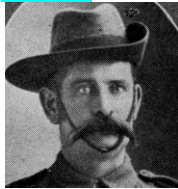

On 9th April 1918 the Battalion moved through Corbie and thence along the North bank of the Somme to the Pontoon Bridge, where guides led the Companies to various sectors to relieve the 58th Battalion, 15th Brigade. The relief was completed by 2.10am on 10th April, without casualties. The enemy was very quiet during the relief, but his artillery was very active during the day on Vaire to Bouzencourt. At 1.30pm the enemy shelled a farm occupied by the Battalion with 40 rounds of 5.9" and 4.2" shells.

The 34 men of III Platoon, 'A' Coy were taking shelter in the best places we could find, in a barn, trying to get some sleep after the previous night's relief. Three direct hits, by high explosive shells, on the barn, caused 27 casualties.

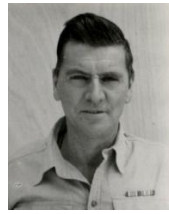

22nd Jul 1918 (War Diary)

"At 2 a.m. Lieut Neville reported to Lieut Skinner, Left Platoon Commander of Left Front Line Company, that he intended taking out a patrol with the intention of raiding an enemy post in E.19.b opposite the 54th Division front. He was taking out a mixed patrol of Australians, English and Americans who were under instructions in patrolling at 3rd Corps School. Lieut Skinner pointed out to him where the enemy post was and warned him not to bear too far to the right, otherwise he would run against one of our listening posts near the railway embankment. The patrol had not been out on this ground before, neither had Lieut Neville reconnoitred previously. The patrol duly went out and were lost in a slight mist which was hanging about at that time. About half an hour later Lieut Skinner heard rifle fire and bombing going on opposite his right flank. It appears patrol had lost direction in the mist and had run across our Listening Post. The two men manning the Listening Post challenged the party as soon as they were seen and receiving no answer challenged again. After the second challenge the two men manning the Listening Post heard the order 'Prepare to Rush' and shortly after the command 'Rush'. Fire was immediately opened by the Listening Post and the patrol also opened and started throwing bombs. The garrison of the trench in the rear, hearing the firing and seeing the dim outline of figures, immediately opened fire with rifles and L.G. and threw bombs. The enemy also took part with MGs and grenades.

By this time Lieut Skinner arrived on the scene and had ordered 'cease fire'. Our casualties were No 3639 – Pte E. Taylor. Killed, and No 3414 – Pte J. Standish, wounded – both of these were manning the listening post. The patrol's casualties were 5 privates killed, 9 OR (including 2 Sergeants) wounded, and Lieut Neville was also very seriously wounded in the legs. It was certainly a very regrettable incident, but this Battalion is in no way to blame for the occurrence. It shows that the front line garrison was very much on the alert."

