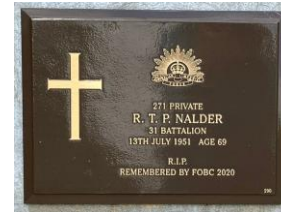

*"One of the men in the barn at the time 3 shells burst amongst them (see Stubbin entry) caused 30 casualties out of 35 in our platoon. One cross bearing 11 names was erected, of the others – Tom Lynn, Stubbin, Ruskett, Prime, Ross.  
 He was killed by a shell while asleep in a barn in front line at Vaire, near Corbie, buried just outside the farmhouse, near a canal bank, not far from Villers Bretonneux.  
 We were in a barn at Bouzancourt, near Hamel when a shell burst on a barn in which Stubbin and 34 of us were sleeping. He and several others were killed outright, and a few died of wounds, while 14 of us were wounded and in hospital. I saw him buried with 9 or 10 others near the barn. We erected a cross giving all the details. Pte RH Noble, # 3604.*

*This shell killed or wounded 27 other ranks. Lt H Miller, 'A' Coy, in charge of burial party that interred this man and 9 others at the left rear corner of the Farmhouse at Bouzancourt, (map ref I.34d) A cross erected over each body, Bn Padre Malcolmson buried them. Only arrived the night before, so taking shelter in best places we could find. "*

**FATAL HEART ATTACK**

**MR. R. B. NEWHAM SUDDEN DEATH AT MURWILLUMBAH**

*Mr. Robert Bruce Newham (45), of Murwillumbah, died suddenly of a heart attack at the Club House Hotel, Murwillumbah, about 11 o'clock yesterday morning. The late Mr. Newham had been residing at the Club House Hotel for the past 12 months, being engaged on the Tweed in the interests of Grice's Ltd., the well-known radio and musical firm of Brisbane.*

*The deceased, who was the son of the late Rev. C. S. Newham, of Manchester, England, was born at Lancaster Gate, London, in 1888. He was a nephew of Lady Hilton-Young, the wife of Sir E. Hilton-Young, Minister for Health in the present British Cabinet. Lady Hilton-Young was formerly the wife of Captain R. F. Scott, who perished at the South Pole in 1913. The late Mr. Newham first went to sea and travelled round the globe, twice before coming to Australia, where he took up acting and stage work. He travelled Australia with various companies as an actor and was well known in many southern towns as a manager. In 1916 the deceased gentleman entered for active service and held the rank of Sergeant in the 31st Battalion, A.I.F. He also held a flying certificate. At the conclusion of the war, he took up stage work again in London, returning to Australia in 1919 to enter upon a business career. For many years he was in the employ of Messrs. Gordon and Gotch, Melbourne, prior to going to Brisbane to join Grice's Ltd. The late Mr. Newham appeared in the Murwillumbah Amateur Operatic Society's production, "Brewster's Millions," recently, when he played the part of Lawyer Grant. His wife and one son, Mr. Harvey Bruce Newham, both of Melbourne, survive him, as well as his mother, who resides at Indooroopilly, Brisbane, three sisters and one brother. The sisters are: Mrs. E. D. Eglinton (Coolangatta), Miss Guen Newham (England) and Miss Eileen Dorothy Newham (Indooroopilly). Mr. Cecil Bruce Newham, of Coolangatta, is a brother. The funeral will leave Church House, Coolangatta, at noon to-day for the Tweed Heads cemetery. Members of Murwillumbah Amateur Operatic Society last night paid respects to their late fellow player by accompanying the hearse bearing his remains to Coolangatta. Two carloads, including the President (Mr. W. F. Hatfield), and the Secretary (Mr. E. W. Hatfield), made the trip, whilst the car of the late Mr. Newham also was driven down by members. A wreath subsequently was placed on the casket.*

