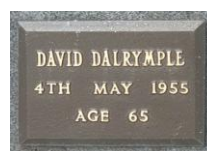

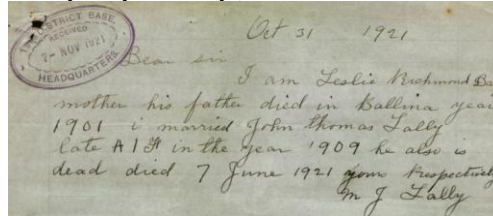

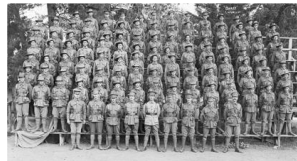

After we had gained our objective on morning of 27th Sep, it was necessary to check our position etc by compass bearing. It was whilst doing this duty that he was hit by a shell and killed instantly. He had only left me a few minutes previously but I could not get definite information for some hours after. The battle was still in progress and enemy attacking made matters difficult. His poor body was afterwards buried on the battlefield close to where he fell, in SE corner of the wood near a place known as Cameron House. The registration of these graves could not be done as the ground was still being fought on, but I can assure you that it will be done as soon as possible. It is difficult to describe details of these affairs, but I hope these meagre lot will assist you in giving information to the enquirer. I wrote to his people in Queensland last October, but I don't think I mentioned about the registration difficulty. Lt Col F W Toll

Killed outright by a shell on the morning of 27th Sep. during our advance at Polygon Wood while in a very advanced position. He was acting as Battalion Intelligence Officer at the time of his death. Was with Lt Thompson, 'A' Coy, I Platoon- " He left me a minute before. I ducked as a shell came and it apparently hit him - about 20yds away- and he was dead when I got to him. Struck in the side. Buried in eastern corner of Polygon Wood, just inside the wood. The grave was not marked then, and I'm sure it hasn't been since. The place has been under heavy shell fire ever since.
This Officer was killed during a reconnaissance in the operations at Polygon Wood on 27th Sep 1917.

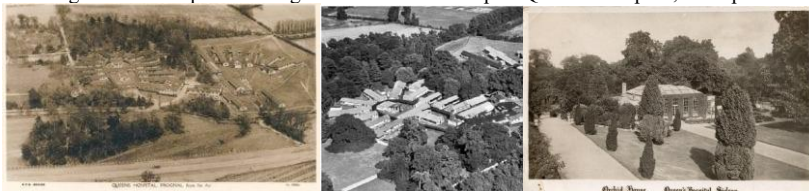

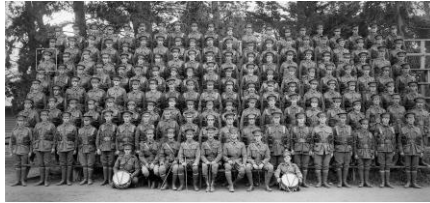

"Re 1130 Cpl C.G. Davey, C Coy, 31st Bn, killed in action 12-4-18. We, the Platoon, which Davey was in, moved from Daours on the night of 9th April, and went into the front line at Bouzencourt. We were heavily shelled while we were there and on the 10th about 1.30 pm some 10 men were killed and 14 wounded, more or less seriously. On the night of the 11th, Cpl Davey was in charge of a patrol, of which I was one of the party, and we patrolled the village of Bouzencourt and then "No Man's Land", immediately in front of our position. We patrolled without incident, although we searched all buildings cautiously and carefully. Davey was always a good leader, being careful and considerate. It was getting towards dawn 12th April, when we came in off patrol and Davey and Plummer went to a trench. Plummer had supervised in digging, and I was nearby. Plummer was standing on top and Davey was sitting down in the trench when a shell burst on the trench, Plummer fell and it was soon seen that Davey had been hit. Davey was hit in the chest by a piece of shell as well as in other parts of the body, and he was placed on a stretcher, but died almost immediately, and Plummer was taken out when Davey died. Plummer received a nasty wound to the neck which bled freely, and on the arm. Plummer lingered on till the 20th April and died in No.6 Gen Hpl. That night Davey was buried beside the lads who were killed on the 10th. I have not had the opportunity since, of visiting the spot, and I was wounded the same day, and we have been on another sector since. I have no doubt that the grave will be registered as there are several buried there, and all have crosses on their graves. When he was buried, there was no Military Cemetery there, so he was buried on the field. We expect to be near there soon and I shall visit the spot, and should I be able to gain any more information I shall let you know. He is buried at Bouzencourt, which is a small village between Saill le Sec and Hamel, on the Somme canal. To get to Bouzencourt, leave Corbie and go up to the Somme canal on the left-hand side, cross over the bridge leading into Bouzencourt and about 100yds up the road, turn on road to the right and you come to a large farm house to the right, just past the farm house near some tall trees is where the last resting place of Gordon Davey will be found. During my time in the Platoon, I always found him a very fine chap, amicable and generous. He always looked after his section and was liked by all. We all regretted his death. I was indeed sorry as he was endeavouring to get back home to his mother since his father died. Should you be writing to his mother, I shall feel obliged if you would convey to her my sincerest sympathy in the loss of such a brave son who so willingly gave his life for liberty and humanity, and that the world may be easier for generations to come to live in. In appearance he always looked every inch a soldier and always took pride in keeping himself tidy. He was a block of a lad and stood about 5'7 1/2" in height."

