'Tiveys chocs' hopped over into a hail of shrapnel and machine gun bullets. They advanced and took three lines of trenches without opposition. The enemy artillery drove them out, however, and I have not heard whether our lads got back again or not. I believe Col Toll was great and inspired great confidence in the men. I think he came through alright. I spent one night at No 2 Casualty Clearing Station."

"France, 4th Sep 1916. The birthday cakes have not come to light yet. They are with the 31st Comforts Fund, aren't they? I do not think any of these have arrived yet. The Twiy fund seems to be working well now. The Victorians do well in the parcel line and in addition we get cakes etc. One tin to two and so forth. Gee why I've forgotten the only piece of news I had. We are now 15 miles away from the firing line having a 'blow' and learning wood-fighting at the same time. It is a great change after the trench warfare and so far, has been quite interesting. I dare say it will get monotonous sooner or later though. We are now camped in the centre of a big forest and go out for manoeuvres each day."

“France, 28th May 1918. It seems years since I wrote to you and I suppose it really is, but we lose all count of time here and sleep all day and wake all night etc. so things get slightly mixed. We have broken all records for the British Army of continuous front-line occupation!!! It’s too monotonous for mine. A relief is due for us shortly though I think it will be welcome too, I tell you.”

Mentioned War Diary, May 1918

On 31st May 1918 Lieut Gair took out a patrol of 12 OR from J.33.d.45.30 at 1.15 a.m. and searched P.3.b and vicinity of road P.4.a. Listening post was formed at P.4.c.3.9 but nothing however was seen or heard of the enemy. Patrol returned at 3 a.m.

(Battle of Amiens, 8th Aug 1918)

To UK on leave, on 15th Aug 1918

“England, 14th Aug 1918. Dear Mum and Dad, after a spell of just under seven weeks, an Aussie mail is just beginning to float along. So far, I have not had mine but some got mail dated June 6th & 7th last night so mine may come this week. Yet, Mrs Wheeler may be holding it in London for me though I expect leave any time now. The latest I have heard is that I go on the 22nd. I was to have gone on the 1st, but it was put off for a few weeks. Oh, I forgot, I had one letter from Dad dated 2/6/18 last night. It was the one written with a fine bred foxy pup asking for more attention than he was receiving!! For want of that sole remaining optic of yours Dad. That’s twice now. Do you remember the time you were hit with the mail at Charters Towers. Send me above of the old rooster to know for spite! I suppose you have all had the news of the kick we gave Fritz on the 8th and with the French turned the tables on him completely. Boches lost the initiative of attack and instead he is wondering where his next attack is to come, we have got him wondering where we will kick him next. Ours was a great show and a complete surprise. Our Bn moved forward 11 kilos altogether and you can imagine that we were dead beat when we arrived at our objective. We were the first Battalion in the Corps to reach our final point. Our Company being the first in the Battalion. It was our Company which captured the 12” gun train complete. Two others just got away in time. Of course, since then other troops have gone through us and advanced further still. To prove how the success was, he didn’t counter-attack us till about the third day and of course he got it well in the neck. Our casualties were amazingly light for so big a show. The tanks were great. We had rather bad luck with our own particular tanks though, as a battery of field guns tried to put up a fight. They succeeded to a certain extent by firing at point blank range, put all our company tanks out of action. Soon afterwards we located them and turned the ever-ready Lewis Guns on to them. They left their guns and rushed down a dugout. When we arrived on the scene, they calmly came out with their hands up and wearing red cross armlets and asked for mercy. You can imagine what mercy they got. The whole crews were killed and if we had had time, I think the lads would have pulled them to pieces. It’s an old dodge of Fritz to fire on you till the last minute and the ask for mercy. Of course they get it!! I don’t think. One rather funny incident occurred at a farm house where we were fired on my machine guns. An old tank came and waddled on the scene and we got our Lewis Guns to work. This put the fear of the devil into the Fritz – he came out in swarms with hands up. As they ran out the ‘diggers’ sniped them and the gunners had a great time mowing them down. Few of that crowd were taken prisoners. They were another ‘fine till the last and then ask for mercy’ crowd!! On the first day of the big advance, we only had one man killed in the Battalion. The wounded was well under 100 and most of them were slight and walking cases. The whole show was a huge success. I have no news at all except stunts and I’ve said enough about it. Oh! I collected a few decent souvenirs I will send from England and the four of you can take your pick: That will be 1. An automatic pistol, 2. Iron Cross, 3. Order of Merit for Officers (German medals), 4. Five, 2 & 1 Franc notes, 5. German prayer book, 6. Photos of Gun we captured, 7. Invitation to a German Wedding, 8. Aerial photos and maps I used showing whole advance etc. I tried to get a watch and glasses too, but was too late. Well cheerio dears, Best love and kisses, from your loving Ivan”