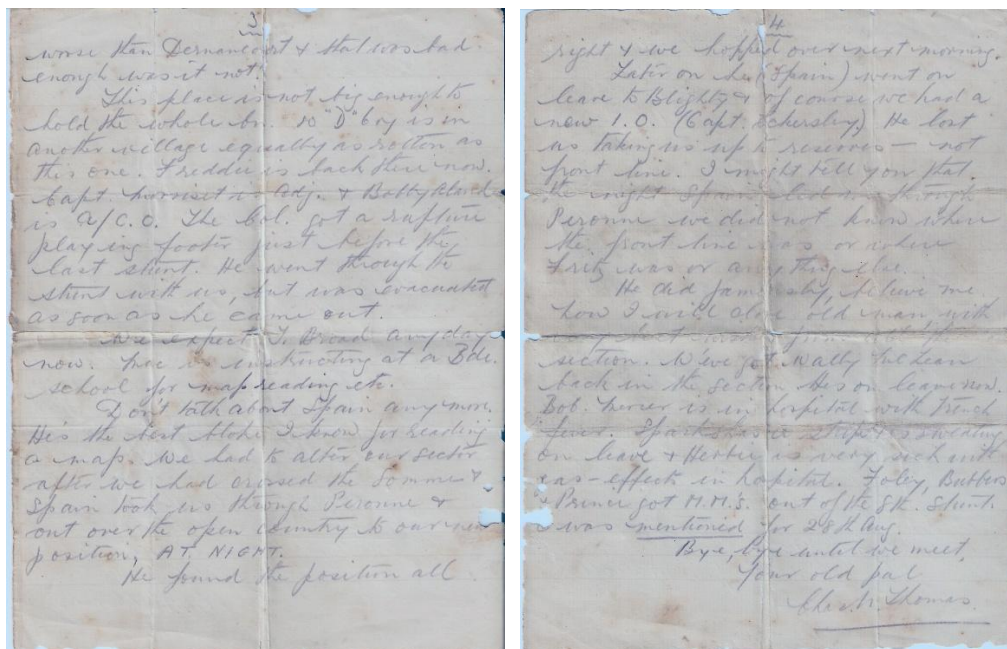

That leaves Dundas (barber), Kennedy (who joined us on 25th August during the stunt), Duffy, Lister, Lloyd (the new blake) & your humble servant oh & the Innis (who was in the 8th stunt

& also the 29th Sept. stunt) He was a nucleus for all the others. We had some great times — & some rough ones too, I may tell you. I went round to P. 604 to enquire about Cooney. He is quite well, although I did not see him. He is away at present on secret duty. When he comes back, I will see him & give him your address. Perhaps he will write to you himself.

By the way, all the casualties I have mentioned got to Blighty. You were very lucky to escape. Good luck to you. Stay here as long as you can, although I don't think we will see much more of you? Better take a trip through the original school. Dee & Simonson have just got back in France. Dee is nominated for a job in the base P.O. Don't Pleasant. Did you know Fred Keller was killed? Well that's about all the news just now. We are in the retirement village in France

Cpl 3643A, Alex Thomson, letter to Paddy Bugden's family on 29th October 1917:

"I had a very thrilling and unique experience in the big stunt which I am now going to relate to you," he wrote. "After we had advanced and gained our objectives, our boys on the right flank got the order to fall back owing to the English Division that was on our right not being able to come up. I was out in a shell hole in front and did not get the order to retire so I did not know that I was left out on my own. When 'Fritz' counter attacked us I got two of them with my rifle but I had to duck down into the shell hole owing to a machine gun firing on me. Just then three 'Fritzes' tumbled into the shell hole on top of me giving me no chance to put up a scrap. They immediately disarmed me and the youngest 'Fritz', who was about 18 years of age, put his revolver at my head and was going to shoot. The eldest 'Fritz' of the three started gibbering away in German and eventually made the young 'Fritz' take his revolver away from my head (much to my relief!). A moment or so after the above occurred the 'Fritz' who had just saved me from being shot, made a jump into the next shell hole and got shot through the stomach. I looked up to see a private named Paddy Bugden charging up with a few men to my rescue. The other two 'Fritzes' made to get away but Bugden quickly finished them off and I was then able to get back to our lines safely. The whole of the above episode took place under very heavy shell, rifle and machine gun fire, so you can understand the debt I owe to Paddy Bugden for his bravery in rescuing me. I am exceedingly sorry to say that Bugden got killed by a shell a couple of nights later. I am glad to say that the authorities are recognising the heroism of poor old Bugden as he did some magnificent work beside what I have related. He is, I believe, getting the VC which he richly deserved."

Cpl 3643A, Alex Thomson, letter to Paddy Bugden's family on 29th October 1917:

"I had a very thrilling and unique experience in the big stunt which I am now going to relate to you," he wrote. "After we had advanced and gained our objectives, our boys on the right flank got the order to fall back owing to the English Division that was on our right not being able to come up. I was out in a shell hole in front and did not get the order to retire so I did not know that I was left out on my own. When 'Fritz' counter attacked us I got two of them with my rifle but I had to duck down into the shell hole owing to a machine gun firing on me. Just then three 'Fritzes' tumbled into the shell hole on top of me giving me no chance to put up a scrap. They immediately disarmed me and the youngest 'Fritz', who was about 18 years of age, put his revolver at my head and was going to shoot. The eldest 'Fritz' of the three started gibbering away in German and eventually made the young 'Fritz' take his revolver away from my head (much to my relief!). A moment or so after the above occurred the 'Fritz' who had just saved me from being shot, made a jump into the next shell hole and got shot through the stomach. I looked up to see a private named Paddy Bugden charging up with a few men to my rescue. The other two 'Fritzes' made to get away but Bugden quickly finished them off and I was then able to get back to our lines safely. The whole of the above episode took place under very heavy shell, rifle and machine gun fire, so you can understand the debt I owe to Paddy Bugden for his bravery in rescuing me. I am exceedingly sorry to say that Bugden got killed by a shell a couple of nights later. I am glad to say that the authorities are recognising the heroism of poor old Bugden as he did some magnificent work beside what I have related. He is, I believe, getting the VC which he richly deserved."