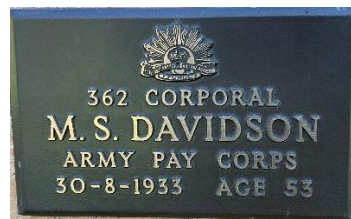

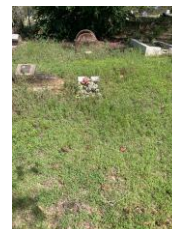

Davies joined the instructional staff at the Royal Military College, Duntroon in January 1913. He was one of the captains of the guard at the naming ceremony for Canberra on 12 March 1913. Davies married Dorothea 'Tommy' Cunningham of Tuggeranong on 22 April 1916 at Cairo, Egypt. He had 16 years commission service with the Leicestershire Regiment, been an Instructor at the Signalling School in India, Instructor of Musketry at the Royal Military College, Duntroon and had served in the Boer War. According to his sister-in-law he had run away from home to enlist in the Boer War. At various times he commanded the 31st, 32nd, 55th and 60th Battalions before being given command of the 8th Brigade in November 1917. He was awarded the DSO for his command of the 32nd Battalion after the Battle of Polygon Wood on 27/28 September 1917, when he re-organised the defences and inflicted heavy losses on the Germans when they counter attacked. The French awarded the Croix de Guerre to Davies for the "operations on 8/9 August 1918 when an advance of seven miles was made and 831 prisoners, 22 guns, 85 machine guns and vast quantities of war material captured", and for the advance on Foucaourt on 27 August, at Bussu on 5 September, Le Mesnil and the Vendelles-Vermand line the following day.

After resigning his commission in the AIF he served in Russia during 1919 with the British Army but returned to Australia to spend Christmas with his wife and daughter at Lanyon. He left in March 1920 to serve in India and did not see his family again. He reportedly died on 10 December 1946.

At Villers Carbonnel, he and one other were killed with a shell, and Pte Patrick Kelly, KIA, near Perrone, both killed by same shell

Reburied Assevillers New British Cemetery, France, Plot II, Row E, Grave No 1

With the opportunity of visiting the Australian battlefields of France, I was asked what would be of interest to me. Apart from the Fromelles cemetery, Menin Gate, there was the area of Villers Carbonnel.

This was the scene of action where my grandfather received his Military Cross, but of as much interest, it was the place where Pte Daniel Brodie Davis, MM, #3016A, 'A' Coy, III Platoon, 31st Bn, was killed.

Having discovered the military record of my grandfather, for my children's benefit, I investigated their mother's family tree. There was one relative from Queensland who was killed on the same day -29th August 1918, Pte Dan Brodie Davis, MM, same battalion, same stunt.

Dan was born on the 21st December 1892 to Richard and Agnes (nee Brodie) DAVIS at ANTHONY, Qld, on the Fassifern Valley railway line. Daniel was to be one of a family of three girls and six boys born to Agnes and Richard DAVIS. Richard (Dick) was the elder brother of Arthur Hoey Davis (aka Steele Rudd). So, Dan was the nephew of Arthur Hoey Davis (i.e. the nephew of 'Dad and Dave').

Soon after Dan was born, his father Richard was promoted to the position of Station Master at WALLUMBILLA some twenty-two miles east of ROMA on the western line. In 1905, Richard was transferred, and the family moved to MILES on the western line, where Richard took up duties as Stationmaster. They had lived in the settlement of WALLUMBILLA for about 13 years. The family remained in MILES for about 7 years. Little is known of his school days and early working life, and in 1912, his father is again promoted to Station Master at ALLORA. In June 1914, Dan's name appears in the List of Employees in the Traffic Branch of the Railway as a lad-porter, also at ALLORA. Dan appears to have followed his father and two elder brothers

into work on the Queensland Railways, though his career was short lived as he enlisted with the 31st Battalion on the 30th December 1915.

After initial training at Enoggera, Dan was allocated to the 6th Reinforcements, 31st Battalion, which set sail from Sydney on the HMAT Ceramic on the 14th April 1916, arriving at Port Said, Egypt, 16th May 1916. After a short stopover, they sailed from Alexandria for Plymouth, England arriving 16 June 1916. Further training in England, until sailing for France and joining the 31st Battalion on 22nd September 1916 in France.

Dan's first action was on the 12th October 1916 when the battalion took part in a raiding operation (Franks Force), by one captain, four subalterns and 100 other ranks, on the "Chicken Run" trenches, on the Houplines sector. This was reported as very successful in the battalion diary, with 3 prisoners, 1 MG and a quantity of equipment being captured. Unfortunately, Dan received a "blighty", a gunshot wound to the left arm and embarked at Boulogne on the HS St Andrew for England.