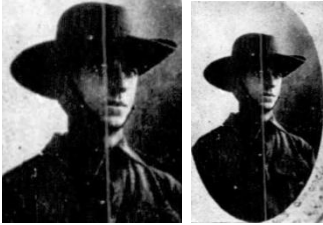

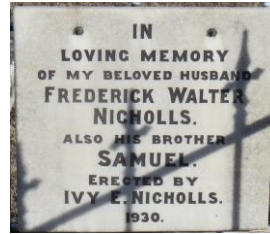

is a town on the Coast of France. He is going to attend a school there for Officers & as I am his Batman I am going with him. We will leave by Motor Bus from Beugues [Becquigny] about 3 Kilos distant from here & will go to Charleroi (Belgium) 25 miles away & then take the Express to Valenciennes, [Valenciennes] Mons & Cambrai & then down Boulogne way. It will be a fine trip & will take 12 days. I will be away for about 4 weeks. Coming back Lieut Nix is getting 5 days leave to see his Brothers Grave at Bapaume, & he will very likely go through Paris on our way back. He is going over to Soire Chateau tomorrow to draw some money for me. I will get about £4 & we will have to go steady with our money because food is so scarce in Belgium & terribly dear too. The towns in France are beginning to get a bit livelier now that the war has finished & the Estaminets are starting with their dancing & drinking. Estaminets are on the same lines as Cabarets."

"I am at present at the 3rd Army Military School with **Lieut Nix** as his Batman. We left Felleries where the Battalion is on the 9th, & went by Motor Bus to Charleroi in Belgium. We crossed the Belgian Border about 9 o'clock & arrived at Charleroi at 1.30 pm.

We stopped here until 9 am next morning. It is a fine big City & is as busy as Sydney. You can get everything you want here which is surprising after considering the rough time Belgium has had. Things are terribly dear. I had a few meals there & one shop charged me 5 Francs (4/2) & I thought that a very good reason for pinching his knife fork & spoon which I did. We left Charleroi (pronounced by the Belgians Sharlewarr) at 9 am & passed 20 Ammunition trains of Fritz's which our airmen blew up. Most of the Rolling Stock I have seen in Belgium are German, still with the German writing on it. We travelled to Mons in a captured German train Engine & all. We followed Canals for miles & French peasantry were busy hauling the boats up the Canals. We arrived at Mons at about 4 pm & stopped there 8 hours. It is a fine big place & is famous in the "retreat from Mons." We left Mons & called at Valenciennes and then went on to Lille. We decided to stop in the city that night after waiting 14 hours for a train. Lille rivals Sydney in the size of the city & the beautiful squares & buildings.

I met a Frenchman & he took me home & his wife made Supper for me & gave me a bed for the night & breakfast next morning.

We left Lille at about 2 O'clock and passed through Loos, La Basse & Bethune. La Basse is no longer there as it is levelled to the ground every building in it. We arrived at Etaples at 12 next day & stopped there till 12 next day & went to Abbeville & from there to Eu. We came out to here in a Motor Lorry.

It is a Seaside resort & there are hundreds of fine Mansions here belonging to the French aristocracy. We can see for miles along the sea coast. We expect to leave here on February 1st en route for Bapaume & Cambrai as Nix is going to see his brothers grave about 3 Kilos out of Bapaume. **Lieut Nix** is billeted in a big house in the town. There are only a few Australians here mostly Tommies but it is a rotten quiet hole. I passed over a lot of old battlefields through ruined towns all the way down & the Germans will have a big job to do if they have to build them up again.

On the route we took the rails were smashed every few yards & they have only had time to repair one set & that's the reason why we took 6 days on the journey. When I get back to the Battalion I expect to get leave to Paris & I will be able to see the great statesmen at the peace Conference. I am going to wire home for £10 to go on leave with. The Paris edition of the Daily Mail has a photo of Billy Hughes walking down the Champs Elysee in Paris. I see by the papers that Victoria beat NSW at Cricket. I wish I was there. I am satisfied that Australia is the best place on earth. This is a rotten place although that trip through the Valley of the Rhone through Marseilles to Havre is hard to beat. Of course, I have been mostly in the devastated areas of France & I cannot judge the rest of the Country by the War area.