Extract of diary from operations at Polygon Wood

Wednesday September 26th

At 6 a.m. at break of day and very foggy and gloomy, went over following our artillery barrage we

took Polygon Wood after some good fighting, but a good many casualties. Very little or no trench warfare in these parts.

Enemy adopted system of building concrete forts at intervals which are of a great thickness and strength, artillery has little effect on them. We call them pill-boxes, in some cases are difficult to take.

First Fritz I came across (a sniper) I bayoneted.

We took our objective often having good sport shooting fritz but it was terrible slaughter. Lost many of our pals, but made great slaughter on the enemy and took a great number of prisoners.

Enemy made several attempts to counter attack, but was always repulsed and mopped up by our artillery which was terrific and perfect, nothing could live in it. We also shot down a Fritz Aeroplane which fell in our line.

Thursday September 27th

Still fighting and consolidating till late at night when we were relieved from the front line and went back to support just behind front line in some bits of trenches round a pill box where we got rations water and had a good feed. On going into front line for the stunt we were issued with biscuits and bully and a piece of chocolate which we lived on for two days while fighting.

We sat in these supports trenches all the time under heavy shell first, getting more casualties (killed and wounded) till Saturday night when we were relieved and came back to Dickebusch camp, much less in number and much knocked up.

Under heavy shell fire from Tuesday night till Saturday night. Took and held our objective and repulsed all enemy counter attacks. Our batt. captured at least a dozen machine guns to our credit.

They succeeded in bringing the wounded to a place of safety and showed great courage in passing through heavy fire. Throughout the operation they showed utter disregard for their personal safety and set a very fine example to the remainder of the bearers.”***

"At 6pm on the 19th July 1916 we made an attack and captured the first and second line of the enemy's trench. Next morning about 7am the enemy counter-attacked and turned our flanks. During the counter-attack I was blown up by a hand grenade and was wounded in the left eye. I was knocked unconscious, and the next thing I remember was a German Officer coming up and pointing his revolver at me. He handed me over to some of his men who tore off all my badges, whilst they were taking me to the rear several threatened to shoot and bayonet me. I met the following prisoners:- Captain Mills, Sgt Allison, Privates Payne, Prior, Walters and Maison. Also Pte Knight who I think died. I was marched about 2 miles to the German Headquarters where I was searched, everything being taken from me. I was then put on an old wagon and taken to a shed some miles distant. On getting down I fainted. I was then put in an ambulance and taken to the railway and sent to Lille, where we stayed 24 hours. Whilst there I had the first meal consisting of boiled rice. I was then removed to Douai. After being in Douai for 5 days I was taken to the Doctor who operated and removed my eye. This is the first medical attention I have received. After staying there a month I was transferred to another hospital at Kaiserin Augusta Schule Coln, from there I was transferred to Constance, where I passed a medical board for transfer, and was then sent to Murren, Switzerland. I received bad treatment all through from the Germans. The only anesthetic I had at the operation was a small injection of cocaine. As regard the food we hardly got enough to live on and what I did get was not fit to eat. At Cologne we were driven around the streets on exhibition in front of all the people, who threw things at us."