The following months were spent convalescing and training in Australian camps (Perham Downs, Parkhouse, Bulford, and Hurdcott) on the Salisbury Plains. Interspersed with a case of the "mumps" and the obligatory "AWL". Then in October 1917, (twelve months after his wounding) Dan rejoined the 31st Battalion in France and was assigned to III Platoon, 'A' Coy.

On 15th March 1918 the Battalion moved into the front line in the WYSCHAETE Sector, taking over from the 59th Battalion on the WAMBEEK SPUR, with the 32nd Battalion on the right flank and the 29th Battalion on the left flank. Active patrolling was carried out daily and the German artillery were also active with several barrages of HE and Gas Shells daily, usually in early morning and evening hours, when weather conditions were calmest with fogs and mists. On the 23rd March, Dan reported sick, initially with influenza, though later diagnosed as "Albuminuria", brought on by the effects of gas. After recuperating at the 32nd Stationary Hospital at Wimereux, Dan was able to rejoin the battalion in the field in the BOUZENCOURT sector on the 25th April 1918.

Throughout May 1918, the battalion was in the front line in the CORBIE Sector, with several active patrols, going out nightly. Dan, most probably, being involved in these activities. In early June the battalion was relieved and proceeded to billets in RIVERY. Then on 15th June the battalion moved into the FRANVILLERS Sector taking over the Roma lines, being relived again on the 26th June. Early days of July were taken up with training then the battalion going into the line again in the DERNANCOURT sector.

The 8th August 1918 saw the battalion involved in the Major Operation starting from Villers-Bretonneux. 'A' Company was on the right of the battalion sector and in the fore of the advance of some 12,000 yards under heavy shell and MG fire. During the advance and consolidation, Dan and his stretcher-bearer mate Joe Devonshire were in the thick of the fighting as reflected in their recommendations for the Military Medal:

He also assisted in stretcher bearing on 9 August for 29th Battalion in their attack on Vauvillers and for units of the 2nd Australian Division who passed through our line, on each occasion showing an absolute disregard for his own personal safety and setting a splendid example for his comrades."

His bravery was beyond all praise."*

Another man recognised that day and who probably assisted Dan, also a Queenslander, was Pte James Gibb.

"During the attack of the 31st Battalion from Warfusee-Abancourt on 8 August 1918, this man did wonderful work as a stretcher bearer. He not only brought in the wounded of our own Battalion, but went out under a deadly machine-gun fire to the vicinity of Vauvillers and brought in many wounded cavalry men (5th

Dragoon Guards). During the attack of 29th Battalion on the 9th, he assisted in bringing in many of their wounded, the work being carried out under exceptional heavy shell and machine-gun fire. Throughout the whole of the operations, he set a wonderful example to all around him by his bravery and devotion to duty." Again, on the 29th August, the 31st Battalion was in the advance to the Somme Canal to the south of Peronne. The enemy had retired to the eastern side of the Somme River. 'A' Coy established posts on the western bank and came under direct fire from 77mm guns on the high ground on the other side of the river and continual MG fire and sniping from the eastern bank of the river. One of these shells killed both Dan and Pte # 240 Patrick Kelly. Paddy Kelly was an original 'A' Coy member, having been wounded at Fromelles and on a second occasion whilst in the WARNETON front line sector. Joe Devonshire later wrote to Dan's father stating "*Just a few lines to let you know the sad news about my best pal, and one of the gamest and best men that ever put on a soldier's uniform. We were advancing on to the river Somme, about fifty yards from the bank, under one of the heaviest barrages that we have had to face. The enemy was firing point blank at us as we were moving forward, and it was poor Dan's lot to go. He and one other were killed with a shell, and five wounded. He was killed instantaneously.*" Joe, also in this letter suggested "*He got a Military Medal for bravery on the 8th, and was recommended for a bar on the 29th (the day he was killed).*" There is nothing in Dan's record of this second recommendation though notification of the award came through to battalion on the 29th which may have led to the confusion. Also, Stretcher Bearer Pte # 662 William **John Gartner** of 'A' Coy, was reported nearby when Dan was killed. Pte Gartner received the Military Medal "*For gallantry and devotion to duty near Villers Carbonnel on 29 August 1918, during the advance on the Somme, Private Gartner displayed exceptional courage in attending wounded in the open under heavy field and machine-gun fire. He set a fine example and showed great disregard for personal safety.*" Dan and Paddy were buried at the time in a grave on the banks of the Somme River, a cross erected with names and battalion colours. So it was that I was privileged to go to Asservillers New British Cemetery and pay due respect to the nephew of the 'Dad and Dave' literary classic, about ordinary battling Australians. Dan was the family hero, who was lost in the Great War. Dan, a railway man in youth, now lies next to the rail line of the "Eurostar".