He remained conscious and was at once carried away by stretcher bearers."

"31st Bn, B7, 5'9", fair, stout, 22 – came from Rockhampton- At Nauroy, near the Factory on 29/9/18 at 9.30am, he was leading his Platoon in the advance when he was hit with a Machine Gun bullet in hip and groin – a bad wound. He was conscious and cheerful and was at once assisted out by the stretcher bearers. I know nothing of his death and burial." Pte 3348 F C Clarke, 31st Bn
"We were trying to take the sugar mill at Jon court on 30th Sep 1918, about 11.00am and he was hit by a machine gun bullet which entered the top of his leg and lodged in his body. I was close by and saw him hit. He started to walk to the Aid Post about 1 kilo away and I did not see him again. He was a big man, tall, well built, fair, was in charge of 7th Platoon, 'B' Coy, 31st Bn." Pte 2897 J W Carr, VII Platoon, 'B' Coy, 31st Bn
"I saw him wounded retiring from the left of Estaires near Bellicourt. He was walking, but he was wounded in the back and right side by shrapnel. He arrived at the RAP 32, was treated there and passed on. He was a man about 28, stout and fair, and was in 'B' Coy. I don't know what happened to him after that."

"About the 30th Sep 1918, we were at Nauroy just past Bellicourt and were advancing in the morning. Soon after the start, Mr Gair was hit by a machine gun bullet in the stomach. He went away by himself to the Dressing Station, and died afterwards. Some of our boys buried him near Bellicourt. I saw him hit."

"I have no trace of this officer (32nd Bn), in my records. The mentioned officer was admitted to this CCS (53^d CCS) suffering from GSW Buttock and died 9.30pm, 30th Sep 1918. He was buried in the Military Cemetery at Tincourt."



On 29th Aug about noon, on St Quentin Rd, during our advance Kelly was killed by a shell, hit in body and face. Buried near the spot. Pte Dan Davis Stretcher Bearer of A Coy, was killed by the same shell and buried alongside him. Grave is about 100yds from St Quentin Canal, 200yds right of main road running into St Quentin village, near village of Flancourt. Hit by a piece of shell in stomach and died almost a once, when rushing the river near right of Perrone - Pte Keith Renouf, # 289, was nearby. Kelly was engaged to a girl in London. We had just reached our objective, at Villers Carbonnel. S/B # 662, Pte Gartner was nearby. 



Court of Inquiry into death of Pte D Gray, (24th Jan 1918)

Pte 3017A Frederick Richard Gilbert "I am a member of 'B' Coy, 31st Battalion. On the morning of 27th September 1917, at about six o'clock, I was in a trench that had been captured by 31st Battn, AIF, on the previous day. An order was issued for all rifles to be cleaned. I reached for my rifle on the parapet. In seizing hold of it, the rifle exploded. On looking along the trench, I saw that Pte D Gray was badly wounded. I was considerably upset by the occurrence, and could hardly realise that the accident was caused by me. I saw Pte D Gray in a dying state, but could not stay with him owing to the advance being continued. I was so unnerved with the occurrence that it was most difficult for me to carry on my duties, my rifle was loaded in preparation for a counter-attack. Cpl Whelan was the only other man I knew in the trench, and was standing alongside me at the time of the accident."