We gave each other our home addresses & his was c/o Mrs M Read, 121 Moon St, Clifton Hill, Victoria. Tinham was known throughout the regiment on account of his beautiful voice. He sang like a girl. There was no man called Binham in the Regt & I am certain of Tinham's number being 967."</i> Sgt E J Gothard, 858, XIII Platoon, 'D' Coy. <u>POW Statement</u> <i>"My Battalion took part in the Divisional attack on Polygon Wood. 'D' Coy advanced about 6.30 am on 26th Sep 1917 in artillery formation. Our objective was Passchendaele Ridge. We covered about 1,000 yards, reaching nearly to the foot of the ridge. We were held up there by the enemy fire which was heavy and continuous. I saw Lt Brodie shortly after we started. I heard afterwards that he had been killed. Lieut Walters was second in Command of 'D' Company; he went over with the Company. I do not know what happened to him. We had reached almost to the foot of the ridge when it was decided to dig in. There was a heavy mist that morning. I was wounded in the right hand. The enemy counter-attacked. He was able to surprise us, being hidden by the mist. I had no bombs left, and as my right hand was useless, could not put up a fight. I was taken prisoner. I was taken to a German Field Dressing Station where my hand was bandaged. I was sent to a hospital in Cologne, arriving there on 29/9/17, and remained there till 8/12/17. The treatment here was fair, but the supply of medical necessities and food was short. On discharge I went to Limburg Lager, leaving at the end of March for Parchim Lager. From here I was sent to work in a woollen factory. The work was hard and the hours long – 12 hours a shift. I was here till after the Armistice. When I knew of the Armistice I ceased work.</i>

In December, the prisoners 'on commando' were collected at Parchim where I was in the Lazarette with the Spanish Grippe.

On 4th January 1919, I left for Stettin crossing to Copenhagen, and embarking there on the SS 'Formosa' and arriving at Leith on 18th January 1919.

I saw Captain Kane of the New Guinea Expeditionary Force in an Officers Lager at Furstenberg. Three other Australians were with him, but I do not know their names.

When I was captured, L/Cpl Anderson, 'D' Coy, 31st Bn, was also taken. We had been sheltering in the same shell hole. Anderson was wounded in the right thigh. A German NCO told me he would be put in a pill-box. I did not see Anderson again."

"The Argus" Thursday 1 March 1917

The Countess of Darnley, who was formerly Miss Florence Morphy, of Melbourne, was the recipient of a handsome New Year's gift from a number of Australian officers, whom she and Lord Darnley entertained at Christmas dinner. The present consisted of a silver rose-bowl, engraved with the rising sun, the badge of the Australian Imperial Forces, and inside was an inscription expressing the hope that the perfume of flowers which might grace the bowl in future years would be as fragrant to Lady Darnley as the memory of the sojourn of the donors at Cobham Hall would be to them. Lord and Lady Darnley have given over the state apartments of their residence, Cobham Hall, Gravesend, Kent, to the authorities for a residence for 50 Australian officers, and it was a contingent of these, headed by Lieut-Colonel S. W. G. Annand, 2nd Pioneer Battalion, and Lieutenant Col F. W. Toll, 31st Battalion, who made the presentation.

Awarded the Distinguished Service Order:- ***"This Officer has been with the Brigade since its formation and has always done his duty in a most conscientious and efficient manner.***

During the operations in the SUEZ CANAL ZONE he was untiring in his efforts to obtain a high standard of efficiency and has always been an example to Officers and men.

Lt Col Toll displayed great gallantry all through the operations of 19th/20th July 1916 at PETILLON. He was slightly wounded at the commencement of the action and before the assault was made and he lost heavily in Officers and men. He led the 3rd and 4th waves over the parapet himself. Before reaching the enemy trenches 13 Officers had been killed or wounded, including three Company Commanders. Lt Col Toll personally took charge and pushed on, making vigorous efforts to consolidate the position won, reconnoitring the enemy's defences and taking prisoners. On retirement he organised the troops on our original front line."

Colonel F. W. Toll.

distinguished career.

Farewelled by Citizens.

Athlete, horseman, rifle and revolver shot, soldier, game-hunter, administrator, business-man, member of public and semi-public organisations and bodies— these are only a few of the activities which Colonel F. W. Toll has crowded into his life, which is romantic.

In every walk his career has been one of achievement, and he had to fight every inch of the way in the uphill battle the same as he did in the South African War and in the Great War. In his early soldiering days in Charters Towers he rose rapidly from the ranks and was the envy of 'Southerners, who referred to him as the "boy" officer. But he was made of stern material, and by dint of hard adaptability, energy and resource, and brilliant passes in examinations, he lived down the prejudice against Northerners and won through.