Then I was sent to the lager at Dulmen, from there the Germans sent me out 'on commando' from a place called Burgsteinfurt. We were put to work among scrap iron and timber. My wound was still running; in fact, it is still running. This commando was made up of 40 British Prisoners of War, of whom 10 were Australians. I was in the hospital till 30th Apr 1917 and was then transferred to the lager. I remained in Munster lager till 7th Dec 1917. Then I was moved to Mannheim where I passed the medical board for internment in a neutral country. I left Mannheim on 26th Dec 1917 and went to the Chateau d'Oex Region in Switzerland. Most of my time there I was in hospital (the 'A.S.A'). The Swiss people were very kind to us, and I received good treatment in hospital. With others I left Switzerland on 11th Jun 1918. We crossed France from the frontier post of Pont Arlier to Le Havre and came across to Southampton in the SS 'Panama', arriving on 14th June. Gordon Davison, son of Mr and Mrs. G. Davison, of Casino, in a lengthy letter to his mother, announces his arrival in Switzerland. Pte. Davison had for many months, been a prisoner of war in Germany, but in December last was exchanged. He writes that it is grand to be free again, to go where you like, and quite a pleasant change after the barbed wire and Hun guards. He is very pleased to be out of Germany. They treated him very badly when he was taken prisoner, and although he had to state in his letters that he was all right, he was nearly starved. 'My experience in Germany,' he writes, 'I shall never forget. Only for the Red Cross parcels, we would have starved. Our Christmas dinner consisted of a small piece of black bread and a cup of so-called coffee. There was also soup, but it was not fit to eat. That is what I existed on for three weeks before leaving for Switzerland. No one knows how anxiously we looked forward to getting our parcels; from the Red Cross. While in Germany I received a parcel from the Red Cross, Casino, and a parcel from the Girls' league, for which I ask you to thank them'. Pte. Davison says he is now all right, except for his wounded arm, which has been operated on in Switzerland, and he hopes with the kind treatment he is now receiving that eventually it will be all right. He has his Australian uniform and draws £2 10s per month. Switzerland, he says, is a beautiful country, and there is plenty of sport. The weather is beautiful, and he does not feel the cold as he did in Germany. He had his pass for Switzerland in July last, after he had been in Germany twelve months but was not transferred until the end of December. He would rather take his chance in the firing line at any time than be a prisoner of war in the hands of the Germans, who, he says, are not civilized. On Tuesday evening Casino honored the first soldier to return to the town after having been a prisoner of war in Germany, in the person of Private Gordon Davison, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Davison. For seventeen months Private Davison was in the clutches of the enemy, having been picked up wounded on the field, and he now carries about with him as a memento of this disaster a piece of bone that has been taken from his shattered arm. Tuesday evening's function was arranged by a number of friends of the popular young Casinoite, prominent figures in the organisation being Mrs. E. Crittenden and Miss May Klaus. There was a large attendance, indicating the respect in which the returned soldier and his parents are held in the town, and also the thankfulness of the residents for what 'Dummy' Davison had helped to accomplish on the other side and joy at his safe return to his people after such a trying experience. Dancing was indulged in, interspersed with musical items in which Mrs. A. O. Simpson, Miss Vera Rea, Messrs. Clark and Hopkinson took part. The dance music was rendered by the Casino Band, Mrs. Simpson, Misses Catt and Crawley, while Miss Ruby Mackney played the accompaniments for the singing. An adjournment was made for supper, over which the mayor presided. The tables were beautifully set out, and reflected credit on those responsible for this part of the entertainment. The mayor suitably referred to the heroism of Private Davison and the obligation which the people owed to him and his comrades who enabled them once more to live as free people. Mr. George Davison, father of the returned soldier, also spoke, but Private Davison was not so good before the battery of applause that he received on rising to respond as he was on the battlefield before the enemy's battery of artillery. He thanked everyone for their reception, and said that he was pleased to get back after a very trying time, during which he and others were sustained by the assistance they received through that excellent organisation, the Red Cross Society, who sent them parcels of food, without which they could not have lived. Dancing was again resumed and continued until mid-night. The refreshments were provided by the ladies, and thanks are due to those who so kindly contributed to a very pleasant evening's entertainment. Although the function was originally organized to welcome Private Davison, a couple of other lads were included in the welcome. These were Private T. J. Mullett, who returned some time ago seriously wounded, and Private J. Dempsey, the latter of whom resides at Boggabri, but was at one time employed in Mr. P. B. Robins' establishment at Casino. These soldiers, in addition to Private Davison, suitably acknowledged the compliment paid them.

Northern Star, Lismore, NSW, 7th Dec 1918

"The gifts from the Red Cross Society kept the prisoners in Germany alive." This is what Pte. Gordon Davison told the people who had gathered together to give him, Pte. Mullett and Pte. Dempsey a welcome home. Pte. Davison was reported missing and then that he had been killed. The news was received by his father, Mr. George Davison that he had been taken prisoner and was in Germany. After suffering many hardships and cruelties he was exchanged for a German prisoner and was sent to Switzerland, where he says he met with the other extreme of treatment from the Swiss. Ptes. Mullett and Dempsey also fought on the Western Front. The former humorously says 'that he did his best until he stopped a piece of ironmongery made in Germany. Pte. Dempsey was slightly gassed; and on being invalided to England experienced an attack of pleurisy and was eventually invalided home.