"On the morning of 27th September 1917 (second morning of the Polygon Wood advance) I was in a trench occupied by the 31st Bn. About 6 o'clock an order was given to clean all rifles. Pte Gilbert, who was along side of me in the trench, took his rifle off the parapet and in grasping it, the rifle was discharged. As soon as the explosion occurred, I looked along the trench and noticed that Pte D Gray was seriously wounded. I immediately proceeded to bandage Pte D Gray and give what assistance I could, he was however beyond help, as the bullet had pierced his brain and the man was dying. The bullet discharged from rifle by Pte Gilbert was the bullet that pierced the brain of Pte D Gray, as no other rifle was discharged at that time and as Pte D Gray was sitting in such a position that no enemy rifle fire would affect him.

When Pte Gilbert saw the result of the discharge of his rifle, the shock so unnerved him, that in my opinion, he was incapable of carrying on his duties. I did not see Pte Gilbert later as almost immediately the advance was continued. Pte D Gray was not dead when I left the trench, but was in such a state that death must have occurred shortly afterwards. I did not know any other men that were in the trench at the time of the occurrence. I reported the occurrence to the officer in charge of the sector."

The Court of Inquiry having considered the evidence, finds as follows:

1. That the death of Pte D Gray was caused by a shot from a rifle on 27th Sept 1917
2. That the shot was fired accidentally by Pte 3017A FR Gilbert of 31st Bn.
3. That Pte Gilbert is in no way responsible for the accident and is exonerated from all blame.

I never heard he had been reported Missing on the 27th Sep. I last saw him with the Bn about 28th Dec and he was all right then."*

"I have received yours of the 16th inst and noted its particulars, but I am not the soldier you are inquiring for. I think I can throw a little light on the matter though, but unfortunately it is not very cheering news that his people must eventually know. I was wounded on 27th Sep 1917 and passed through CCS. I was reported at my Battalion and Company as having 'Died of Wounds', but on my writing a letter to a chum in Company, it was afterwards altered to 'Wounded'. Now my surmise is this, that through some error or other, his particulars were sent to 'A' Company as referring to me, as my initials and his are very similar viz his are H.J. and mine are M.J. My number is 3241 and his 3357. Of course, after my particulars being altered no more was said about it in our Coy., as I am the only Gill that is or has been in 'A' Coy. (I procured this information from our Coy Orderly Room). The Gill you are looking for was in 'B' Coy. Now if there had been a mistake in my particulars being marked 'Wounded' and applied to his case and of course him not turning up at a hospital or his unit, he was eventually marked as 'Missing'. That is my idea of what happened, of course I cannot say if it is right. But I know for certain the facts regarding my own case, also that 3357 H.J. Gill was in 'B' Coy, not 'A' Coy, 31st Bn. He has some relatives in England I believe, as I had one of his letters by mistake. It was from a Mrs Gill, 'Vine Cottage', Probus, Cornwall. On account of him being marked as 'A' Coy, a mate of mine, who was at the base some time ago, when asked for particulars, mistook him for me and told them I was back with my unit, which is quite correct."





"I saw him killed by a shell, just as we reached our first objective at Polygon Wood. I could not say if he was buried. I knew him in the company. He came over with the 13th Rfts of the 25th Batt. He came from Brisbane."

"Thomas Joseph Gough was in AII, and his number was 5017. I know him intimately. Before the war he was an accountant for Allan & Stark in Queen St, Brisbane. He lived at Woolston. I was told by L/Cpl William Lesley, attached to 'A' Coy, that he had seen Gough on the 26th Sept at Polygon Wood, killed by shell fire. This occurred

about 8am. Gough was buried near where he fell and there was a cross put on top of him."

