"One of the men in the barn at the time 3 shells burst amongst them (see Stubbin entry) caused 30 casualties out of 35 in our platoon. One cross bearing 11 names was erected, of the others – Tom Lynn, Stubbin, Ruskett, Prime, Ross.
He was killed by a shell while asleep in a barn in front line at Vaire, near Corbie, buried just outside the farmhouse, near a canal bank, not far from Villers Bretonneux.
We were in a barn at Bouzancourt, near Hamel when a shell burst on a barn in which Stubbin and 34 of us were sleeping. He and several others were killed outright, and a few died of wounds, while 14 of us were wounded and in hospital. I saw him buried with 9 or 10 others near the barn. We erected a cross giving all the details. Pte RH Noble, # 3604.

This shell killed or wounded 27 other ranks. Lt H Miller, 'A' Coy, in charge of burial party that interred this man and 9 others at the left rear corner of the Farmhouse at Bouzancourt, (map ref I.34d) A cross erected over each body, Bn Padre Malcolmson buried them. Only arrived the night before, so taking shelter in best places we could find. "

Francis was born in [Lancashire](#), England on the 26th of July 1888 to Rev. Francis James Nance and Margaret Lyth. The family arrived in Australia in December 1889. In 1915 Francis was married to Winifred Fisher, by his father, Rev. Nance.

Francis was a doctor, practicing at Bacchus Marsh, VIC when he joined the AIF on the 16th of August 1915, aged 27. He was appointed a Captain on the 1st of March 1916 and embarked aboard the *HMAT A67 Orsova* two weeks later, disembarking in Egypt some time later.

He was attached to the 8th Australian Field Ambulance in April 1916 and two months later was in France. At the end of July he was seconded to the 31st Battalion for two weeks and in December to the 29th Battalion. Later that month he was admitted to a Casualty Clearing Station and then to the 2nd General Hospital, France - bronchitis. Francis was then invalided back to England and admitted to the 1st Southern General Hospital, [Stourbridge](#), Birmingham - bronchitis severe. In February 1917 he embarked for Australia aboard the *Benalla* for three month change - pulmonary tuberculosis. On the 21st of July A PUBLIC WELCOME will be tendered at the Mechanics' Institute, Bacchus Marsh which he would have attended. His appointment was terminated in late October.

After the war he lived in [Colac](#), VIC for quite some time until he moved to [Doncaster](#), VIC about 1960, where he died in 1966, aged 77.

Nance was born in Lancashire, England, eldest son of Rev Francis James Nance and his wife Margret Lyth. Margaret was born in Lakemba, Fiji, where her father was a Methodist missionary, and she and Francis James were married in Melbourne in 1885. The Nance family resided first in Launceston, Tas and then moved to Victoria. Nance was educated at Wesley College and Queen's College and completed his residency in Melbourne. He was commissioned in Mar 1916 and arrived in Egypt in April. He was first assigned to the 15th Fld Amb, then three days later posted to 8th Fld Amb; he went with the unit in June. At the end of July he had a short attachment to 31st Bn, and in December to 29th Bn. In January 1917 he was admitted to hospital with a chest infection, which turned out to be pulmonary tuberculosis. In February he was sent back to Australia for three months' convalescence, but then was discharged in April 1917. He settled in Colac, Victoria and went into practice with his brother, Donald Clemow Nance. Despite his illness Nance lived to the age of 78 years.

Winifred Margaret Nance was born in 1886 in Launceston, Tasmania. She died in 1965.

Francis Lyth Nance [\[Parents\]](#) was born¹ on 26 Jul 1888 in Southport, Lancashire. He died² in 1966 in Doncaster, Victoria, Australia. He married³ Winifred Annie Fisher on 23 Sep 1915 in St Kilda Methodist church, Victoria, Australia.

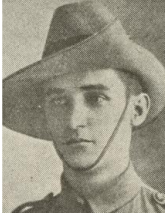

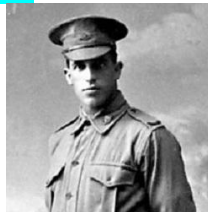

"During the operations in the vicinity of BELLICOURT between 29/9/18 and 1/10/18 this NCO was in command of a platoon and displayed initiative and courage of a very high order. His bearing and utter disregard for danger under intense artillery and machine gun fire set a splendid example to the men under his command.

At a critical stage of the operations, he advanced with his platoon for a distance of over 500 yards in the face of heavy machine gun fire, established a line, and thereby filled a gap which existed on the flank, and materially assisted in the success of the operations. His conduct throughout the whole operation was a source of inspiration to his men and undoubtedly inspired them to greater efforts."