Casino Council has placed on record the following motion—"That the citizens of Casino desire to express their deep thankfulness that the great war in which our Empire and our Allies have been involved has been brought to a glorious and successful conclusion. While deploring the painful sacrifice of valuable lives of gallant men and lads and the pouring out of the national wealth, we feel that their sacrifices, have not been in vain, but that out of this terrible upheaval shall come lasting benefits to the citizens of the world. We desire to place on record our deep and lasting appreciation of the heroic deeds of our own Australian soldiers on the historic battlefields of Europe and the East."

Effect on his family: The Deards family lost their two eldest sons after they enlisted to fight for their country in WWI. Having died in Brisbane, Arthur's body was repatriated to Murwillumbah where he was buried along with two other local sons in the old cemetery in Murwillumbah. The bodies were later removed to make way for a park and the headstones replaced by a picnic shelter bearing the names of the returned heroes. The Deards dedicated an altar in their local church to their lost sons. In addition, Howard left behind a widowed wife and two young children who grew up without their father. At some time after his death, Amy seems to have sold the farm and moved to Sydney. She lived with their children at various addresses after the war, in Parramatta and at Katoomba, calling each one 'Uki', the location of their former farm near Murwillumbah. By Merridee Wouters

Re death of Cpl 461 Sydney Wilkinson, on 15th Mar 1917: *"I regret that I never had the pleasure of meeting and knowing your brother, for, to quote some of our rough country lads, and they are keen judges of men, he was a "dinkum" soldier — and that stands for everything with our boys and means that he made good. By a curious coincidence **Lieut. Dellit** has just come back to*

the base after being away five weeks. He tells me that he was with your brother, in fact standing "right alongside" of him, up in the front line, when he was hit by a machine gun bullet. He dropped at once, saying, "Oh dear!" This was about 2 o'clock in the afternoon."

"Lieut. Dellit arranged to have him taken to the dressing station, which was about 300 yards away. The bombardment, Lieut. Dellit says, was the worst he had ever been in. He says that Cpl Wilkinson was a splendid fellow in the line and always full of courage and grit and ready to help all and sundry. He repeated some of the above remarks and added, "By Jove", Corrie, "Wilkinson was a good chap and no mistake." My own batman, a very fine fellow by the name of Hardaker, helped to carry him along the trench. No stretcher was available, so they had to use one of the rubber ground sheets. Hardaker says it took them three hours to carry him 300 yards. You see, he was a big heavy man, and the unfortunate stretcher bearers at each step sank knee deep in the awful mud. All the time Fritz landed shells first on one parapet and then on the other, and yet not one of them was hit though all were splashed with mud from them. Poor old Hardaker told me the cold was intense."

Dening was a career foreign service officer; and he was promoted regularly across the span of years.

Dening was consular officer in 1938, when he was awarded an OBE. During the Second World War, he served on the staff of Louis Mountbatten, 1st Earl Mountbatten of Burma. He had become the Chief Political Adviser to the Supreme Allied Commander, South-East Asia Command when he was made a member or Companion in the Order of St Michael and St George in 1945. In an unusual move Dening became a whistle blower in a dispatch to the Foreign Office, London; stating that Mountbatten constantly ignored the advice of those he commanded and described him as a ‘obsequious sycophant desperate that British-Indian operations in southern French Indo-China would not tarnish his professional reputation or SEAC legacy’.

In 1950, Dening was an Assistant Under-Secretary of State in the Foreign Office when the King promoted him to be a Knight Commander of the Order of St Michael and St George. He was the British Political Representative in Tokyo in 1950-1951 and when full diplomatic relations were re-established, his role was an essential element of the transition.

Sir Esler appointed to be Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Tokyo on 6 May 1952. He was the Ambassador from 1952 through 1957.

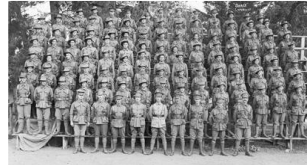


**Ambassador Denning laying a wreath in the Yokohama War Cemetery

pleasure as you know, is now a burden, the day of judgement has come and I have been found

wanting. Oh, Annie it's all too horrible. I know it will break your heart when you hear this sad news.

I have only made one mistake and that proved fatal. I know you have been always loving and true

during my absence, but it is with much pain and agony to relate that I have not. It is now about 18

months since that awful night. Oh, Annie, it makes me shudder to think of it. Now all is lost, and

death is very near. Everyone on this ship seems to be happy, but the boy you used to call your 'Jim'

and I am the saddest of them all. It was Sunday today and a nice day too, there was a Church

Parade on board and I was very much impressed with it. I was wishing that I was a Christian

instead of a poor sinner, but girlie I pray every night lately for you and me.

You have been far too good a wife for such a poor soul as me, and now in my days that I feel are

numbered, I pray that you will forgive me, seeing that it was the influence of another chap, that

encouraged me to do what I did, on that fateful night. You will no doubt learn from some of my

mates about my soldiering in France. I have seen terrible things and have had many narrow

escapes, but the dark hour is still in front of me, my life is worth very little now. I think this is about

all for now. Hoping you will not take this news too hard.

Now I will have to say that painful word 'Good-bye'.

God Bless you Annie,

Keep you alright,

In life's Dark hours,

May you always be bright."