### Lieutenant H. J. Nix

Military honours were accorded the remains of Lieutenant H. J. Nix yesterday afternoon. Dressed in a Union Jack, the coffin was borne on a horse-drawn gun-carriage from St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Creek-street, to the Toowong cemetery. At the graveside a salute was fired by members of the Royal Australian Engineers and Royal Australian Artillery, while former comrades stood to attention. The "Last Post" was sounded by a bugler. The District Commandant (Brigadier E. M. Williams) was represented by Major W. Buttner. Members of the 15-26th Battalion were present, also of the 31st Battalion, A.I.F., with which the late Lieutenant Nix served during the war. The services at the church and the cemetery were conducted by the Rev. Norman Millar.

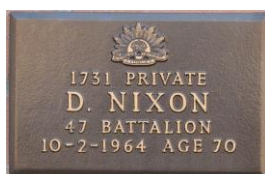
Lieutenant Nix, who was aged 51 years, died in Rosemount Hospital on Saturday night, after an illness of nine months occasioned by war injuries. He served for five and a half years in the Kennedy Regiment, and in 1910 joined the Australian Instructional Corps, serving at Bundaberg, Rockhampton, and Brisbane. In 1917 he left Australia for active service with the 31st Battalion, A.I.F. He is survived by his widow, three sons, and two daughters.

Party was divided into two parties of 1 NCO and 10 men with Lewis Gun as covering parties, and Assault party consisted of Lieut Jennings, MC, and 20 OR. Covering parties were posted in J.34.d.4.0 and J.34.d.9.0. Lieut Thompson, MC, O/C Raid, was established at latter point with telephones and Pte Mildare, the latter to act as interrupter. The Assault party moved out and started wire cutting about 1.30 a.m. the two Bangalore Torpedoes being taken out by two sappers A.E. for use if necessary. Three belts of wire

*had been cut and party were on fourth when they were heard and M.G. fire and bombs were directed at them. The party sustained casualties – 3 killed and 7 wounded – and as the element of surprise had gone, it was impossible to carry on with the raid. Party withdrew to our lines with all the wounded and bodies of two men. The body of the third man had to be left in enemy wire. An attempt was made to recover it, but it was impossible as it was within bombing range.”*

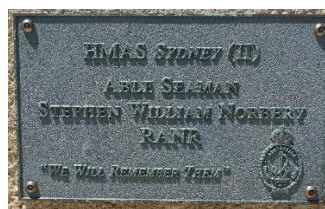

*Robert John Nudd (34), commercial traveller, was charged with having been under the influence of liquor while in charge of a motor car in Sylvan Road, Toowong, on June 7, and with having resisted Sergeant Henry. It was stated by the prosecutor that the sergeant saw defendant walk over to a motor car, and try to start it. The sergeant had some difficulty in getting defendant out of the car, and he resisted practically all the way to the watchhouse. Defendant, who pleaded guilty to both charges, was fined a total of £10/10/, with the alternative of one month and 48 hours' imprisonment.*

Robert John Nudd, 43, insurance canvasser, was very drunk, said Senior Sergeant W. Kiddell when Nudd appeared in the Police Court today. Nudd pleaded guilty to a charge that on June 24, at Albert Street. Brisbane, he was found under the influence of liquor whilst in charge of a motor car. Senior Sergeant Kiddell said that Nudd was seen to cross Queen Street against the red light yesterday afternoon. When called on to stop he failed to do so and almost collided with a tram. Tile constable on point duty stopped him after crossing the street. When Nudd got out of the car he could hardly stand up and was very drunk. Nudd had previously been before the court on two similar charges, one in 1929 and one in 1936. Nudd told the court he had been having. a lot of worry lately and that was what caused him to take so much drink. Mr. Burne: You might have killed yourself or somebody else; but fortunately, you didn't. Mr. Burne fined Nudd £15. in default imprisonment for two ' months. He allowed two months to pay the fine.*