"Re the enquiries of Pte 5017 T J Gough. I was not with him at the time he was killed, but I made inquiries from some of my mates who saw him killed. He was one of the first to be killed in the Polygon Wood offensive on the morning of the 26th Sep 1917. There was a Pioneer Bn at work burying the dead shortly afterwards, and as he was one of the first to fall would most likely be buried, but I could not be certain, and if he was buried it would be on the field. I have written to his sister, Mrs GH Smith, Brisbane, and given her as much information as possible. No Love Like a Mother's




John Goulding Mines 16 FEB 2017

John Goulding was born at Lincolnshire in England and was just six years of age when he arrived in Australia. His family took up residence in South Brisbane and young John attended the Southport State School. He enlisted in August 1915 and sailed in November to serve in France with the 31st Battalion. He was listed as missing after the terrible charge at Fromelles (Fleurbaey) on July 19th 1916 and in November his mother, Alice, was advised it was likely he had died as a prisoner of war, but thereafter she heard nothing. A letter written by Alice Goulding in 1919 provides us with a heart rending insight into the thoughts and feelings of grieving parents at this time. I have

waited patiently with an aching heart for news of him, if only I could know that he did not suffer too I do hope that something further will be made known to me, although three years have passed it seems but as yesterday. I am still waiting. First missing, then prisoner of war, then killed in action. I know he was not the only one by thousands, but he was my son, just lent to me for 3½ years and then missing..... I know a good son, I believe a good man but I do not know if a good soldier. He has paid the price as many others have done, but in all the world there is no love like a mother's love for her children..... The suspense is what makes it so hard. Hoping this mail will bring some tidings or

the next one. I cannot write more and I know you don't want to read more. May I please ask will you try and find any record of him, my boy. She wrote again in December 1920, four years after he was killed, concluding her letter 'So hard for a devoted mother. I am sorry and sad. The earnest prayer of my heart is may he rest in peace until we meet Again John Goulding is believed to have died on the day of his capture, July 19th 1916, and was buried by the Germans in pits at Pheasant Wood. Alice Goulding died on July 19th 1922, six years to the day after the death of her son. In 2012 his remains were identified and returned to the Pheasant Wood Military Cemetery at Fromelles.



Court of Inquiry into death of Pte D Gray, (24th Jan 1918)

Pte 3017A Frederick Richard *Gilbert* "I am a member of 'B' Coy, 31st Battalion. On the morning of 27th September 1917, at about six o'clock, I was in a trench that had been captured by 31st Battn, AIF, on the previous day. An order was issued for all rifles to be cleaned. I reached for my rifle on the parapet. In seizing hold of it, the rifle exploded. On looking along the trench, I saw that Pte D Gray was badly wounded. I was considerably upset by the occurrence, and could hardly realise that the accident was caused by me. I saw Pte D Gray in a dying state, but could not stay with him owing to the advance being continued. I was so unnerved with the occurrence that it was most difficult for me to carry on my duties, my rifle was loaded in preparation for a counter-attack. Cpl Whelan was the only other man I knew in the trench, and was standing alongside me at the time of the accident."

"On the morning of 27th September 1917 (second morning of the Polygon Wood advance) I was in a trench occupied by the 31st Bn. About 6 o'clock an order was given to clean all rifles. Pte Gilbert, who was along side of me in the trench, took his rifle off the parapet and in grasping it, the rifle was

discharged. As soon as the explosion occurred, I looked along the trench and noticed that Pte D Gray was seriously wounded. I immediately proceeded to bandage Pte D Gray and give what assistance I could, he was however beyond help, as the bullet had pierced his brain and the man was dying. The bullet discharged from rifle by Pte Gilbert was the bullet that pierced the brain of Pte D Gray, as no other rifle was discharged at that time and as Pte D Gray was sitting in such a position that no enemy rifle fire would affect him.

When Pte Gilbert saw the result of the discharge of his rifle, the shock so unnerved him, that in my opinion, he was incapable of carrying on his duties. I did not see Pte Gilbert later as almost immediately the advance was continued. Pte D Gray was not dead when I left the trench, but was in such a state that death must have occurred shortly afterwards. I did not know any other men that were in the trench at the time of the occurrence. I reported the occurrence to the officer in charge of the sector."