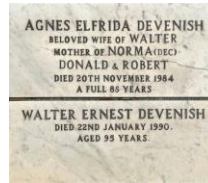

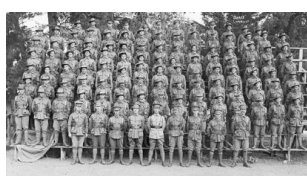

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SHOOTING AT DANDENONG.

Dingwall Found Not Guilty.

Hector Alexander Stewart Dingwall, aged 29 years, labourer, was placed on trial before Judge Williams, in General Sessions yesterday, on a charge of having shot at Thomas Hamilton Hustler, of Hampton Park, near Dandenong, with intent, to do him grievous bodily harm. Mr. Braham prosecuted for the Crown, and Mr. Ashkanasy, instructed by Messrs. Fraser and Hill, appeared for Dingwall, who pleaded not guilty.

Mr. Braham said that Hustler and his wife lived at Hampton Park, near Dandenong. Dingwall visited their house on Saturday evening, March 14, at about 6 o'clock, armed with a loaded gun, and said, "Hold up your hands, or I will blow your — brains out." When Mrs. Hustler, who was scrubbing the floor, turned, she saw that a gun was pointed at her. Dingwall said, "What do you mean by letting my cow out of the paddock?" Mrs. Hustler said that she knew nothing about it. She called to her husband in the maize field. Hustler ran up and asked accused for an explanation. Dingwall said, in effect, that he was going "to do for both of them." There was a struggle, and Ding-wall pulled the trigger. A bullet whizzed past Hustler's left side. Hustle held Dingwall while his wife telephoned for the police. Constable Poulter had asked Dingwall for an explanation, but Dingwall had declined to give any.

Dingwall, on oath, said: —I went out with the intention of shooting a rabbit. I crossed my mother's paddock and entered Hustler's property; I told Mrs. Hustler that I desired to make a complaint to her husband. When I saw Hustler I said, "I want you to stop Mrs. Hustler from "slinging off" at my child." Hustler then grabbed me by the throat and a struggle followed. The gun did not go off while it was in my possession. Either through being hit on the head by the weapon, or through being held by the throat. I collapsed.

The jury returned a verdict of not guilty, and Dingwall was discharged.

"Our battalion was called into the line hurriedly from 8 miles to the rear, to replace another unit which had been badly cut up. Our objective was a ridge 600 yards in front of our trenches. We did not reach it. We were held up in front of a pill box. The Germans surrounded us with machine guns and bombs. All but four of our party were casualties. The following were captured with me:-

I saw 20 altogether, 16 of whom were wounded. I do not know the names of the others.

Lieut Brodie: 31st Bn, was my Platoon Commander. I went over with him. We were hung up in front of a pill box. He rose and waved his stick for reinforcements and said "We must charge it" At that moment he was shot through the head and killed instantly.

Lieut Castles: (29th Bn, attached 31st Bn) I saw him first at the dressing station after we were captured. He was not wounded.

"I was captured on 26th Sep 1917 on the Ypres front with 19 of my own mates out of the same Batt. About 16 of them were badly wounded. Some of them were bandaged up near the line at a dressing station and we were then taken to Courtrai. We arrived there at midnight and we were all very hungry. The next morning, they gave us some coffee in a basin with a lump of black bread. We could not eat the bread although we were all very tired and hungry. I will explain later on what the coffee and their food is made out of. We could not have a decent wash as there was no soap and we were simply black and for the want of a shave after three days. During our stay in Courtrai, we had met some officers (English) and they got up some card playing and gave us prizes in money. This enabled us to buy some fruit.

After a few days there we were sent to Dendermonde and were put in a big brick barracks. It was like being in a tunnel and it was very dark. We had to sleep on the straw. They had given us no blankets and it was simply freezing. We had one hour's walk around the square a day. There were over 1,000 Russians in the same barracks, and the rooms were simply rotten with the smell of these Russians. We had a trip to Ghent and they told us we were going to Germany, but when we arrived at Ghent we were marched to some big baths. We were here all day getting bathed and fumigated. The civilians were bringing us apples until the Germans chased them with their rifles.

When we arrived back at Dendermonde we were sent to a big room which was once a cotton factory. Here there were 600 of us in one room, everybody was starving. I have never met a lot of fellows in such a state before. They all had big beards on and were grumbling. We had to sleep on wet straw and the fellows of the night would light the straw to keep themselves warm and the smoke was simply cruel. The German soldiers would come in with bread and buy our boots. Of course, the fellows had to do it or die from starvation. A German demanded my boots from me behind the firing line so I had to give them to him and received an old pair in exchange. A batch of 250 were sent to Germany. After a while we were sent to another factory. This new place was the same as the other, concrete floors and a straw bed. There were a few Australians. It was not long before some of these Australians made up their minds to escape. Three of them got through the windows and went, the next night three more escaped. The third night three more went; and on the fourth night two more and myself got away. On the sixth night we were missed from the prison. I believe there was an uproar. The German officer in command stripped the Corporal of the guard and stopped the soup of the

other poor fellows because they would not tell him where we escaped from. We three were 10 days on the track living with Belgians most of the time; they were good to us. Some of the women cried when they saw us. They said they could not be good enough for what the English had done in 1914. The Belgians gave us bread, bacon, underclothing and money, and if we wanted anything they said to ask for it. We were assisted along by a Belgian and an American. They could speak English splendidly. We also had a German deserter. He said the reason he deserted was that we were too hot for him. But I think he was one of our spies.

