Alex spent the cruel winter of 1916 in the trenches at Fromelles, Deville Wood, Montauban, and Fricourt and like many of his fellow solders suffered from Trench Foot and ailments related to standing and sleeping in freezing water.

"We went over the top at 5.45am and reached our objective at 7.30am".

While preparing for the German counter attack digging in, Alex received a gunshot wound to the left-hand side of his chest.

"I crawled back to where engineers were digging a trench. They took everything off me, bandaged me up and put a towel over my shoulder and carried me to an old Fritzies block house. There were about five of us in it. We stayed that day and night. The stretcher bearer came and got us next morning. I got down to the CES 3 o'clock that evening and went straight into the operating table and had the bullet and two of my ribs taken out just over my heart. It was a ricker shaped bullet that went in under my left arm, through 2 ribs and just missed my heart. The Doctor said it was a very lucky hit."

Wilfred was born 1885 in Rochester to parents William Banyan Yeaman and Harriett Mary Ann Wilson. His parents owned and ran the Montrose Store and Post Office c1896-1913. In 1931 he was living at 2 The Boltons Newcastle NSW. It is not known if he married or had family, He died in 1941 in Hornsby NSW.

North Russia Intervention service of 192143 Private Wilfred Charles Yeaman, 201 Machine Gun Company, North Russia Relief Force, Russia, 1919-1920.

Wallet 1 of 1 - This wallet contains a diary kept by Private Yeaman Diary during his service with the North Russia Relief Force, 1919-1920. The diary begins 23 May 1919 with Yeaman detailing his activities in the weeks leading up to the campaign. He describes military routine, guard duty, training exercises, and rest activities. He then describes the journey to Russia along the coast of Norway. His entries during the Russia campaign describe the weather, activities, tactical intentions of the 'Bolshies' or 'Bolo', 'Ruskies' and the Cossacks. Also military routine, prisoners, guard duty, movements. He travelled to Murmansk, Archangel, Obozersky, and Emsta. After the campaign, he journeys through England and France. During this period he describes his sightseeing, including climbing the Eiffel Tower.

Yeaman describes the effects of battles in the Russia campaign, including at Obozersky and Emtsa. This includes mention of Sergeant Pearse VC. Yeaman's diary also describes the arrest and execution of Russian mutineers by White Russian forces.

The wallet also includes a postcard from Wilfred Charles Yeaman to his mother, Harriett Mary Ann Yeaman. The postcard depicts his troopship, the HMT 'Czar'.