The Court of Inquiry having considered the evidence, finds as follows:

4. That the death of Pte D Gray was caused by a shot from a rifle on 27th Sept 1917
 5. That the shot was fired accidentally by Pte 3017A FR Gilbert of 31st Bn.
 6. That Pte Gilbert is in no way responsible for the accident and is exonerated from all blame.

The Countess of Darnley, who was formerly Miss Florence Morphy, of Melbourne, was the recipient of a handsome New Year's gift from a number of Australian officers, whom she and Lord Darnley entertained at Christmas dinner. The present consisted of a silver rose-bowl, engraved with the rising sun, the badge of the Australian Imperial Forces, and inside was an inscription expressing the hope that the perfume of flowers which might grace the bowl in future years would be as fragrant to Lady Darnley as the memory of the sojourn of the donors at Cobham Hall would be to them. Lord and Lady Darnley have given over the state apartments of their residence, Cobham Hall, Gravesend, Kent, to the authorities for a residence for 50 Australian officers, and it was a contingent of these, headed by Lieut-Colonel S. W. G. Annand, 2nd Pioneer Battalion, and Lieutenant Col F. W. Toll, 31st Battalion, who made the presentation.]



I saw the graves with a cross on them. I would say that there were fully fifty casualties. It happened at night. I went up during the night, to help clean up."

"He was of 32nd Bn, 'C' Coy, HQ.

At Sailly le Sec, near 'C' Company ration dump, on 24th June 1918. Fritz's planes bombed us and killed 24 or 25 with one bomb, Guddopp being one. He was killed instantly. All bodies were taken away for burial by a Transport Waggon, but I cannot say where they were buried." Cpl 5208 W Tillet, 'C' Coy HQ, 32nd Bn

"He was in 'C' Company Headquarters

At Sailly le Sec on 24th September 1918 (sic), he with many others, were near a ration dump, when a Fritz aeroplane dropped a bomb among them, and killed about 25 of them. All bodies were buried at Vaux. I saw Guddopp's body with the others ready for burial.

R.S.J. Kennedy, the Quartermaster (No 1302) was killed by the same bomb."

Our objective was an imaginary line about 1000 yards ahead of us. That was the objective set for 'A' and 'B' Companies. We lost quite a number of men going across. We came to a number of dug-outs and "pill-boxes" and sent back a number of German prisoners.
Officers seen during the engagement.
I saw the following officers during the advance.

Captain McLennan,
Lieut Brodie, 'A' Coy

the OC of 'B' Coy
he was killed alongside me. It was near a "pill-box" just as we had about reached our objective.

Wounded and made Prisoner

The men of all battalions were mixed up. A machine gun bullet struck me in the right hand. I made an attempt to get back but was again wounded, this time in the knee. I took cover in a shell hole. This would be about 8 o'clock. I remained there till about 9.30. In the meantime, the enemy had counter-attacked and were driving our chaps back. There were eight or 10 of us taken prisoner by the Germans. At the first dressing station behind the lines, my wounds were dressed.

Hother, I understand is reported "Missing". As we were going back as prisoners, one of our own HE's exploded near the group of us. I did not see Hother afterwards.

What happened immediately after capture.

At a village behind the lines my smashed fingers were amputated and my wounds dressed. Then we were taken to Courtrai, but went on through Ghent to Cologne in Germany.

I remained at Cologne for two months till 1st December. I was in hospital there. Their treatment was very poor. My wounds were dressed about once a week. Tinham and Nowlan, of the same battalion, were with me at Cologne I was transferred from Cologne to Limburg a/Lahn and remained in the Lager there till 22nd March 1918, when I left for Aachen for exchange.

Across Holland to England

For the time we were at the frontier post of Aachen awaiting exchange, the German treatment was perceptibly improved. Crossing Holland to the port of Rotterdam the Dutch people gave us a very hearty reception all the way along the route. I crossed from Rotterdam on the "SINDORA" and reached Boston on Sunday 14th March 1918.

We came straight on to London and have been quartered at The King George Hospital at Waterloo. I received my first Red Cross parcel on 30th Nov at Cologne and received them regularly afterwards."