It was a misty night and we came to a house and all of a sudden, a dog barked furiously. We laid down in the open behind a hay stack but the dog would not stop and we had three men on top of us in no time. Two were Belgians and the other was a German soldier. They had a pitch fork each and we had to surrender. Later on, an armed guard came up and it was a case then. The German Corporal was going to shoot one of my mates for not holding his hands high enough. They took us into the hotel where they were staying and the Belgians gave us bread and beet. So we had a German guarding us again. Next morning the Belgians brought us milk and fried potatoes and bags of bread. At this place the Germans had a lot of Belgians working for them in a big pit (slave driving). The Germans had big sticks and you could hear nothing else but yells all the time from Germans and Belgians. We were taken to some big town where they locked us in a cell near a lot of Belgians who had refused to work and the Germans were giving them a rough time.

Later in the evening we were taken to Ghent by rail. We were put with a lot of German soldiers and they gave us bread and their sausage. They also gave us praise for escaping and said they were fed up with the war. We stopped at Ghent in a dungeon for the night and the next morning, about 5am. we were on the station there and we saw our aeroplanes over. Everything was quiet; they did some good work that night. We were taken back to Dendermonde and were put into cold concrete cells here. We had nothing to eat. Next day they gave us one third of a loaf of bread and a bucket of water. Here there were a lot of Belgians, women, children and men. It was cruel to see them. The Germans would not let anyone go near them. I saw a nun come in and she was booted outside. She came back and the German sentry drew his bayonet and shoved her out.

The third day we were sent to Germany. I was surprised to see six more of my mates captured. They were caught seven days before me. They were caught of the Holland border and they were like ghosts with rough beards. They threatened to shoot us all if we dared to escape again. We arrived at Dulmen in Westphalia after a most miserable train ride. It took us three days and they gave us only one meal and it was warm water which they called soup. When we arrived at Dulmen they put us in a big barrack. The floor was all broken, big long nails sticking out of the boards and it was raining and cold. We were all dying of hunger and they gave us soup. It was just like mud, potato meal, they called it. Next day we were bathed and fumigated and they put us into an isolation block. It was all walled in.

We received a packet from the British Help Committee and we thought that was the happiest day of our lives. Some ate their whole packet in a few hours and then they would smoke the tea in their pipes. The days seemed long and we were continually falling into trouble. We had a very savage old German in charge of us. I think he must have been over fifty years of age and he was continually pulling out his bayonet. It was about a yard long. We were taken again shortly afterwards to another group amongst some old prisoners who gave us a few tips. In this block we could see the Germans belting chaps with their rifle butts. They would stop us from having any sport in these groups.

After our isolation was finished and we had been vaccinated and inoculated six times we (the nine men who escaped including myself) were sent to a prison in another group. We were put into cells. I had to do seven days. It was better there than in the group as the coup was a bit better and there was no one to trouble us. After we came out I was sent to a working 'commando' attached to Minden. The work was making drains alongside a road. This was in December and it was snowing nearly the whole time and we could not do much work.

We had Xmas at this 'commando' and it was boiled potatoes and turnips. It was a very miserable day for all of us. I received my first lot of packets in Feb 1918 and I received 13 packets in one mail. We all received a big issue so we had some great meals for a few days. We were sent back from this work as being no good as regards work. I stayed in this camp for five months and they sent me on a farm but I was useless to them. I went sick and they sent me to the hospital and from there to Switzerland.

The food I received from the Germans all the time was not fit for a pig to eat. Soup was made out of cabbage leaves; you drank the water and all. They did not issue a spoon when issuing a basin and two old blankets that is what they gave us, no towel or nothing. I have seen 23 Russians go to the Cemetery in three days from starvation. It was a common occurrence to see a long line of coffins going off to the Cemetery. The graves are well looked after by our fellows."

"At about 6am on 26th Sep 1917 the 31st and 59th Battalions, attacked the enemy positions on Zonnebeke Ridge, near Passchendaele. The Menin Road was our right flank. To reach our objective we had to advance about 500 yards. Our losses in the advance were not great. We reached our sector of the ridge and found that we had no support on either right or left. There would be about 50 of us all told, but the majority of these were shot down by enemy snipers and machine guns, shortly after reaching the summit of the ridge. The Trench Mortar men had one gun, but no live shells beyond smoke shells. We had been instructed to pick up live ammunition in the front line, but we found none there. We advanced about 50 yards over the ridge – what was left of us, about 23 – until the enemy machine guns properly held us up. We took cover in shell-holes and sustained rifle fire as long as we could. The enemy machine guns kept us down under cover. The enemy fire came from both flanks and from the rear. Eventually a party of enemy infantry, under cover of their machine gun barrage, advanced on our left. We were a divided party in separate shell-holes. The enemy called on us to surrender and we did so. We had no alternative. In another shell-hole on our left was Lieut Castles of the 29th Battalion.