Enlisting as a private in the South African war, he returned, a Brevet-Major while still in his 20's; the rank being the more distinguished because that of Brevet can only be won by outstanding service in the field. Later he attained the full rank of Major, enlisted in the Great War, quickly rose to be a Colonel. Smashed in the battle of Fromelles, crushed in the battle of Bapaume, and broken in the terrific fighting at Polygon Wood, he was at last finally compelled to go into hospital after clinging to his line for three months, and at a time when he was on the verge of being appointed a Brigadier. He was in hospital when the Armistice was signed, and returned to Australia impaired in health. Being subjected to recurring illness, he leaves Mackay next, week to seek medical skill in the search for a return to good health.

His boyhood days were spent in Charters Towers, then in its heyday where his father was a prominent business man and held the office of Mayor for many years. Colonel Toll was educated at the Normal School and later at the Brisbane Grammar School, and pursued his studies at a private college on returning to the Towers. His entry into what afterwards proved a distinguished military career was made in the Charters Towers voluntary cadets, and he soon became an officer. Later he joined the Defence Force, rising to Junior Lieutenant of the Kennedy Infantry Regiment, and from Junior Lieutenant to Adjutant and Captain in command of "D" Company. This brought him to the South African War period, for which he enlisted as an ordinary "Digger". Before proceeding further with the story it is appropriate to mention that Colonel Toll had taken an active part in athletics on the Towers, principally as a Rugby Union footballer. It is common knowledge that in these days the Towers could field a side equal to anything in Australia. It was that great old general, Harry Speakman, who coached the players along correct lines. Speakman had previously come to Australia with an English touring team, and his services were, secured by the Towers Rugby Union. Colonel Toll had the honour of playing representative wing three-quarter for the Towers in a number of engagements. He was fleet of foot, a sure take, and a good ball handler, backed up by plenty of initiative, which ideally fitted him for the position. Outside of football, his recreation turned to rifle and revolver shooting, at both of which he was an adept and shot in Australian teams. He has a fund of reminiscences of the revolver shooting competitions, and pays a warm tribute to Miss Savage, whom he regarded as one of the best that ever pulled a trigger. It was in 1899 that Colonel Toll enlisted for service in the South African War. He quickly gained his commission and did special service with the Imperial Regiment for 12 months, after which he returned to Australia and re-enlisted, going across as second in command of the 5th Q.I.B., and gained the rank of Brevet-Major. After over 100 engagements he was again back in Australia with high rank, two medals, seven bars, and five times mentioned in despatches. Eight bars were the highest possible number a soldier could attain, and Colonel Toll, then Brevet-Major, held seven. With the intention of accepting a commanding position in the South African Constabulary, Colonel Toll shipped again for the Transvaal, but he never finalised negotiations and went game hunting instead for 12 months in the jungles and hills of Limpopo, and had exciting experiences with lions, wolves, and man-sized baboons. His party also went in search of diamonds, but did not meet with success.

Back in Australia, he returned to civilian life and was appointed manager of the Mt. Molloy sawmill. His father had been a contractor and miller, and Colonel Toll from early youth was taught everything there was to be learnt about, timber and was well fitted for the position. He held the full rank of Major on the unattached list, and took an active interest in the cadet movement, rifle clubs and other military activities in the Mareeba district. In 1912 he was awarded the V.D., the Colonial Auxiliary Force's officers decoration for 20 years' commission. From Mt. Molloy he enlisted in the Great War in 1914, and commanded the 3rd Battalion naval and military forces in New Guinea, where he gained the rank of Colonel. During the absence of the late Colonel Pethbridge, C.M.G., he was Acting-Administrator at New Guinea, with headquarters at Rabaul. It was when he was at Rabaul that he learned the sad tidings that his son, Corporal Vivian Toll, had been killed in action at Gallipoli. He then applied to serve in the Gallipoli campaign, and went to Egypt in command of the 31st Battalion, A.I.F., comprising two companies and headquarters staff of Queensland troops and two Victorian companies. Shortly after arrival in Egypt the troops were withdrawn from