We saw him surrender before we were called upon to surrender. Lieut Hill of the LTMB, badly wounded – one eye having been knocked out – was in a hole nearby. A party of 18 of us were marched to Courtrai via Roulers, being searched at the latter place. We got to Dulmen on 11th Nov 1917, having up till then being locked up in a disused factory at Dendermonde. After a month at Dulmen, we were sent to Dyrotz, some 30 kilometers from Berlin.

Some of us were sent out 'on commando', others were put to building an aerodrome at Dyrotz. On the signing of the Armistice, all commandos were call in to Dyrotz. Thence we were sent to Stettin via Altdamm. We left Stettin for Copenhagen by the SS 'Queen Maude' on 3rd Dec 1918. After eight days in camp at Lillereg near Copenhagen, we crossed to Leith in the SS 'Ajex'. We arrived at Leith on 16th Dec 1918. It was not until the end of February 1918 – five months after our capture, that we received out Red Cross parcels. Pte E Fisher when captured, had a bullet wound in the left leg." 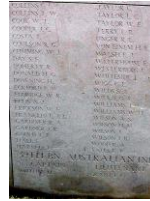

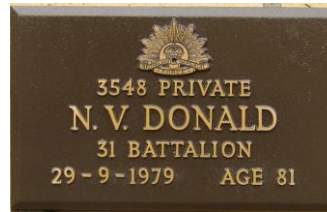

"Ernie" Dover Dead

Pioneer of Morobe Goldfields

From Our Own Correspondent

WAU, Feb. 1. 1940

Ernest Dover, a very well-known identity of the goldfields, died from Japanese River fever on Sunday, 28th January, at the Wau Hospital.

"Ernie", born in London, was among the very first pioneers of the Morobe Goldfields, being associated with "Shark- Eye" Park. Nettleton and others, in 1924.

When the rush from the Kulolo to Kaindi occurred in 1926, Ernest Dover was among the first to reach the new Eldorado, with Bill Royal. Knowing Dover's slight physique, one wonders at his hardihood in those wildays.

For a long time, he travelled the formidable road, from the coast to Kulolo, with supplies.

Ernest Dover served during the last war, but one seldom, if ever, heard him speak of his warservices. He had not an enemy in the world, was always charitable and courteous, and he is missed by the many who had known him for long years on the Goldfields. Mr. Dover originally came to New Guinea with the A.N. & M.E.F. and transferred to the Department of Agriculture. He saw service with this department in the Kokopo and Kavieng districts, ultimately resigning and joining up with the Expropriation Board.

Finally, about 1924, he went prospecting for gold. He always missed fortune "by a whisker", as he said himself. At one time he owned the rich Koranga claim, which he sold to Messrs. Pryke and Joubert.

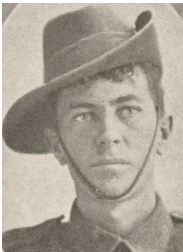

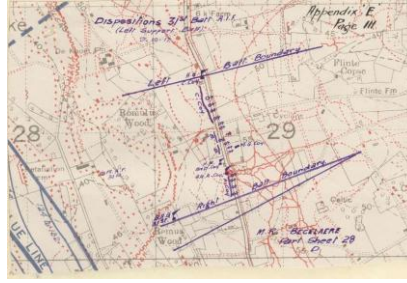

After we fixed him up we were sitting in the same place among the debris when another shell lobbed in the exact spot lately occupied by my Sergeant. Yours truly was chucked many yards, and except for being a bit dazed was O.K. One man about ten yards away was badly wounded. If that's not luck I don't know what is. Love to father and good luck for the New Year."*

This suggests that Frank Smith returned to his old III Platoon 'A' Coy, as the platoon sergeant mentioned was Sgt James Francis Downing, #191, 'A' Coy, III Platoon, age 31. At La Transloy, in Spring Trench, at 7.30 am, on 19th Jan 1917, he was killed by a piece of shell to the head, died on way to Dressing Station.

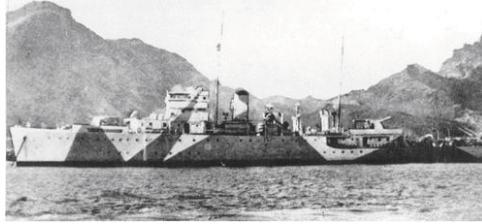

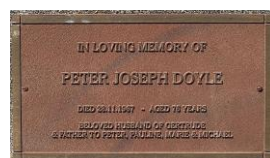

He then cut a shoulder strap off the tunic which he handed to the Brigade Major the following morning. Captain (then Lieutenant) Drayton afterwards advanced the remnants of his Company to our most forward position in the German lines, and held on all night under a terrific fire. His Company Commander and 2nd in Command were wounded early in the engagement. Since the arrival of his unit on the Somme front, this Officer has shown consistent courage and devotion to duty, and a fine example to the Officers and men of his Company."*