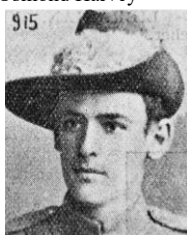
Gallipoli and he proceeded to France and Belgium, fighting in numbers of battles, including Fromelles, Fleurs, Bapaume, Ypres, Passchendale Ridge, Polygon Wood, and on the Hindenburg Line. Three times was he severely wounded, the last being at Polygon Wood in November 1917; but he did not leave until January 1918, when, broken in health, crushed gassed, and suffering internal injuries, he was compelled to go to "Blighty," and was still in hospital when the Armistice was signed. From these injuries he has never completely recovered, but with that indomitable courage and determination, which marked the man, he has borne his suffering in silence. His awards in the campaign were D.S.O. with bar, 1914 Star, G.S. medal, Victory medal with palm, and mentioned in despatches three times.

Since the Great War, Colonel Toll has held the position of War Service Homes Commissioner, and has managed several sawmills. Three years ago yesterday, he came to Mackay in charge of the local branch of Wilson & Hart. He has held office as vice President of the Brisbane branch of the R.S.S.I.L.A. from 1924-27; President Mackay branch, from 1928-30; he is Government representative on the Mackay Hospitals Board, President of the Mackay Rifle Union, and Commandant's representative on the North Queensland Rifle Association.

On Monday he leaves for Townsville to attend the annual meeting of the N.Q.R.A., and intends later to journey to Brisbane for medical attention. A gentleman, soldier, and a man, all will join in the wish that his restoration to health will be speedy and complete.

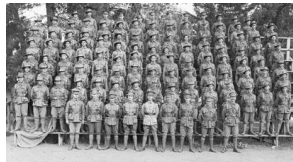

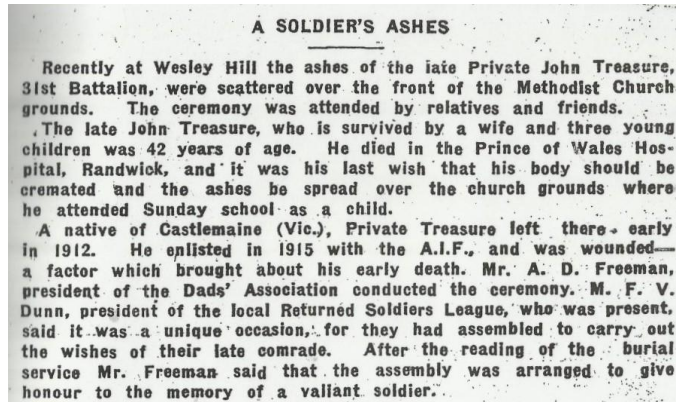

The body was brought in by two of my mates, that were with me, and I saw it lying in the trench. He was buried near the trench that we were holding, about 800 yards in front of Le Transloy. A cross was erected temporarily and in July, a nice cross was erected, with his name and number on it. He was well known and liked by all his comrades."***

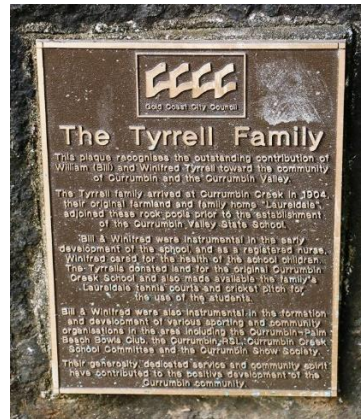

This plaque recognises the outstanding contribution of William (Bill) and Winifred Tyrell toward the community of Currumbin and the Currumbin Valley.

The Tyrell family arrived at Currumbin Creek in 1904, their original farmland and family home "Laureidale", adjoined these rock pools prior to the establishment of the Currumbin Valley State School.

Bill & Winifred were instrumental in the early development of the school, and as a registered nurse, Winifred cared for the health of the school children.

The Tyrells donated land for the original Currumbin Creek School and also made available the family's Laureidale tennis courts and cricket pitch for the use of students.

Bill & Winifred were also instrumental in the formation and development of various sporting and community organisations in the area including the Currumbin - Palm Beach Bowls Club, the Currumbin RSL, Currumbin Creek School Committee and the Currumbin Show Society.

Their generosity, dedicated service and community spirit have contributed to the positive development of the Currumbin community.
